

Want to buy a plant and have a master gardener tell you how to grow it? Mark your calendar for Cobb Landmarks and Historical Society's annual Spring Plant Sale, truly a Marietta spring tradition. Aided by the good advice of master gardeners, you can learn how to design attractive flower pots for patios and decks. As an extra bonus, plants suitable for containers will be available for purchase. Scheduled

for Friday and Saturday, May 3 and 4, the sale will be held at the Root House Museum and Garden at the corner of Polk Street and North Marietta Parkway, just off the Marietta Square. On hand will be Cobb County Master Gardeners, offering for sale a wide variety of shrubs, Perennials, and heirloom tomato plants. Hours for the event are 10 to 5. Since these plants come from the best perennial nursery in Georgia, come early, as the best plants go fast. The wide variety of plants for sale will range from those favored by the Victorians, to new and unusual varieties, to "Pass Along" plants from the finest gardens in town. 





CHAIRMAN'S CORNER BY CHAIRMAN TIM LEE, COBB COUNTY

Cobb County prides itself on being fiscally conservative and judiciously utilizing tax dollars. We are seeing many positive economic indicators for our recovery, benefitting from a comeback based on proactive financial decisions made years ago, consistent budget cutback, and, an increase in revenue.

Cobb County Government finished 2012 in excellent shape. A small budget surplus is being used to fill public safety positions, upgrade county court computer systems and pay off debt. At the six-month mark in the budget year expenses and revenues are right on target.

In December, always mindful of keeping taxes as low as possible, the Board of Commissioners unanimously voted for a 5-year plan to reduce property taxes to pre-recession levels. This year, the millage rate is projected to be lowered .2 mills from 7.72 to 7.52. Further, a .20 decrease each year is planned for the next for years, with a .10 decrease in the fifth

With very conservative budgeting, we have been able to set aside a 12% reserve (about \$38 million) for unforeseen expenses or revenue shortfalls versus our policy of 9%, better preparing ourselves for such contingencies.

The nation's top three bond rating agencies, Fitch Ratings, Moody's, and Standard and Poor's, recently confirmed the county's strong financial standing. Fitch assigned its highest rating for tax anticipation notes issued to Cobb and affirmed our "AAA" rating on bonds issued by Cobb Solid Waste Management Authority. Moody's assigned Cobb's TAN offering at the highest rating possible and re-affirmed our "AAA" rating on general obligation debt. We also earned the highest score for short term rating from Standard and

The job market continues to grow in Cobb. In 2012 15 major business announcements were made with more than 1,600 new jobs unveiled. We expect greater growth in 2013. Economic development experts are reporting a significant uptick in companies seeking information about doing business in

Cobb.

Real estate activity is an excellent indicator of growth and we are on the comeback. New home and resale inventory supplies are declining, resulting in increasing building permits. Residential and commercial permits issued have increased and revenues associated with new home construction and sales continue to rise

We are excited about positive signs of Cobb County growing. Some growth is due to the actions we have taken to reduce spending while still offering exceptional services. As we continue to work together as a community, we will continue to make Cobb County one of the premier places to live, work and play







that bad. There are others whose sins are way worse than ours. Even when we acknowledge that sin is sin, and acknowledge that our sin is probably just as bad as others' sin, we still typically want mercy for ourselves and justice for others.

In our day, we still have some of the same attitudes about who the wrong people are to associate with, and Jesus still confronts this kind of attitude. Barbara Brown Taylor imagines a contemporary version of the scene in Luke 15:1-10: "So if I were putting together a sinners table...it might include an abortion doctor, a child molester, an arms dealer, a garbage collector who smells like spoiled meat. a young man with AIDS, a Laotian chicken plucker with a white hair net, a teenage crack addict who cannot seem to find his mouth with his spoon, and an unmarried woman on welfare with five children by three different fathers. Did I miss anyone? Don't forget to put Jesus at the head of the table, asking the young man to hand him a roll, please, and offering the doctor a second cup of coffee before she goes back to work.

If that [scene] offends you even a little, then you are almost ready for what happens next. Because what happens next is that the local ministerial association comes into the restaurant and sits down at a large table across from the sinners. The religious authorities all have good teeth and no dirt under their fingernails. When their food comes, they hold hands to pray. They are all perfectly nice people, but they can hardly eat their hamburger steaks for staring at the strange crowd in the far booth. But none of those is the heartbreaker [to them]. The heartbreaker is Jesus, sitting there as if everything were just fine. Doesn't he know what kind of message he is sending? Who is going to believe he speaks for God if he does not keep better company than that?"

Jesus finishes The Parables of the Lost Sheep and Coin by saying, There's more joy in heaven over one sinner's rescued life than over ninety-nine good people in no need of rescue. Those celebrations?
