### FEDERAL GRANT RECEIVED TO ESTABLISH FAMILY JUSTICE CENTER IN COBB

Cobb District Attorney Joyette M. Holmes announces that her office and its partners have been awarded a four-year grant worth up to \$400,000 to create a Family Justice Center, where victims of domestic violence, sexual assault and child abuse can receive services in a single location.

"It is exciting that Cobb County has such great collaboration and support among victimservice providers, law enforcement and county government that we were successful in seeking out this opportunity," DA Holmes said. "The partnering agencies are committed to the establishment of a Family Justice Center for our community so that we can serve the victim where they are rather than the victim having to seek services where the agencies are located. This streamlining of services will provide a safe place for victims and survivors to go to receive wrap-around and holistic services. I am devoted to leading in the planning, implementation, and ongoing partnership to build a Family Justice Center for Cobb County."

Partners include LiveSAFE Resources, SafePath Children's Advocacy Center, Inc., along with Cobb County Government, the Cobb Sheriff's Office and Police Department, the Solicitor General's Office, and Legal Aid of Cobb County. Partnering agencies and offices will have the opportunity to house representatives in the new center to serve victims. The grant is administered through Georgia's Criminal Justice Coordinating Council with

Only two other Georgia communities, Waycross and Macon, were awarded grants to create family justice centers. Savannah has

the only existing center in Georgia. The family justice center model has been identified as a best practice in the intervention and prevention of domestic violence by the U.S. Department of Justice's Office on Violence Against Women. Documented and published outcomes include reduced homicides, increased victim safety and empowerment, reduced fear and anxiety for victims and their children, and reduced recantation by victims receiving this level of support.

Agencies that provided support for Cobb's center in the application process include Center for Family Resources; Cobb Collaborative; the Division of Family and Children's Services; Kennesaw State University's WellStar College of Health and Human Services; police departments of Acworth, Kennesaw and Smyrna; the Georgia Commission on Family Violence; and the Prosecuting Attorney's Council of Georgia.

Planning and establishing the center will require significant community buyin. Cobb's leaders are planning a virtual community meeting in early December to begin discussions.

For this month's article, I will be talking about words originating during the days of steamboats.

On steamboats. the more expensive rooms on a boat were on the top deck. This was because the breeze, caused by



the moving boat, was nicer the higher you went on the ship. In order to keep smoke from the engines out of the faces of wealthy passengers who stayed in those rooms, the smokestacks were built very tall. In architecture, groves cut into columns are called "Fluting". Some steamboats had fluted smokestacks for decoration. This meant that the smokestacks were both high and fluted, or HIGHFALUTIN'. This term eventually came to be associated with the passengers that the smokestacks were designed to protect.

Once railroads became widespread, they slowly replaced steamboats as the main way of traveling across the country. Steamboat owners realized they needed to find better ways to market their ships if they wanted to stay in business. They began building larger boats with theatres where they would have flamboyant performances. These boats with shows came to be known as SHOWBOATS.

Some people could not afford to travel by showboat, so they used a cheaper alternative: the raft. You would propel it with a pole called a riff, and they were on a raft. That created the term "riff raft" which later became RIFF RAFF.

As people were traveling shallow rivers by raft, their riff often got stuck in the muddy riverbed. People who were stubborn or refused to change were sometimes compared to riffs stuck in the mud, which created the phrase STICK IN THE MUD.

Dale was a hardworking man who not only owned his own business in Kennesaw and but contributed a lot to his community. He was a friend to all who knew him and would give the shirt off of his back to help someone in need.

He was the co-founder of the Kennesaw Business Association with Dr. Frank Boone and won several awards and recognitions including being honored by the City of Kennesaw for 30 plus years of service to the community. Dale passed away on April 12, 2020.

### TOWN CENTER COMMUNITY ALLIANCE COMPLETES PLANE INSTALLATION The Town Center Community Alliance (Alliance),



nonprofit partner of the Town Center Community Improvement District (CID), has completed the installation of a restored and refurbished 1964 Beechcraft A-23 Musketeer airplane at Aviation Park. Several partners contributed to making this project a reality. The plane was donated to the Alliance by Hawthorne Aviation, then restored by DLK Aviation Incorporated. Engineering, design, and installation was provided by DeNyse; other partners include Fly LBI, Priority Jet, and Brahma Marketing.

The custom tail number for the plane is "N20RYY" which is consistent with industry standards for naming similar planes. The prefix, "N", stands for its country of origin which, in this case, is the United States of America. Typically followed by numbers, the number "20" was selected to commemorate the year of installation. Lastly, the final letters, "RYY", reflect the three-letter airport code for Cobb County International Airport.

Aviation Park was opened in 2017 and is located

adjacent to Cobb County International Airport's runway and alongside the Noonday Creek Trail. The three-acre park was a collective enterprise between the Alliance, the Town Center CID and Cobb County to convert under-utilized vacant property into a themed environment for all ages to enjoy. The park includes a spacious open greenspace for viewing aircraft take offs and landings, a covered pavilion for picnicking, a lighted parking lot, and restroom facilities housed in a building to mimic the air traffic control tower at the airport. The state-of-the-art, aviation-themed playground is enhanced with S.T.E.M. related playground equipment which allows youth to combine electronic games and healthy outdoor, physical play.

### MARIETTA PILGRIMAGE TRANSITIONS TO **SELF-GUIDED WALKING TOUR**

In light of the current conditions concerning COVID-19, the Marietta Visitors Bureau and Cobb Landmarks & Historical Society, organizers of the Marietta Pilgrimage Christmas Home Tour, have decided to transition this year's tour to a self-guided walking tour featuring historic homes located in the Church-Cherokee Historic District.

The Marietta Pilgrimage is an annual home tour typically attended by 2,500-3,000 people over a two-day period each December. The tour usually features six private homes and a variety of local historic sites and museums. Money raised from the tour, which has been held each year since 1987, helps fund the Marietta Visitors Bureau and Cobb Landmarks & Historical Society.

Those wishing to enjoy the walking tour will need to purchase an official Marietta Pilgrimage Walking Tour booklet, which will be available for \$25 at the Marietta Welcome Center or the William Root House. Each booklet will include a walking tour map, photos and information about the participating homes, and a scavenger hunt for younger tour-goers. The booklet will also include discounts and coupons from local Marietta restaurants and merchants.

Proceeds from sales of the booklet will benefit the Marietta Visitors Bureau and Cobb Landmarks.

Homes included in the walking tour are in the Church-Cherokee Historic District, Marietta and will be eligible to win one of three prizes.
