Live music begins at 5:30 p.m. Fireworks will begin at approximately 9:30 p.m. (subject to change depending on weather).

As tradition holds, there will be special tribute to all those men and women who have served in our Armed Forces at 7:45 p.m. Then our headliners "FLASHBACK" takes the stage at 8:00 p.m. This is the 20th year in a row that Flashback has brought their energy to the Acworth state. Flashback takes you through decades of classics; from the best of Motown, Beach, and Disco, then all the way into Current Top Hits. The audience experiences an interactive and energetic performance while dancing to song after song!

This Party Band showcases phenomenal musicians, clever choreography, breathtaking vocals, and carefully chosen medleys of all your favorite songs. Each of the seasoned musicians in Flashback bring years of experience and unimaginable talent to the stage.

Admission to the event and concert is free! There will be food vendors on-site selling a variety of options beginning at noon. Tables are available to purchase for the July 4th concert. Cauble will not be permitted to leave once the fireworks have begun. Cars will be permitted to leave the park once the fireworks have concluded and the crowd has cleared out.

Those without a parking pass or if the parking is full will need to park downtown and walk down to the park. Shuttles will not be running for this event. Handicap parking will be available at McCall Primary School and there will be a shuttle provided for handicap attendees. Handicap shuttles begin at noon.

MARIETTA TO CELEBRATE JULY 4 ON SATURDAY JULY 3.

Grab your American flag, put on your red, white and blue, and celebrate America's Independence July 3, from 10 a.m.-10 p.m. with an Independence Day parade and celebration on the Square presented by Superior Plumbing, free live concerts, arts and crafts show, food, carnival games and the City of Marietta fireworks finale. BRIGHT SIDE PAGE 2 ANDREW BRAMLETT'S WHY WE SAY WHAT WE SAY..

This month's article is about the origins of the names Southern foods. of BARBECUE (and BAR-B-O)come from the Arawakan tribe of Haiti, who referred to a framework of sticks as "barbacoa" Barbacoa were used



to cure meat. The word barbacoa first became Spanish, and eventually became the English word Barbecue. Originally in English the word Barbecue meant a large gathering featuring roasted meat, and eventually in the South it came refer to the roasted meat itself.

GRITS can trace its roots back to the Old English word gryyt, meaning a course, ground meal, like cornmeal. According to the Online Etymology Dictionary, the word HOMINY, the main ingredient in grits, comes from the Algonquian word "uskatahomen", meaning ground corn. Eventually, uskatahomen lost uskata", and morphed into hominy.

CRAYFISH is from the Old French word 'crevice". When it entered English, the word's pronunciation reminded people of the word fish", so the word eventually changed to reflect the association. CRAWFISH is known to be a version of crayfish, but it is not known why the word changed.

WAFFLE comes from the Middle Low German word "wafel", meaning web or honeycomb. The word was adopted by the Dutch before becoming the English word WAFFLE. Another Danish word that entered English was "baken", which morped into BACON. The word SAUSAGE comes from the Latin word "salsicus", meaning seasoned with salt.

Another popular Southern food is OKRA, whose name comes from West Africa. One southern plant well known for its Georgia connections is the PEANUT. It was called the peanut because its "nuts" are the size of a pea. As any peanut aficionado can tell you, however, it is not a nut but a legume. LEGUME is from French and originally meant any small plant. It is possibly related to the Latin word 'legere", meaning "to gather".





In doing so, the city has provided funding to ensure that important black historical landmarks are preserved, and improvements have been made to the properties. These improvements included the construction of Doyal Hill Park. Named for Acworth's first black Alderman, this park features an outdoor interpretive history area featuring public art honoring Acworth's rich black history. The historic home and business of one of Acworth's first black business owners was restored and now brings art exhibitions and classes to the community as the Art House. We opened Depot Park where visitors will find a free history center and video interviews with firsthand accounts of Acworth's past. The Acworth Community Center is the centerpiece of the Parkside District. There we hosted a series of community conversations that opened communication within the community and sought to increase transparency and trust between city leadership, the police department, and the minority community.

None of this would have been possible without the love and support of our community partners, businesses, residents, and local leaders. We cannot thank you enough for making Acworth a community for everyone, and congratulations on being in the All-America City Hall of Fame!



Located on the corner of Barrett Lakes Boulevard and Cobb Place Boulevard, Aviation Park is a three-acre public park, accessible 365 days a year, featuring open spaces for airplane viewing, a playground area, covered pavilion, bike share station, parking and restrooms. "Mechanics of Motion" is part of the Alliance's initiative to bring community programs and S.T.E.M.-related activities to the flight-themed park.





We are hoping to have more events this summer before Sophie heads off to college." said Kathy Winiarczyk, Business Development Officer.

Edwards began working to end chronic childhood hunger in kindergarten when she learned a classmate was participating in the free and reduced lunch program. From then on she dedicated her time to the cause by providing more than 3,000 meals for summer lunch programs, raising more than \$10,000 through five bake sales, speaking at multiple fundraising events, volunteering over 2,100 hours, forming the Square Meal Project when she was only eight years old and recently repurposing a retired school bus to create a mobile food pantry and summer meal delivery service with Marietta City Schools. COBB SCHOOLS UPDATED PUBLIC HEALTH GUIDANCE

Over the last year and a half, our students, staff, families, and entire county have faced very difficult circumstances. Our students have learned, and our teachers have taught, through the COVID-19 pandemic with information about COVID-19 that has not always been easy to understand.

Earlier today, the CDC announced that they have updated mask guidelines for fully vaccinated individuals. The new guidance states:

• Fully vaccinated people no longer need to wear a mask or physically distance in any setting, except where required by federal, state, local, tribal, or territorial laws, rules, and regulations, including local business and workplace guidance

• Fully vaccinated people can refrain from testing following a known exposure unless they are residents or employees of a correctional or detention facility or a homeless shelter

In accordance with the new guidance, Cobb Schools will no longer require fully vaccinated individuals to wear a mask. We would also like to make clear that any individual wishing to continue wearing a mask while attending school and/or school events should feel free to do so.
