Georgia.

Danny Gokey-After being a third-place finalist on season eight of American Idol, Danny Gokey signed with RCA Nashville and began a career in country music and released his debut album, "My Best Days." After leaving RCA Nashville, he moved his musical direction towards Contemporary Christian and released his first Christian album, "Hope in Front of Me."

The title single spent three weeks on top of the Christian Charts in 2014. His second single "More

than You Think I am," is currently in the Top 20 on the Christian Charts.

Mark Wills—One of Georgia's favorite sons, Mark Wills is a multiplatinum-selling country music star with eight top-10 hits to his name including "19 Something," "Wish You Were Here," and "Don't Laugh at Me," all of which (more) received nominations for Single, Song and Video of the Year by the Country Music Association. Wills won the Academy of Country Music award for Top New Male Vocalist in 1998. In 2002, his single "19 Something," spent six consecutive weeks at No. 1 and was the most-played song of the year.

Montgomery Gentry- Is an American Country duo who has charted more than 20 Chart singles including five No. 1 Hits to date. The duo was inducted into the Grand Ole Opry in 2009 and hasn't slowed down! They just released their newest album, "Folks Like Us," in June of 2015.

Dustin Lynch- Broken Bow Records artist, Dustin Lynch, occupies a unique place in today's Country Music. Thanks to his classic sensibilities, he's been heralded as the heir to George Strait's throne. Yet with one listen to, "Where it's At," it is obvious the young Tennessee native knows how to combine his traditional influences with an

As his debut album lead single "Friday Night," reached the top of the charts and his follow ups "Song About a Girl," and "She Don't Love You," have both charted the Country Charts.

### MARIETTA/COBB DRIVER'S EDUCATION PROGRAM AWARDED \$364,190 GRANT TO FUND THE PURCHASE OF 20 VEHICLES FOR DRIVING INSTRUCTION

Marietta/Cobb Driver's Education (MCDE), a joint program of Cobb County Schools and Marietta City Schools, received a \$364,190 grant award from the Georgia Driver Education Commission (GDEC). Grant funds are for the purchase of 20 vehicles for driving instruction, textbooks for additional classes, and safety equipment. MCDE serves high school students in Marietta City, Cobb County, Bartow County, Fulton County and surrounding areas.

The GDEC awards funds to programs that promote, aid and encourage the successful completion of a Georgia Department of Driver Services (DDS) approved driver training course for students who desire to qualify for a Georgia Class D driver's license as required by O.C.G.A § 40-5-22, also known as Joshua's Law. An approved program includes 30 hours of classroom instruction and six hours of behind the wheel driver training instruction.

"Marietta/Cobb Driver's Education Program continues to set the standard for driver's education both statewide and nationally," said MCS Superintendent Dr. Emily Lembeck. MCDE has grown into the largest teen program in the state, serving students in counties beyond Cobb/Marietta and offers a first rate course for minimal charge thus allowing a large population of students to complete driving instruction." "This is great news for the Cobb County School District and will save usapproximately \$125,000" said Chris Ragsdale, Cobb County School District Superintendent. "It is also an excellent example of how we work as partners with the Marietta City School District to benefit all of our stakeholders within Cobb County.'

MCDE is under the umbrella of Marietta Community School, a division of Marietta City Schools. The program owns 49 cars and has 54 licensed instructors, most of whom are also certified school teachers. It is the first public school program licensed by the Georgia Department of Motor Vehicle Safety and celebrates 30 years of operation since its opening

### MARIETTA'S PASTOR'S POLICE ACADEMY RECEIVES STATEWIDE RECOGNITION

The Marietta Police Department Pastor's Police Academy Program has received statewide recognition by having been selected by the Georgia Association of Chiefs of Police and by Motorola, Inc. as one of three finalists for the prestigious Dr. Curtis McClung Award of Excellence. The Motorola/ Dr. Curtis McClung Award of Excellence is awarded in recognition of an inaugural and innovative program that fulfills a department's goal or vision for their community. Final selection of the award winner will occur at the G.A.C.P. Conference in Savannah, July 27, 2015.

The Pastor's Police Academy was conceptualized to reach out to faith-based leaders of all races and cultures in order to increase mutual understanding and resolve any community concerns. There are 54 churches in the city limits of Marietta and all pastors and youth pastors are invited and encouraged to attend the Pastor's Police Academy which meets for two hours, once a week for four weeks. Throughout these four weeks pastors study the law, judgmental use of force, cybercrime, and other related current topics. Pastors are welcome to ask questions, contribute new ideas, voice concerns or discuss contemporary policecommunity related issues while attending these sessions.

The first Pastor's Police Academy was so successful not only in creating lasting friendships between the group of Pastors and officers, but also prompted the creation of a permanent group which meets once a quarter called "The Faith-Based Forum". This forum, which is designed for graduates of the Pastor's Police Academy, will enable them to continue to meet and exchange ideas. The Marietta Police Department is currently accepting applications for the next Pastor's Police Academy which begins in early September. 

FRANKLIN ROAD DRUG FREE ZONE
As of July 1st, 2015, the areas near Franklin Rd and Delk Rd will be designated as a new Drug
Free Commercial Zone. A Drug Free Commercial Zone is a specific geographical area in the City of Marietta as being a place where drug trafficking problems exist. Citizens living in the area of Franklin Rd and Delk Rd are concerned with the circumstances that currently surround their area and are

asking for police assistance in reducing the occurrences of illegal drug violations.

The Drug Free Commercial Zone will be implemented to reduce all drug related crimes and events. Offenders that are located inside of the Drug Free Zone parameters are subject to increased fines, extended imprisonment, and will not be permitted back into the Drug Free Zone for no more than 24 months.

Signs for the Drug Free Commercial Zone will be placed around the zone boundaries to show all incoming persons that the area has been designated as drug free. The Marietta Police Department will be saturating the zoned area to locate all offenders with hopes to create a reduction in drug related

The Drug Free Zone law is based on O.C.G.A. 16-13-32.6 and should some desire to make a complaint regarding illegal activities please contact the Anonymous Tip Line at 770-794-6990.


#### **GOD WILL MEET US THERE!**

And they are scared at this. Literally the gospel says that they were sitting in a locked room because they were afraid. I think that is just shorthand for they were afraid of everything. They were afraid for their life. What if those who came after Jesus came after them. They were afraid that everything had been for naught. They had invested their time and energy in this traveling prophet and look what happened. He was gone. And now they would have to go back home to the families and communities and vocations they had left behind and apologize for being so impulsive. They were afraid that they had wasted their time.

These fears and so many others. And they had locked themselves in a room together. It is important that the gospel points out that the room was locked from the inside. Fear does that to us. It locks us into inactivity and traps us in rooms of limited choices. And the

lock is of our own doing.

Jesus pierces that fearfulness and enters the locked room and speaks one single word, "Peace." Amid our doubts and fears and anxieties and concerns, Jesus offers us the key that will set us free from all that holds us back. He gave a word of peace to his friends in that locked room and he offers that same peace to each and every one of us. It is the key that unlocks any door that would trap us from the goodness that God has in store for our lives.

There is a quote attributed to Heather Murray Elkins that says, When you reach the

edge of the light you have been given and are called one step beyond into the darkness which may hold a chasm, believe that one of two things will happen. Either you will find

firm ground or you will be taught to fly.

Wherever that fear may reside in your life. Wherever you face uncertainty. Wherever we face uncertainties. There is a friend waiting there to offer a word of encouragement and support who will walk with you. There is the risen Christ speaking a word of peace to our troubled lives. Take that hand, receive that hope and let us walk together into the uncertainty. God will meet us there.
