TWO·DAY MARIETTA STREETFEST OFFERS FALL FUN FOR FAMILIES Happening in September, the 30th annual Marietta StreetFest celebrates arts & crafts, family fun, live music and classic cars in historic Marietta Square. Held Saturday, Sept. 18 and Sunday, Sept.19, the outdoor event is presented by the Marietta Museum of History, and admission is FREE!

Founded in 1991, the festival was expanded to a two-day event in 2017 and now draws more than 25,000 each year.

THE ARTS


Attendees will have the opportunity to glance through many collectibles and treasures that feature shabby chic and folk or something new and crafty for the home. Artist Alley will showcase works from more than 70 vendors. Local and national artists offer handcrafted items like paintings, jewelry, and pottery, as well as market-style items, such as lotions, jellies, jams and sauces.

KIDS

Each year, Marietta StreetFest includes plenty of fun activities for kids. In Kids Korner and Tiny Tot Town, young festival attendees will find inflatables, crafts, games and more. Throughout the weekend, a variety of kid-friendly entertainment from puppets to a bubble show will delight audiences of all ages. A small fee applies to some activities.

VINTAGE CARS

The 16th-annual Hubcaps and History Classic Car Show pops up on Saturday only on the square during Marietta StreetFest. The show will include vintage vehicles, classic cars, hot rods and more. Cars will fill the south side of the Square on Saturday (only) from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Awards will be handed out at the end of the show. The winners will be announced at the festival on Saturday at 3 p.m.



MUSIC

The StreetFest is thrilled to welcome the Marietta Grassroots Music Festival again this year. Festival-goers can grab their blankets and lawn chairs and support local musicians. This music festival was created with the purpose of showcasing the best talent from the city and surrounding communities to build upon and strengthen the foundation of community pride present today and encourage a pay-itforward attitude



BRIGHT SIDE PAGE 2 ANDREW BRAMLETT'S WHY WE SAY WHAT WE SAY.

In Ancient Athens, people who were felt to be a danger to society could be exiled for ten vears. In order for someone to be exiled, a vote had to be taken of the town citizens. Votes were



inscribed on pieces of broken pottery, and then counted. In Ancient Greece, a piece of broken pottery was called an "ostracon", and the practice of exiling someone became known as "ostracism." This gave us the word OSTRACIZE.

Back in 1867, a device was invented which printed out stock prices on a small ribbon. It was called a "ticker tape" machine. The device became popular in office buildings across the country. Office workers eventually realized the ribbon was like confetti, and was fun to throw out of windows. They began throwing the ticker tape out of windows during parades, giving us the TICKER-TAPE PARADE.

The word SMORGASBORD comes from Sweden and means "bread and butter table." Smorgasbords date back to the 14th century and are similar to a large buffet. A smorgasbord traditionally came before the main course, but it later became the full meal at the 1912 Olympic Games.

In Medieval medicine, sickness was believed to be caused by the four humors: blood, yellow bile, black bile, and phlegm. According to this belief, called Humorism, if the body had too much or too little of a humor it could cause sickness. Black bile was also called melancholy, which simply means "black bile." An excess of melancholy was believed to cause depression. Though the theory of Humorism has since died out, the word MELANCHOLHY still lives on in our language



Matthew is a senior this year at North Cobb. He was in the first Autism Unit class for Cobb County at Bullard Elementary. He is now in the MID class at North Cobb. This Summer was in the EYES program at the Tommy Nobis Center.

My boys are my heroes, and I am by no means a perfect dad. I have made lots of mistakes, but they have taught me to never put limits on them. COBB SCHOOLS ADDING ONLINE LEARNING PROGRAMS FOR THE SECOND SEMESTER

Superintendent Chris Ragsdale announced during the Cobb Schools Board of Education meeting that families will once again have an opportunity to choose the learning environment that best supports the needs of their student(s).

Later this fall, Cobb families will be able to apply for expanded openings in the Cobb Online Learning Academy and Elementary Virtual Program that will open in January, the start of the second semester of the 2020-2021 school year. Spots in the expanded online programs will be limited and will be awarded via a lottery system. More information about the expanded programs and how families can apply will be announced in the future. The lottery window will open mid-to-late October, and students will be selected through the lottery by mid-to-late November.

MASKS WILL REMAIN OPTIONAL IN COBB **COUNTY SCHOOLS**

"Masks are strongly encouraged, but they will remain optional at this time. When looking at school districts that have mask mandates in place, some districts have higher numbers than us, while some have lower numbers than us. Mandatory masking is not without a cost. We recognize that there are negative impacts to school-age children properly wearing a mask during the duration of the school day. The data analysis is obviously very complex during this pandemic.

We have made a continuous effort to allow families to have a choice, both in the type of instruction, whether it be face to face or virtual, and in the decision about what is best for their families in regards to masks. We have also encouraged vaccinations but believe it's also a personal choice for each employee, student, and family to make based on their individual situation. At this time, I do not believe it is appropriate to mandate either decision, which would remove the ability for each family to make the best decision for them as a family,' said Superintendent Chris Ragsdale.


ANNUAL SCARECROWS IN THE SQUARE CONTEST

RESIDENTS OF THE KENNESAW CITY CEMETERY BY ANDREW BRAMLETT

In my last article about the Kennesaw City Cemetery, I briefly mentioned Lucius Summers, the cemetery's first known burial. Lucius' parents, Thomas and Casandra Tomlinson Summers, were living in North Carolina when they married in 1837. They soon moved to Georgia, and their first son, Alvan Summers, was born in 1838. The Summers family moved to Kennesaw before 1840 and settled south of what is now Kennesaw. Thomas and Casandra would have at least 13 children.

The youngest of the Summers children was born January 27, 1862. He was named Lucius B. Summers, and some sources say the B stood for "Bartow." On October 6, 1863, young Lucius passed away. For unknown reasons, he was buried in what is now the Kennesaw City Cemetery, becoming the cemetery's first known burial.

During the war, the Summers House and nearby Roberts Farm played a role in the fighting leading up to the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain. When Cassandra Summers passed away in 1875, she was buried near her son Lucius. Noted Atlanta historian Franklin Garrett, in a 1932 survey of the City Cemetery, misread her gravestone as "Casander Summers." The error was later replicated when her gravestone was replaced. Thomas eventually remarried, and when he died in 1883, he was also buried in what is

Thomas eventually remarried, and when he died in 1883, he was also buried in what is now the city cemetery. The Summers family is the namesake of Summers Street in Downtown Kennesaw. The Summers Family house was later owned by the Ellison family and was eventually demolished to make way for Cobb County International Airport – McCollum Field. The Georgia Historical Commission erected a marker to the house in 1954, which still stands across from the airport on Old 41.


