ANDREW BRAMLETT'S WHY WE SAY WHAT WE SAY..

For this month's article, I will be talking about some spooky Halloween words.

All Saint's Day, also called All Hallows' Day, is celebrated by the Catholic Church on



the first day of November. In medieval Scotland the day before All Hallows' Day was also celebrated and was known as All Hallows Eve, which was sometimes referred to by the slang term "Allhallow-even". By 1750 this had morphed into the word HALLOWEEN.

The legend of the VAMPIRE comes

originally from Eastern Europe. It is often believed the word comes from the Slavic word ubyr, meaning witch. This morphed into the Hungarian and German word vampir, which became the French word VAMPIRE.

COUNT DRACULA gets his name from Vlad Dracula, a ruler in the area of modernday Romania. He is much better known by the name Vlad the Impaler, and is actually considered a national hero in Romania. WEREWOLF comes from the Old English word Wer, meaning man or male, and wolf comes from early German. Werewolf simply means "Wolf-Man".

GHOUL is from the Arabic word ghul, which is the name for graverobbing monsters of Middle Eastern legend. It was first used in English in 1786 by Samuel Henley, who was translating a French novel set in the Middle East called Vathek.

In colonial Haiti, slaves told stories of people brought back to life as undead corpses, doomed to walk the earth forever. The name for these creatures is believed to come the Kongo Language of Central Africa. It may be a combination of the words nzambi, meaning god, and zumbi, meaning an object with special powers. The word ZOMBIE became widespread in America in 1929, after a novel about zombies called "The Magic Island", was published.

For the past 2 ½ years Andrew Bramlett has written articles for the Bright Side on the origins of Words and Phrases. Now Andrew also is producing videos! 





On April 12, 1962 the City of Kennesaw held a centennial in commeration of the famous locomotive chase that occurred when the General was hi-jacked from Kennesaw on April 12, 1862 by Andrews Raiders. To commemorate this 100 year occasion, The General steamed into Kennesaw under its own power and retraced its route between Big Shanty (Kennesaw) and Chattanooga in celebration of the chase.

With the appearance of the General, Kennesaw began to envision the famous locomotive as part of their town and residents went to work to accomplish this purpose the big shanty historical society was incorporated for the purpose of bringing the general home after the Georgia general assembly approved the resolution to place the engine in a Kennesaw museum.

Plans were sidelined when the Mayor of Chattanooga and his officials captured the General in the city's freight yard as the train was on its way to Kennesaw and refused to let it leave. The battle to retrieve the locomotive was turned over to the governor's office and the issue went to court in 1968. In 1970 the United States Supreme Court ruled that the L & N Railroad had the right to give the train to anyone.

The general was returned to the state of Georgia and on April 12, 1972 the Big Shanty Museum was open to the public and the Big Shanty commemoration was held so to celebrate the return of the train.

Our own engineer, V. G. Prather was given the honor of bringing the General home. A big thank you to his son, Steve Prather (Acworth) for sharing the photo above. These are some of the dignitaries

involved in bringing the General home.

BIG SHANTY FESTIVAL HISTORY

In 1975, merchants in the downtown area of Kennesaw created a business organization that would promote and preserve the historical heritage of the downtown area of Kennesaw and encourage people to patronize their businesses. Thus the Kennesaw Business Association was chartered. Town Center wasn't even a gleam in anyone's eye then — the area was still being farmed. I-75 stopped in Marietta and resumed in Cartersville, and Highway 41 (now

Cobb Parkway) was dotted with Stuckey's, quilts, and boiled peanuts.

The following is a reprint from a 1978 newspaper article in the Newshopper: "The Festival, an annual event, originated in 1975 for the purpose of stimulating tourism and promoting business in the downtown area of Kennesaw and to celebrate the history of our town. The idea started with Gayle DeSpain, Lynda Spence, Carol Thompson and Jean Guess, all local business women and members of the KBA. In discussing ways to bring new people and business into Kennesaw, they planned a spring outdoor sale in an open area between their shops on Main Street, with the hopes of attracting customers with a colorful display of antiques and craft items.

Dr. Frank Boone, President in 1975, suggested that their plans be sponsored on a larger scale by the business association and supported by the City of Kennesaw (he was a Councilman too). Thus the first Festival was born. Originally known as Trade Days, that first Spring, 36 booth spaces were set up. In 1977, Festival Chairman, Dent Myers, added a civil war battle reenactment and over 10,000 people attended the Spring event.

The rest is history, with the sponsorship of the KBA and the active support of the City of Kennesaw, the Festival has spread from the front lawn of By-Gone Treasures to encompass the lawn of the Museum, the Depot Parking lot, line the streets of J. O. Stephenson Ave and Main St.. and fill the parking areas at City Hall. Over 150 booths have been sold for this year's festival — I don't think any of us who were involved in the planning of the first event ever envisioned how large and successful it would grow..

MUST MINISTRIES NEEDS HELP!!

MUST Ministries is experiencing the greatest food need in its 49-year history "No words can express the desperation we've seen in the past few months. No food, no jobs, no place to live.....and no hope," stated MUST Ministries President and CEO Dr. Ike Reighard.

The truth is, food sources are scarce, Reighard continued. The food banks can't help because their inventory is virtually gone. The grocery stores have a limit on quantities and the aluminum shortage has reduced the availability of canned goods.

Because of these difficult situations, MUST is calling on the public to pitch in during this unprecedented crisis. The nonprofit is requesting people consider two ways to help.

- 1. Host a food drive for items needed most: Canned vegetables (beans, corn, green beans, tomatoes) Beef stew, Canned meats (chicken, tuna, ham) Chunky or condensed soups, Canned fruit or fruit cups Mac and Cheese boxes, Pasta Canned pasta, Spaghetti sauce with meat, Chilli
- 2. Give financially or raise money to give. Limited food supply means less food donated.

"Schools, churches and businesses who normally give have been closed. Most of our food supply has to be purchased - about 80% - and at retail prices. We need PALLETS of food each week," Reighard said.

To put this in perspective, MUST has distributed more than 1.2 MILLION POUNDS of food since March 16. MUST has 39 school food pantries and 3 client services pantries, sends food boxes to senior citizens in two counties and just finished the annual Summer Lunch program where a record 379,471 meals were provided to at-risk children in five counties.

Marietta-based MUST Ministries has been delivering food to its

Marietta-based MUST Ministries has been delivering food to its 39 MUST Neighborhood Pantry programs embedded in public schools, a source of providing 384,419 pounds of food since COVID began in March.

"Never has the scripture 'I was hungry and you fed me' meant so much to so many," Reighard said. "Right now, we are praying the community will come to the rescue of their neighbors in need. If people will shop this week and bring us food, it will help save the day."

Food donations can be dropped off at the MUST Donation Center drive-thru at 1280 Field Parkway off Highway 41, open Tuesday - Saturday, 9-5. The Donation Center is closed Saturday - Monday to give our hard-working staff some time off, Reighard explained. "It's been a long six months of non-stop outreach." Financial donations can be made at mustministries.org by clicking the donate button on the front page.



MEDICARE PLAN F "TRAP" STAY OR MOVE? JERRY BOHUS, PROVIDENT INSURANCE

If you are enrolled in a Medicare Plan F, you may want to look at other options as the result of a recent change in the enrollment rules.

The Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) issued a rule change that enrollment in Plan F will only be available to persons who turned 65 prior to January 1, 2020.

Plans G and N have replaced Plan F for the newly eligible turning 65, after January 1,2020.

The most popular plan is Plan G. Inpatient hospital services are covered at 100% in both Plan F and G. The only difference between Plans F and G is that G has an annual deductible (\$198 in 2020) for outpatient services and doctor visits, as determined by CMS each year.

Enrolling in Plan F will cost \$700 to \$800 per year more than Plan G. Thus, the annual \$198 deductible in Plan G is a bargain compared to the extra cost of Plan F.

There are fewer younger insureds enrolling in Plan F today. The average age of those enrolled in Plan F is rising every year. Therefore, the expectation is that the annual rise in Plan F premiums over time will be higher than increases in Plan G premiums. This difference will become

If you are already enrolled in Plan F and want to move to Plan G to take advantage of lower rates, you can do this anytime during the year. However, you will have to go through medical underwriting and might be turned down due to existing medical conditions, and this is the "Plan F trap". I can help

you with this underwriting process.

If you are unable to pass the medical underwriting needed to enroll in Plan G, there are

still two options available for you.

One, you can drop Plan F and keep only Medicare and A and B, a possibly risky strategy.

And two, you can move to a Medicare Advantage plan during the Annual Enrollment Period, October 15 to December 7. I can also help with this option.
