**COBB PUBLIC SAFETY HEROES HONORED** The Cobb Chamber honored Cobb County's finest Monday, October 4, during its annual Public Safety Appreciation Breakfast.

#### MEDAL OF VALOR

The Medal of Valor is the highest award recognizing an individual for an act of bravery in a life-threatening situation. The award is only presented when a deserving candidate is found. This year Officers David Cavender, John Pearson, Bryan Moore, Cobb County Police Department were honored with the Medal of Valor (Pictured above). Officers Cavender, Pearson and Moore are veteran members of the Cobb Police SWAT Team and K9 Unit.

On June 25, 2020, Cobb County Police officers responded to the area of Powers Ferry Road and Delk Road regarding a carjacking that had just occurred in a grocery parking lot. The victim reported that a male had brandished a knife and stole his Tesla vehicle. The suspect had arrived at the shopping center in a truck that he had earlier carjacked before fleeing in the Tesla. Cobb Police officers were able to locate the suspect and pursued him for several miles until the suspect abandoned the vehicle and fled on foot. He fired several rounds from a rifle at the pursuing officers, who took cover and lost sight of the suspect. Cobb Police SWAT Team officers David Cavender and John Pearson responded to nearby townhomes where residents had called 911 after observing the suspect entering their complex.

As they searched for the suspect in the residential area that had dozens of potential danger areas and hiding spots, the three officers utilized their tactical training to analyze the situation and make an effective plan to solve the crisis. Had they not changed their approach route to the suspect's location, the incident could have had fatal consequences for Officers Cavender, Pearson and Moore, as well as many other officers and dozens of civilians.

#### VIETNAM WAR VETERAN TO SPEAK

Former U. S. Army Capt. Edward H. "Rusty" Hightower of Kennesaw will be the special guest speaker at the Save Acworth History Foundation Lecture Series on Tuesday November 9th at 7:00 pm. Admission is free and open to the public and will take place in council chambers at Acworth City Hall, 4415 Center Street in Acworth.

Capt. Hightower is a 1966 graduate of the University of North Georgia where he was commissioned as a 2nd. Lt. in the U.S. Army. During his deployment to Vietnam in 1969, now Capt. Hightower distinguished himself while taking control as commander after his battalion leaders were killed. Despite being wounded, he maneuvered through enemy fire, inspiring his comrades by his courageous leadership, and evacuating the wounded and dead. His actions resulted in the saving of many lives of his fellow soldiers and allies. For his valor in battle, Capt. Hightower was awarded the Silver Star, Vietnam Gallantry Cross with Bronze Star and Purple Heart, among other decorations.

In 2020 Capt. Hightower was inducted into the Georgia Military Veteran's Hall of Fame. His framed photo is prominently displayed on the Heroes Wall of the Floyd Building in the State Capitol complex in Atlanta.

Hightower also served in the Georgia State Defense Force, retiring as Chief of Staff in 2020 after 30 years of service. He was promoted to Brigadier General at retirement. In civilian life Hightower was a teacher and coach at Harrison High School in Kennesaw.

a change in some of his classmates in class because they were stressed with Covid. His grandfather passed a year ago and he watched the stress of his grandmother, father and uncles

He watched some of his favorite athletes like Simone Biles and Naomi Osaka deal with the stress in their lives and how it affected their sport.

As a result Talari created rubber band bracelets and called them "Snap It" bracelets. When you wear the bracelets you are acknowledging that mental health matters. When you become stressed or anxious you are to "snap it" to remember to breathe deeply and take an minute.

Takari was team leader of Team Tatum a virtual walk October 9th for NAMI (National Alliance for Mental Illness) and as of this date has raised almost \$600.00 for the cause. He has also handed out over 500 bracelets all over the country. His bracelets can be seen in Georgia, New York, North Carolina, South Carolina, Mississippi, Virginia and Washington, D.C.

ANDREW BRAMLETT'S **RESIDENTS OF THE KENNESAW CEMETERY** 

In honor of Veterans Day, I wanted to share the story of one of the soldiers who resides in the Kennesaw City Cemetery. Charlie Brown was born March 22, 1891, in Kennesaw. His



parents were John Henry and Etta Brown, who are buried in the cemetery as well. According to Charlie's gravestone, he spent seven years in the military including twenty-seven months in Europe during World War I.

According to the April 24, 1919 Cobb County Times, Brown was one of the first 25,000 men to be sent to Europe. He was a Master Supply Sergeant in the 18th Regiment of the First Infantry Division.

Brown's division saw some of the heaviest fighting in France, and after the war his division was a part of the occupying force in Germany. Brown returned to the United States around September of 1919 and according to a later edition of the Marietta Journal he was the most decorated soldier from Cobb County

Brown continued to serve in the Army and was stationed at Fort Zachary Taylor outside Louisville, Kentucky. He married Monta Boyles in Indiana on April 20, 1920. Unfortunately, a few months later Charlie Brown contracted tuberculosis. He spent some time in late 1920 in a North Carolina hospital but passed away on January 4, 1921. His gravestone is inscribed with a list of the many battles he participated in during the war.

DANIEL WOOD IS PUBLIC SAFTEY EMPLOYEE OF THE YEAR - CONGRATULATIONS

Congratulations to Detective Daniel Wood for being awarded the Public Safety Employee of the Year award at the Cobb Chamber's Public Safety Appreciation Breakfast held on Monday, October 4, 2021. On February 11, 2021, Detective Wood observed a 17-car pileup on I-75N. Wood was traveling south and immediately stopped. He exited his vehicle and jumped over the concrete barriers that separated the interstate lanes. Of the 17 vehicles, 7 were tractor trailers, one of which had crashed into a car hauler entrapping the driver. Simultaneously, a fire had started in two other vehicles which quickly spread to the tractor trailer. Other motorists assisted by providing extinguishers which he utilized in fighting the fires. Detective Wood continued helping motorists get clear from their vehicles and evacuate the area. Wood recognized a nearby wrecked truck with two 50-gallon drums of oil on-board. Recognizing the potential of ignition/explosion, he had another truck push the danger away. He was able to keep dispatchers aware of conditions providing information for arriving responders. Detective Wood is a true embodiment of bravery, compassion and leadership!

#### NATURAL WAYS TO **DEAL WITH STRESS DURING THE HOLIDAYS** BY PATTY WALLENBURG, OWNER OAK SANCTUARY

The holidays bring up all kinds of stressors for us: too much to do, family issues, gifts to buy, coordinating and pleasing everyone. It is exhausting and many of us would love to just hide until they are over.

Your breath is one of your best tools for calming anxiety and mood. The simple act of slowing your breath and breathing in and out for the same amount of time has a quieting effect on the mind. Deep cleansing breaths will also help calm you down. Most people breathe quickly and use only the upper part of the lungs and that causes even more stress.

Meditation is also a great way to relieve stress and reduce blood pressure. There are so many different ways to meditate so explore a few and see which one you like best. Just sitting still for a few minutes is a great way to start. It causes you to pay attention to where your mind is running off to and calm down so that you can begin fresh. You can also meditate by repeating a phrase that has meaning for you: I am calm. I am relaxed. I've got this. I am at peace. Anything similar will help you to relax and reduce your anxiety. #### **LEGAL INSURANCE-IS IT WORTH IT?**

It is becoming more common for employers to offer "legal insurance" plans as a benefit for their employees. But just like health and auto insurance plans, not all legal insurance plans are created equally. For either employer-sponsored or private legal plans, consumers need to look at the details of these plans to determine whether they are worth paying for.

Legal insurance plans, often known as prepaid legal plans, cover one's legal expenses, if the need arises, for a low monthly fee. Most plans offer access to "provider attorneys," who agree to provide certain types of attorney services for flat pre-negotiated rates paid by the company directly to the attorney, or at a discounted hourly rate (generally 25% less than their normal fees) paid by the client to the attorney. Some plans offer extended coverage for spouses and dependents.

Often these plans are useful for smaller legal matters like handling traffic citations, landlord/tenant issues, minor business disputes; or non-contested matters like preparing estate planning documents or contracts. However, exceptions to coverage can leave one still responsible for large legal bills. Matters such as contested divorce, DUI or other criminal charges, bankruptcy, or civil litigation are frequently excluded, as are court costs, fines, and fees for notaries, documents, expert witnesses, or court reporters. There may be caps on coverage by dollar amount or attorney hours expended.

Before signing up for a plan, look at whether it makes sense to pay the plan's monthly fee or save that money in a legal emergency fund. Be sure to read the coverages and exclusions information carefully, check whether there are waiting times or deductibles required, find out how and when the policy can be cancelled, and don't be afraid to ask questions. Ultimately, whether legal insurance plans are worthwhile depends on the fine print as well as one's ability to pay for representation if a legal matter arises.
