COBB CHAMBER HONORS RETIRING U.S SENATOR **JOHNNY ISAKSON**

The Cobb Chamber of Commerce celebrated its many accomplishments of 2019 at the 78th Annual Dinner celebration, presented by Wellstar, on Jan. 25 at the Cobb Galleria Centre. Over 1,000 business and community leaders attended the black-tie optional dinner affair, including military leaders, economic development partners and elected officials. Monica Kaufman Pearson of Cox Media Group served as the event's master of ceremonies.

The evening was a robust program, including a touching tribute to U.S. Senator Johnny Isakson. Senator Isakson was presented with the Chamber's Senator Johnny H. Isakson Leadership Award, named in his ĥonor. The 2020 award was formerly known as the Leadership Award. Previously presented to a select group of individuals, including Kessel Stelling of Synovus Bank in 1988 and Marietta Mayor Steve "Thunder" Tumlin in 2014, the Senator Johnny H. Isakson Leadership Award is one of the ways the Cobb Chamber is honoring the legacy Sen. Isakson continues to bestow upon the county. The Chamber has also dedicated its 10th floor at 1100 Circle 75 Parkway, to the East Cobb-based senator.

U.S. Sen. Johnny Isakson has given two decades of dedicated service to our state and country as our United States Senator. Isakson served as a U.S. senator from 2005 to 2019 and as a U.S. representative from Georgia's 6th Congressional District from 1999 to 2005.

GEORGIA HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

Isakson first ran in 1974for the Georgia House of Representatives in an eastern Cobb County district and lost. He ran again in 1976 and won. He served seven terms in the House. He won re-election unopposed in 1984[15] and 1988.[16] In the last four terms (1983–1990) he was the Republican Minority leader. In 1988, he was Co-Chair for U.S. Senator Bob Dole's presidential primary campaign.

GEORGIA SENATE

In 1992, he was elected to the Georgia Senate. In 1996, he decided not to run for re-

GRAND OPENING FOR THE INCLUSIVE PLAYGROUND AT SWIFT-CANTRELL PARK

The City of Kennesaw and Kennesaw Parks & Recreation celebrated the Grand Opening for the Inclusive Playground at Swift-Cantrell Park this afternoon Tuesday, January 9. The Inclusive Playground is located at Swift-Cantrell Park, 3140 Old 41 Hwy NW.

The formerly existing playground featured nine (9) slides, 11 swings and a main play structure with 100 feet of ADA ramps and sensory boards. The additions include four (4) play structures over approximately 5,000 square feet that was previously unused. This area includes a main play structure with wheelchair accessible ramps that lead to a ropes tower sensory. a main play structure with wheelchair accessible ramps that lead to a ropes tower, sensory stations, an eight (8) person wheelchair sway fun and a slide. The ramp system also leads to pod climbers, a tunnel system and climbing apparatuses. The main play structure has 40 feet of shade. The entire 18,500 square foot space has been made accessible to everyone by removing the wood chips and installing turf. Every child will be able to maneuver the entire space.

When speaking about the Inclusive Playground and its impact on the City, Kennesaw Mayor Derek Easterling stated, "This playground will serve not only the emotional and mental well-being of children with disabilities, it will serve our community in developing social

well-being of children with disabilities, it will serve our community in developing social equality and positive relationships in the area."

Following the presentation, all were invited for a tour to learn more about the playground, and light refreshments were provided by Nothing Bundt Cakes Kennesaw and Kennesaw Coffee Company.

WHY WE SAY WHAT WE SAY..

This month we will be talking about the origins of some Cobb County place names. COBB COUNTY is named for Thomas W. Cobb (1784 -1830), a Georgia Superior Court judge. MARIETTA



is believed to have been named for his wife,

ACWORTH was named in 1843 by railroad engineer Joseph L. Gregg. Gregg named it after his hometown of Acworth, New Hampshire. The New Hampshire town is named for Sir Jacob Acworth, a surveyor in Great Britain's Royal Navy.

KENNESAW's story is much more complicated. The City of Kennesaw is named after the famous KENNESAW MOUNTAIN nearby. The National Park Service at one time claimed that the mountain's name is an adaptation of the Cherokee word Gah-neesah, meaning cemetery or burial ground. The book "Ancient Roots", by Richard Thornton says Kennesaw comes from a Muskogee word meaning "Racoon People". Finally, one of the signers of the Treaty of Holston in 1791 was named Kennesaw. The treaty, between the Cherokee and the US Government, does not specify where Kennesaw lived, so he may or may not be the namesake of our mountain.

An article in the September 26th, 1849 Charleston Courier tells the tale of a Chief Kennesaw. According to the story, Chief Kennesaw was hunting on what we now call Kennesaw Mountain with some people from his village. He went ahead of his party and found a prized deer. After shooting it with his arrow, he took the antlers, put them on his head, and did what is best described as a victory dance. The other people in his party saw these antlers moving, thought he was a deer, and shot and killed him. After the sad death of Chief Kennesaw, the article says that KENNESAW MOUNTAIN was named in his honor.

Many people have a chronic feeling that they have something in their eye and some even experience blurred vision. These symptoms can be debilitating!

Here some tips on how to relieve dry eye discomfort, and how to know when your condition is serious enough to come in for an evaluation.

•Keep eyes moist using artificial tears. If over-the-counter drops don't help or if you have chronic dry eyes, speak to your optometrist.

- •Use a humidifier to counteract the drying effects of indoor heaters or generally dry air.
- •Point car vents or indoor heaters away from your face when the heat is on.
 •Drink a lot! Hydrating your body will also hydrate your eyes.
- •Protect your eyes outdoors with sunglasses or goggles the bigger the better!
- •Soothe dry eyes using a warm compress and never rub them!
- •Give your eyes a digital break. People blink less during screen time which is why extensive computer use can lead to dry eyes. Follow the 20/20/20 rule by taking a break every 20 minutes to look 20 feet away for 20 seconds and make sure you blink!
- For contact lens wearers: If you wear contact lenses, dry eyes can be particularly debilitating. Not all eyedrops are appropriate for use with contact lenses, so ask your optometrist which is compatible with your contacts and solution, and which brand of contacts are better for dry eyes, preferably daily disposable lenses.

 CHRONIC DRY EYES OR DRY EYE SYNDROME

Dry eye syndrome is a chronic condition in which the eyes do not produce enough tear film, or do not produce the quality of tear film needed to properly keep the eyes moist. 



When the duck hunting season ends, there is a feeling of sadness like saying goodbye to a friend.

When the season ended recently, where I hunt in Missouri, I noticed that the older I get, the more the seasons seem to streak by, leaving only a blur of fond memories. Most duck hunters know it is the act of shooting wild ducks or the number bagged that landmarks a season. It is the hunting partners, special places and tradition of the sport that cast special feelings. By its very nature, waterfowling places the participants in uniquely wild and beautiful settings

high. In my many years of duck hunting I can recall other good seasons that might have presented more challenges and adjustments than this one.

Several years ago, when the season first opened, it was hard to get too excited about hunting ducks with temperatures in the 60's and 70's. Most of the ducks stayed north for the opener. However, the warm weather presented another opportunity. Paul Hoffman and I camped and hunted at a favorite lake and managed to take several mallards opening morning, but what I remember most was our Saturday night campfire: grilling steaks over glowing coals. Normal duck hunting weather probably would have precluded tenting and feasting under the stars. The rest of the north zone was good, yet nothing could take away the magnificent sunrises and the wild stillness of the lake. Ironically, the last day of the north zone season, the lake froze so we had to break ice to set the decoys. A lot of ducks flew overhead, but the motionless decoys and broken ice spooked the mallards showing our setup as thoroughly fake.

Ever since I was a teenager, I don't remember missing a duck season opener at a favorite spot, although one season I hunted a different lake for the first time and enjoyed surprising success during the weekend there. I shared a blind with John Benjamin and Glen Atkinson. We had an excellent hunt and one thing stood out. There were two mallards heading for our decoys, but Glen didn't see one of them and when I shot, the bird fell into the blind knocking Glen to the floor. He said, "I thought the sky was falling."

There is no finer adventure outdoors than sharing duck hunting days with your sons, daughters, wives, friends and Labrador retrievers. It makes you realize that memories were being made. The season ended all too fast.
