This month's article is about foods which you may not know were named for people. The most famous example is SANDWICH, named after John Montagu, 4th Earl of Sandwich. While gambling one day, the earl did not



want to leave his seat at the table. He asked a servant to make something he could eat that would not interrupt the game. The servant returned with meat between two slices of bread. This soon became known as a SANDWICH. The variety of chocolate used in the original GERMAN CHOCOLATE CAKE was made by the Baker's Chocolate Company. It was named "Baker's German's Sweet Chocolate" after its inventor, Samuel German. He created the chocolate in 1852, but it took 102 years for it to become popular in cake. TACO BELL is named after its founder, Glen Bell, who founded the company in 1962, in Downey, California.

James Salisbury was a popular Victorian physician, chemist, and dietitian. He was well known for his advocacy of eating plenty of meat. Salisbury was especially fond of a type of hamburger steak, later named SALISBURY STEAK in his honor. In 1923 Italian immigrant Caesar Cardini, who lived in San Diego, opened Caesar's restaurant in Tijuana, Mexico. He opened his restaurant in Mexico to avoid American prohibition laws. On July 4, 1924, Cardini invented the CAESER SALAD, which was named after both him and his restaurant. COBB SALAD is named after Richard H. Cobb, original owner of Hollywood's Brown Derby Restaurant. According to legend, Cobb made the salad out of spare ingredients in the restaurant's kitchen.

Another wonderful walking meditation is to walk a labyrinth. A labyrinth is a single winding path that leads to a center. It is not a maze that confuses or blocks your way. A labyrinth is built on the ground and you can see exactly where you are going. It winds back and forth until you reach the center and then you pause there and walk the same path back out.


There is no right or wrong way to walk a labyrinth; just enter and walk. You walk at the pace that is good for you and see if anything comes up for you. Just breathe and stay as calm as you can.

They take very good care of this one and it is in a peaceful location. The visitor's center of Rome has one at the back of their parking lot. I really like this one as it is made of grass and bricks. I like to walk a labyrinth with no shoes. The Spa at Dahlonega has a wonderful one on their property too. They are always planting new flowers and plants around the edges. 

BIG SHANTY FESTIVAL HISTORY

In 1975, merchants in the downtown area of Kennesaw created a business organization that would promote and preserve the historical heritage of the downtown area of Kennesaw and encourage people to patronize their businesses. Thus the Kennesaw Business Association was chartered. Town Center wasn't even a gleam in anyone's eye then — the area was still being farmed. I-75 stopped in Marietta and resumed in Cartersville, and Highway 41 (now Cobb Parkway) was dotted with Stuckey's, quilts, and boiled peanuts.

Cobb Parkway) was dotted with Stuckey's, quilts, and boiled peanuts. The idea started with Gayle DeSpain, Lynda Spence, Carol Thompson and Jean Guess, all local business women and members of the KBA. In discussing ways to bring new people and business into Kennesaw, they planned a spring outdoor sale in an open area between their shops on Main Street, with the hopes of attracting customers with a colorful display of antiques and craft items." Dr. Frank Boone, President in 1975, suggested that their plans be sponsored on a larger scale by

Dr. Frank Boone, President in 1975, suggested that their plans be sponsored on a larger scale by the business association and supported by the City of Kennesaw (he was a Councilman too). Thus the first Festival was born. Originally known as Trade Days, that first Spring, 36 booth spaces were set up. In 1977, Festival Chairman, Dent Myers, added a civil war battle reenactment and over 10,000 people attended the Spring event.

The rest is history, with the sponsorship of the KBA and the active support of the City of Kennesaw, the Festival has spread from the front lawn of By-Gone Treasures to encompass the lawn of the Museum, the Depot Parking lot, line the streets of J. O. Stephenson Ave and Main St.. and fill the parking areas at City Hall. Over 250 booths have been sold for this year's festival — I don't think any of us who were involved in the planning of the first event ever envisioned how large and successful it would grow.





WHEN DOES A PLANT BECOME A WEED? KEN WHITE, OUTDOOR COLUMNIST

One thing that thrives in spite of all the rain this spring are weeds, as gardeners well know.

There seems to be a growing number of plants we can do without because of their threatening the health of our native species. Organizations with names like Weed Warriors and Weed Busters have declared war on this seemingly benign enemy plants. Citizen volunteers and professionals alike have armed themselves with every garden tool imaginable to literally "root out" invasions of exotic plant species.

What makes a plant an exotic species? An exotic plant is one that has been transplanted from its habitat of origin to another one, like when a person has moved from one culture or country to another or from the eastern United States to the west, or vice versa. The seeds of exotic plants disperse in all directions, even making their way into wilderness areas or on the boots of hikers, vehicle tires or even on the fur of animals,

Why does a given plant species become invasive? Two primary factors seem to contribute to plant invasions. These are the biology of a plant species and disturbances to the land. Disturbances to the landscape such as roads, gas and power line rights-of-way and housing developments often take ecological succession back to bare ground. This creates opportunities for these plants to become established. Once established, their rapid growth and reproduction rates allow them to cover and choke out native plant communities. Disturbances in natural areas such as deer overgrazing may create opportunities on the forest floor for invasive species to expand. Once established, these invasive species prevent the once diverse carpet of wildflowers from returning.

of wildflowers from returning. As a result of the introduction and spread of invasive species, increasing losses of wildlife food and habitat occur. In addition, it cost billions of dollars to protect and restore natural resources threatened by these invasive species. In many southern states, kudzu has been an increasing problem. This vine grows a foot a day and within a few years, acres of wildlife habitat vanish. Forget the trellis, this import from Asia grows nearly 60 feet in a growing season over shrubs and trees. Like many exotic imports, it is a weed gone wild.

Another plant I remember that, at first, was promoted as a good thing for use in erosion control as well as a living fence for livestock, was the multiflora rose. However, long ago it surpassed the qualifications as the most problematic invasive plant species. Its prolific spread across fields, park lands and woodlands placed it on the noxious weed list. Hundreds of thousands of dollars were spent each year trying to remove this pest plant.

To help minimize landscape disturbances from these and other invasive plant species, don't buy or plant invasive species. Buy primarily native plants for your gardens. As all gardeners know, weeds will grow when nothing else will.
