ZAGSTER BIKE SHARE CLOSURES IN TOWN CENTER AND CUMBERLAND

The Cumberland Community Improvement District (CID) and the Town Center CID have received notice that Zagster will no longer be providing services to their markets. Based in Boston, Zagster managed and operated both of the CIDs' bike-share programs.

According to an email from Zagster, the closure is due to the COVID-19 pandemic's

impact on business. Zagster will remove all bikes and stations from both areas between May 28 and June 12. Zagster stated they plan to communicate more information to members via their app and social media platforms this week. There are currently six stations in Cumberland and six stations in Town Center.

While Zagster's decision is beyond the control of the CIDs, both organizations are committed to providing valuable mobility options for their communities. Thousands of members have

recorded hundreds of rides every week in each CID bike-share program.

"Bike-share programs have been extremely successful in the Cumberland and Town Center communities," said Kim Menefee, Executive Director of the Cumberland CID. "Our shared goal will always be to improve our communities as we continue to strengthen our partnerships and regional connectivity.



WHY WE SAY WHAT WE SAY..

Intoday's article, I will be sharing the stories of two common words that come from people's names. The first is BOYCOTT. During the early 1880's, political tensions were high among the tenant farmers of



Ireland in what was known as the Irish Land War. Tenant farmers would get land from a landlord in exchange for a percentage of the harvest. At this time, the tenant farmers felt their rent was too high and unfair.

The harvest of 1880 was particularly low. Because of this, one of the landlords, Lord Erne, decided to lower the rent by 10% for the tenant farmers on his land. The farmers did not think that was enough. They decided to ostracize the man who managed the lord's land, Charles Boycott. News of the farmers act became well known, and BOYCOTT came to mean to protest someone or their business by ostracizing them.

Samuel Maverick was born July 23, 1803 in South Carolina. After moving to Texas in 1835, he became a prominent politician and cattle rancher. Cattle ranchers usually would brand or mark their cows with a logo using scorching hot metal. Maverick didn't do this, and he claimed it was because he didn't want to hurt the cows. Some said he did it so he could claim any unmarked cows as his own. Soon, a MAVERICK came to mean someone who is independent who does things their own way, like Samuel and his cattle.

After a while, maverick fell out of use. It did see a resurgence after Samuel's grandson, Maury Maverick, was elected to the US House of Representatives. On a side note, Maury coined the term GOBBLEDYGOOK. He claimed he got the word from the sound a turkey makes.

LATEST ACWORTH OPENINGS BEACHES AND BOAT RAMPS

Cauble Park, Dallas Landing Park, Proctor Landing Park, and South Shore Park will open on Monday, June 1 with limited parking. There will be a non-resident parking fee of \$10 at each location, seven days a week. The city will only be accepting credit/debit card payments, no cash. All major credit/debit cards will be accepted. City of Acworth residents will not be charged a parking fee with the appropriate resident pass.

All visitors shall comply with social distancing restrictions in accordance with Governor Kemp's most recent executive order. Groups shall be less than 25 and shall be in an area no closer than 6 feet from others in accordance with his order. Crowd size in the parks will be monitored and the parks/beaches may be temporarily closed if social distancing becomes difficult or is grossly ignored. Pavilions and playgrounds at these facilities will remain closed. Please remember outside personal grills are not allowed in our parks.

Acworth Beach at Cauble Park - Park: 6:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m./ Beach: Sun Up to Sun







WHAT GREAT GIG DANCE CO. LEARNED ABOUT VIRTUAL DANCE INSTRUCTIONS

For 20 years, Great Gig Dance Co. has been providing dance instruction for children



and adults – IN PERSON!
Looking at the prospect of
continuing on when students
likely would not want to
venture out to the studio was
daunting and frightening

If you're a dance teacher and you're teaching via live-stream, you're going to work twice as hard as you normally do. We plan our classes with enough material to fill our 45-minute or 1-hour time slots, but when your whole class is staring at you from a screen full of "Brady Bunch" squares and you've had to mute them all so that everyone can hear

YOUR voice and YOUR Tap shoes, the whole game changes. Those young dancers who normally ask questions and even tell stories about everything from their brother's birthday party to what they are for breakfast are not talking. And it's only your voice that is filling the void.

You have to keep your energy level on EXTREME to keep dancers engaged online. You smile until it hurts and use every expressive face and every ounce of energy you can summon. If you're doing it right, within the first 2 minutes of class your Apple Watch will ask you if you're doing a workout.

When teaching dance online there is a slight time delay. Watching your students execute the choreography can be maddening if you're trying to listen to the music and match their movements. You have to implement a new understanding of timing and ignore the rhythm of the music completely.

You have to keep your movements rather small to make sure your body stays within camera's range so that everyone can see what you're demonstrating. While teaching a Tap class I had one young girl tell me that my feet get blurry every time I move them too quickly (ah, now that's the magic of Tap dancing).

You have to repeatedly tell young dancers to stop sitting down on their sofa during class; to stop petting the family dog during the warm-up; that it's not ok to run outside to tell your dad something during Ballet class; that their baby sister is very cute but needs to get her face away from the camera because she's obstructing your view. I've had children "raise their hand" during dance class to ask if they can go to the bathroom (in their own home). I've really enjoyed seeing some of the parents get involved and learn the routines with their children, and I've even had a father who stepped in front of his teenage daughter's laptop to show me his version of her Tap dance. I've seen dancers taking class in their living room, bedroom, garage and even one Tap dancer who was only allowed to wear her Tap shoes in her bathroom so I had a great view of the toilet (she could have at least put the lid down).

WHY BEING HALF CUBAN MAKES ME AN AMERICAN PATRIOT BY: PENELOPE ROSELL


Patriotism is a love for one's country. It's easy to take for granted the freedoms we enjoy as Americans. Like many people, I often take our freedom for granted. My dad who was born in a communist country reminds me how lucky we are to be American. In this essay, I will tell you about patriotism and what it means to me.

Cuba is a communist country, which means they control everything. When my dad lived in Cuba, the government controlled how much food people got. Some days he would get 2 to 3 eggs, sometimes a little rice, rarely meat, and sometimes nothing. My dad and his family had a very hard time getting food.

Another thing the government controlled was where people could go. In Cuba, most people could not leave. Even if you wanted to go on a vacation, you could not leave. My Abuelo (grandfather) escaped and came back on a boat to pick up his family. The country put his family into a concentration camp for months until they let them go. I am very lucky to live in America where I am not scared.

Earlier, I said it's easy to take our freedom for granted. My dad reminds me how lucky we are to be American. I am so thankful to live in a place where I am not controlled and am free. I am half Cuban, but I am 100% American and I love my country. That's patriotism.
