ANDREW BRAMLETT'S
WHY WE SAY WHAT
WE SAY..

This month's article is about the origins of some common plantnames. The word FLOWER comes from the Latin word Flora, which is also the name of the Roman goddess of flowers. DANDELIONcomes



from the flowers French name, dent-de-lion, meaning "Lion's Tooth". It is believed that the name refers to the pointed, toothlike, petals. RHODODENDRON comes from two Greek words: rhdon, meaning rose, and dendron, meaning tree. So, Rhododendron simply means "Rose-Tree".

TREE is believed to date back to the Welsh word derwen, which originally referred to oak trees. Over time, the word changed dramatically. First it became trewan, then trae, and finally tree. SPRUCE comes from the Old English word pruce which referred to Prussia that today a part of Germany. In medieval England, the word pruce was a trading term applied to all Prussian goods. At the time, it was believed Spruce trees only grew in Prussia, so the wood was referred to by the trading term when it was imported to England. Eventually, Spruce became the trees name.

CORN has historically been ground to make cornmeal, and because of this corn comes from a Germanic word for particle, kurnam. On a side note, the "corned" in CORNED BEEF represents the particles of salt that preserves the meat. Both LIME and LEMON come from the Arabic word limah, meaning citrus fruit. Finally, GRASS comes from the early Germanic word grassan, meaning "that which grows".

MARIETTA'S BIRNEY MEMORIAL GARDEN HONORS PTA FOUNDER NATIONAL PTA FOUNDER'S DAY

While parents, teachers and students manage education during unprecedented times of a Covid-pandemic, one thing remains constant... the commitment to children.

On February 17, our nation celebrated PTA Founder's Day (Founded in 1897 as the National Congress of Mothers) and honor the legacy and work of their founders — Alice McLellan Birney, Pheobe Apperson Hearst, and Selena Sloan Butler. While all three women are held with high regard, those of us in Marietta, GA hold a special place in our heart for Alice Birney — our hometown hero.

The Birney Memorial Rose Garden, originally named "The Sun Court," was dedicated in 1942 to honor Alice Birney as the co-founder of National PTA. This historic garden is situated on the, now, Marietta Middle School campus. At the center of the court there is a sun dial and it is surrounded by square, stone slabs representing each of the 50 state PTAs. Outlining the courtyard are garden beds showcasing 40 varieties of roses.

The Birney Memorial Rose Garden is maintained by Marietta Daisies Garden Club volunteers, known as the "Daisy Darlings." Collectively, the Daisy Darlings donate more than 130 man-hours/year to prune, plant, and nurture this community treasure

Donations are accepted to help with the maintenance and repair cost. Most recently, Daisy Darling/artist, Melissa Snyder, created a beautiful illustration which has been made into notecards and will also be sold as a limited-edition print to help offset expenses of stone replacement. Notecards are available for sale through Marietta retailers, White Rabbit Cottage and Market with a B.
