On Friday, September 10, 2021, Kennesaw's Chief William Westenberger was awarded the Public Safety Officer of the Year Award by the Cobb County Bar Association. Judge Manning nominated Chief Westenberger for his dedication to the local community and the Kennesaw Police Department.

Chief Westenberger has established a community advisory board with diverse representation from community. When significant incidents occur, the Chief has been available to hear the concerns of the community and address them. Chief Westenberger will take the time to explain the incident from the police point of view, explain our agency's practices and tell the board what our police officers learned from the incident. Community is at the forefront of our responsibility.

A few of the initiatives the Kennesaw Police Department participates in with our community include volunteering in the Summer Lunch Program with the YMCA, hosting a Citizen's Police Academy, gun safety courses and teaching our community about Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events (CRASE). For this year's Juneteenth celebration, the Kennesaw Police Department collaborated with local community leaders for the First Annual Kennesaw Juneteenth Celebration, One Community: A Celebration of Unity, complete with BBQ, tug of war, basketball, trivia and continuing an open dialogue with our community.

The Chief has also mandated that all officers have six months of Brazilian Jiu-Jitsu training,

in an effort to increase officer confidence in their ability to de-escalate situations.

MEET GASPARD CARRIE BY ANDREW J. BRAMLETT

Gaspard Theodore Carrie was born January 1, 1820, in South Carolina. He grew up in Augusta, Georgia, and in 1840 he moved to the community of Penfield. He married Lucy Angeline Blodgett in 1843 and together they has five children. Lucy died of pneumonia in 1851, six months after giving birth to twin girls. In 1853, G. T. Carrie married Jane Elizabeth Harris and they soon moved to Big Shanty,

now known as Kennesaw, Georgia.

During the 1850's, the Western and Atlantic Railroad was under construction between Atlanta and Chattanooga. They purchased a plot of land next to the railroad tracks from Gaspard Carrie and Lemuel Kendrick to build an eating establishment known as the Big Shanty Eating House, later referred to as the Lacy Hotel. According to family folklore, on the morning of April 12, 1862, Carrie's twin daughters were working at the hotel when the locomotive General was stolen during the Great Locomotive Chase.

While Carrie lived in Big Shanty, he was very active in the affairs of the community. After the Civil War he built a new eating establishment and for a while served as the manager. He was Postmaster from 1865 to 1868. Carrie held the office of Justice of the Peace, and he was known as Judge Carrie. He also gave the land for the Methodist Episcopal Church where he was a member. The church constructed on the site is today Apotheos

ANDREW BRAMLETT'S WHY WE SAY WHAT WE SAY..

For the past four years, I have written articles for the Bright Side News about the origins of common words and phrases. After 48 articles, I am transitioning into writing articles about residents of the Kennesaw City



Cemetery. For this final "Why We Say What We Say" article, I will be sharing the origins of words related to language.

The proper term for the study of the origin of words and phrases is ETYMOLGY. The word comes from the Greek word "etumologia," meaning "the study of finding true meaning [of a word]." Etymology would not be possible without LANGUAGE. The word LANGUAGE itself comes from the Latin word "lingua," meaning tongue. The word WORD is based on a similar German word meaning "speak." PHRASE is from Ancient Greek and means "way of speaking." SENTENCE originally comes from the Latin word "sentire", meaning "feel." This is also the origin of the word SENTIMENT. Over time, the word sentire became sentence, meaning an opinion or judgement, which is why we say a judge issues a sentence. Later the word sentence came to mean an opinion expressed in words, and it finally gained its current meaning in the 1400s.

I hope that while reading my articles you have learned more about "why we say what we say." All of my previous articles from this series can be found at my website, ajbramlett. com. I look forward to writing more about the cemetery, but this series will always have a special place in my heart. Thank you
