KENNESAW'S GROUNDBREAKING CEREMONY FOR RECREATION CENTER


The City of Kennesaw and Kennesaw Parks & Recreation hosted a groundbreaking ceremony on Wednesday, July 29, 2020 at 3:00 p.m. for the new Recreation Center at Adams

Park.
"With greater opportunities for physical activities including dance, gymnastics, basketball, volleyball, yoga, an indoor track and much more, the positive impact of this new recreation center will have on our community is immeasurable!," states Kennesaw Mayor, Derek Easterling. "I am delighted the City of Kennesaw, in collaboration with Cobb County, is able to break ground on this significant project for the citizens of our great community.

s"Adding the Recreation Center to the city's amenities will be such a blessing to the community," adds Parks & Recreation Director, Steve Roberts. "The Recreation Center, when complete, will be over 42,000 sq feet. Phase 1 will be Approx. 25,000 sq feet. Phase 1 will consist of 2 full size basketball courts that will allow us to start a basketball program for children ages 5-14. We will start a volleyball program for girls ages 7-14. We will offer pickleball and aerobic classes for seniors. These are just some of the new programs that the building will allow us to offer. The building will allow us to expand summer camps, and also start an after school program. We feel we can offer a very good option for parents with an after school program. It would allow us to have a space to do homework and get some exercise before their parents pick them up. We are really excited about the Recreation Center and all the new programs that we will be able to offer".

The Recreation Center is a two phase project. Construction of Phase One is estimated to be completed in 13 months.

LOCAL RESIDENT COMMISSIONS AS UNITED STATES ARMY 2ND LIEUTENANT



Jacob Drobney, a recent graduate of the University of North Georgia and a cadet in the Boars Head Brigade Corp of Cadets, has been commissioned as a 2nd Lt. in the United States Army. Drobney, a 2016 graduate of North Cobb High School's Magnet Program for International Studies, attended the University of North Georgia on a 4 year Army ROTC Scholarship. UNG is one of our nation's six Senior Military Colleges. In fact, UNG is the #1 Senior Military College having received the distinguished MacArthur Award 2 out of the last 3 years. The MacArthur Award recognizes the top Army ROTC program among the six Military Colleges including the Citadel, Norwich University, VMI, Texas A&M, Virginia Tech and the University of North Georgia.

Drobney is a Distinguished Military Graduate recipient, the highest national award for ROTC graduates.

Drobney was 1 of only 18 UNG cadets in the 2020 graduating class to earn this distinction. Distinguished Military Graduates are ranked in the top 20% in the nation among more than 5,000 ROTC cadets. Cadets are ranked on the national Order of Merit List (OML) by achieving superior grade-point averages, strong performance in the Army Combat Fitness Test, and

proving their worth as exceptional leaders in their college ROTC training.

Drobney earned a Bachelor of Arts in International Affairs with an Asian Concentration and a Leadership Minor. 2nd Lt. Drobney will serve as an active duty officer in the Armor Branch and will report for his Basic Officer Leadership Course (BOLC) at Ft. Benning in early Fall

WHY WE SAY WHAT WE SAY..

Today's article is on words from medieval times. First, I want to explain the origin of the word Medieval. The word dates back to only 1817 and is a condensed form of the Latin phrase



"medium aevum", meaning Middle Ages. The term "Middle Ages" refers to the period between, or in the middle of, the fall of Rome and the Renaissance.

In medieval households the oldest person would typically take the first bath. The second oldest would take the next bath, then the third, and so forth. This means the baby went last. The bathwater would not be changed so as more family members took their bath it would get dirty. When the baby was done, the water was so dirty you might not notice the baby. If someone was not paying attention the baby might get thrown out with the bathwater! This led to the warning, "Don't throw the baby out with the bathwater!"

LUKEWARM comes from old English. The word "lewk" is old English for warm, so lukewarm actually means "warm warm".

During the Middle Ages people would go on pilgrimages. When they passed thru a village they would say "a la Sainte Terre", meaning "To the Holy Land". They became known as Sainte-Terre-ers, or saunterers. During these trips the travelers would stop in the villages and would spend time there, so these pilgrimages could take a long time. Because of how long and slow these "saunterers" trips could be, the word SAUNTER came to mean a long, slow walk





COBB COUNTY SCHOOLS RETURN VIRTUALLY

Exasperated months of a grueling pandemic in an unprecedented world posed society with innumerable obstacles to overcome. A prominent problem concerning returning to school quickly emerged with summer coming to a rapid end. On July 16th, Cobb County Schools released their decision to return to school with a fully remote platform starting in the fall.

Although the decision presented teachers and students alike with a sense of clarity discerning returning to school, it's ambiguous composition sparked innumerable questions.

CCSD Superintendent Chris Ragsdale announced that the county would transition to remote learning beginning August 17th, instead of in the traditional face-to-face way of schooling. Ragsdale stands firmly in his belief that due to the rapid spread of the fatal disease affecting the day to day lives of Cobb County families, the continuation of furthering students' education virtually constitutes the safest and smartest option.

Students across the county display mixed emotions in relation to starting school virtually. Some students are ecstatic with school being strictly online and feel as if this transition will boost their academic performance while keeping them safe during the pandemic.

"Starting virtually is the right thing to do. I definitely miss my friends but I would never want to expose them or their families to a disease that could endanger their health," rising junior, Abigail Nwachukwu, said.

However, despite the evident health risks, numerous students revealed their devastation with CCSD's decision to participate in virtual learning. Students quickly became fixated with the negative aspects that remote learning would inevitably cause. Students worry that their mental health will deteriorate after not being able so see their beloved teachers and classmates on a day to day basis. They also voiced concern that the virtual learning mandate will hinder

"I am afraid that I won't learn as well as I should because I learn best when I am able to ask my teachers questions and Iam able to perform hands-on activities," rising junior, Alyssa Maclellan said.

Although CCSD ceased to release a return to school date, Ragsdale stands firm in his belief that staff and students will flourish under the new virtual learning mandate. With only days of summer vacation remaining, students anxiously await their schedules as teachers head back to school where they will participate in training to ensure that virtual learning provides students with all of the help and resources that a traditional classroom environment presents.

Editor's Note: While working at home, students will have a more structured schedule than they did last Spring. Attendance will be taken every morning, classes will be held on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, with Wednesday being reserved as an Instructional Support Day. A lot of thought and preparation went into these schedules and when face to face learning opens, the schedules will be able to slide right into the class rooms. BLACK BEAR VISITS MARIETTA

As most of metro Atlanta is now aware, a roughly 300 pound adult male black bear decided to visit Marietta yesterday. Calls to 911 operators began just before 9:00 AM yesterday and continued throughout the day. The big boy paid a visit to Laurel Park off Manning Road before migrating to multiple neighborhoods in the surrounding area. National Park Service (NPS) Chief Ranger Anthony Winegar joined MPD Major Brian Marshall in monitoring the bears movements though out the day. Department of Natural Resources (DNR) was contacted early in the day and advised that the heat would cause additional stress to the bear if they attempted to immobilize it chemically (a.k.a. "tranquilize"). The hope was that the bear would return to the woods in the nearby National Park on its own. By early evening it became obvious the bear was quite content with its new home and was in no hurry to leave. Once the sun set and temperatures cooled, the DNR, NPD and MPD came up with a plan. Trained certified personnel from DNR safely chemically immobilized the bear around 10:15 PM near 175 Kimberly Way.

DNR transported the bear to monitor its health and we are happy to report he is now awake, healthy and recovering from the chemical immobilization. DNR stated they plan to release him in a natural habitat outside Cobb County at an undisclosed location in North Georgia. We have also been asked if it will be tagged or chipped, and DNR stated that is not necessary as he did not attack anyone or show any signs of aggression. We want to thank everyone involved in this process. Federal, State and local authorities all worked together with Marietta residents to safely relocate this large bear.

GARBAGE IS IRRESISTIBLE TO A HUNGRY BLACK BEAR

The presence of unsecured household garbage (or other bear attractant) encourages bears to change their normal behavior and movement patterns and "hang out" in residential areas. Be BearWise and know that one of the first, and most important, things you can do to help is to stash your trash—resolving potential human-bear encounters before they start or escalate.

"Avoiding problems with bears—or being BearWise—is usually simple, though it may not always be convenient," says Adam Hammond, Georgia Department of

Natural Resources' Wildlife Resources Division state bear biologist. "One of the six BearWise Basics is about securing food, garbage, and recycling. When bears have access to human-provided foods, regardless of the source or the intent, they will take advantage of them, and that often leads to further problems."

that often leads to further problems."

Why is it such a big deal? A bear that repeatedly finds food from garbage cans, bird feeders, and pet food bowls is unlikely to leave, and will become bolder in its search for easy food. This can lead to property damage of homes, garages, vehicles, and more. Once bears have learned bad habits and have come to rely on people for a "free meal," they rarely change those behaviors, and this type of behavior progressively gets worse with time and experience. If you really care about bears, please make the extra effort to ensure that your home and yard are "unattractive" to bears—to protect yourself, your family and pets, and bears.

BearWise is an education program developed by bear biologists from each of the 15 state wildlife agencies that make up the Southeastern Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies (SEAFWA). The program, anchored by the website www.bearwise.org, offers citizen specific, detailed, and high-quality information to help people live responsibly with bears and to keep bears wild. Parents, this website has exciting NEW items geared towards kids, including activity/coloring sheets and a placemat for children. These items are a great tool for keeping kids busy and helping them learn about bears.

The black bear is a symbol of Georgia's natural diversity, the only bear found in the state and a conservation success story. Though now considered the most common bear in North America, the species was nearly eradicated from Georgia in the 1930s due to unregulated market hunting, illegal harvest—including the killing of bears as "vermin," and large-scale habitat loss. Sound wildlife management practices have restored Georgia's black bears to a thriving population estimated at 4,100 bears statewide

Black bears may legally be hunted in certain parts of Georgia during the fall (https://georgiawildlife.com/bear-info). However, the taking of bears during any other time of the year, or the taking of bears illegally during the hunting season, is called poaching. Prevent poaching by reporting illegal activity. 


