Festival fans and music lovers are invited to join Kennesaw Parks & Rec for two days of barbeque bliss at the Pigs & Peaches BBQ Festival on Friday, August 20 from 6 - 10 p.m.

From its humble beginnings, Pigs & Peaches has grown into one of the region's most beloved festivals attracting an estimated 65,000 attendees annually. Music headliners on the Main Stage include the rock & pop group, the Paul Hand Band, on Friday, starting at 8:00 p.m., and the sound of 80's arena songs from Shyanne on Saturday at 8:00 p.m. Supporting acts include Angie Lynn Carter, Flying Buffaloes, Same Holladay & Kaitlyn Hanks, The Shetlands, Bach to Rock Sandy Plains featuring Bella Delle and the School of Rock East Cobb House Band.

Musicians on the Locally Brewed Stage include Men in Blues, Josh Gilbert Band, Run Katie Run, School of Rock West Cobb, Stephanie Berlanga, Levi Ransom, Bad Guru and Ezra Jacob.

ANDREW BRAMLETT'S WHY WE SAY WHAT WE SAY..

During

last month's Independence Day celebrations, I was reminded of a word withsurprisingorigins in the American Revolution: the word DUDE. The word dude comes from the



song "Yankee Doodle Dandy," whose lyrics may date back as far as the 1750s. According to legend, it was written by Richard Schuckburg, a British doctor living in America. The song was popularized during the American Revolution by British soldiers, who were using its lyrics to mock the colonists. The Americans took the song and made it a point of pride, and it quickly became a patriotic tune.

In the mid-1880s, "doodle" was shortened to "dood," and became a popular slang term for men who wore fancy clothes. The spelling soon morphed into DUDE. According to the BBC, Evander Berry Wall of New York was known for his expensive clothing and came to be known as the "King of the Dudes." After the turn of the century, dude gradually began to refer to all men.

Of course, "YANKEE DOODLE DANDY" has its own unique origins. A 'Doodle" was a rough and uneducated person from the country, while "Dandy" was a term for people who followed the latest European fashions. So, a "Doodle Dandy" is someone uneducated attempting to act important.

At the same time "Yankee Doodle Dandy" was written, young men from Britain were often going on trips to continental Europe and developing a love for the culture they found. One thing they particularly loved was an unheard-of dish from Italy called macaroni, and "Macaroni" soon became a popular term for these travelers. When the Yankee Doodle Dandy "stuck a feather in his hat and called it macaroni," he is emulating these high-society Englishmen.

SMITH-GILBERT GARDENS RECEIVES GRANT

Smith-Gilbert Gardens was awarded a grant by Georgia Council for the Arts (GCA), a division of the Georgia Department of Economic Development, as part of its initial disbursement of grants for fiscal year 2022. A total of 218 organizations were awarded 266 grants that provide more than \$2 million in funding to arts organizations throughout the state. The Bridge Grant provided funding for operating support to 135 organizations, the Project Grant will help fund 54 arts projects, and the Arts Education Program Grant was awarded to 77 organizations. 

Joe Nuxhall was a Reds' broadcaster for 40 years until he passed away in 2007. He always called the 3rd and 7 innings on radio. Then after the game he hosted the "Star of the game show." He would always end the night with his famous saying. "This is the old left hander rounding third and headed for home."

Rounding third and headed for home. That's pretty much where we are as we come to the end of this Series Summer Road Trip and for most all of us as summer vacation is about to end and school is about ready to start.

Vacations and visits back home are great and we love making new memories but on that drive back home we start to think of all the responsibilities that we have and all things that we have to catch back up on.

The grass needs mowing. Laundry needs to get caught up. We have to sort through the mail... Wash the car from all the dead bugs on the front hood. We head back to work with two weeks' worth of paper and work piled up on our desk.

Yes we have responsibilities but we need to remember that God has big plans and responsibilities for our homes and it is my hope and prayer that today with what little time I have left to get us motivated and excited each time that we round third and head for home.

INTRODUCTION TO THE KENNESAW **CITY CEMETERY**

BY ANDREW BRAMLETT

Located in Historic Downtown Kennesaw, the Kennesaw City Cemetery dates back to at least 1863. Prior to that time, the cemetery was part of Camp McDonald, the largest Civil War training camp in Georgia. In October of 1863, several months after the camp closed, Lucius Summers was laid to rest, becoming the cemetery's first known burial. Over the next several years, more and more townspeople were interred at the site. In 1900, the historic sections of the cemetery were purchased by the City of Kennesaw. The remaining portions, near what is now the back of the cemetery, were donated by Mayor Luther Chalker in the 1970s.

The volunteers of the Kennesaw Cemetery Preservation Commission, under advisement from the City Clerk's office, oversee the cemetery. The City Clerk's office handles all sales and permits for burials. Burial plots cost \$1,000 for city residents, and \$1,500 for non-residents. A cremation garden is also available, and memorial trees can be purchased. For more info about burials and memorial trees, visit https://www.kennesaw-ga.gov/city-cemetery/

In addition to the funding from the sale of cemetery lots and trees, the Kennesaw Cemetery Preservation Foundation helps raise money for the cemetery. More info about the Foundation can be found here: https://kennesawcemetery.org/

It has now been 158 years since Lucius Summers was laid to rest. The cemetery still remains an important part of our community and is a tangible link to our City's past.

Contestants competed at five levels (Apprentice through Varsity) in five different categories of braille literacy, including reading comprehension, spelling, speed and accuracy, proofreading, and tactile charts and graphs.
