ANDREW BRAMLETT'S RESIDENTS OF THE KENNESAW CEMETERY

Susie Stegall Susie Cox was born on October 26, 1896, in the Kennesaw area. Her parents were Albert and Susan Cox and she had three brothers and four sisters. Susie was married to E.C.



Stegall on July 17, 1919. She was a music teacher for about fifty years and would have as many as 25 individual students at a time.

Susie was a member of the First Baptist Church of Kennesaw and played the piano at the church for many years. For at least forty years she arranged to have the flowers placed on the alter each week. Most of the flowers were grown in her own yard. Susie always took the time to grow

Susie always took the time to grow vegetables in her garden. She kept a few for herself and then shared the rest with people in the community. Susie was also a correspondent for the Marietta Daily Journal for about 40 years. She would write about the local happenings in Kennesaw.

According to the October 21st, 1964 Marietta Daily Journal, Susie was very modest. She once said, "I have never done anything outstanding in my life." The people of Kennesaw disagreed and considered her a very important part of the town. On October 25, 1964, they held "Susie Stegall Appreciation Day" in the Council Room at City Hall. Susie passed away on May 26, 1974.

2021 NANCY MAXWELL AWARD WINNERS: **CLAUDE AND WILLIE MAE JOHNSON**

The Nancy Maxwell Award was created by the Save Acworth History Foundation to honor persons who have made a significant contribution to preserving the proud heritage and rich history of the Acworth community. The first recipient of the awardin 2020 was Nancy Smith Maxwell.

Willie Mae Brown Johnson was born February 27, 1938 in Marietta, the daughter of John Emory Brown, Sr. and Annie Lou Furr Brown. After the loss of her parents Willie Mae moved to Acworth at the age of eight and was raised by her grandparents, William Cicero "Uncle Bud" Furr and Lizzie Furr.At the age of thirteen, she joined Zion Hill Missionary Baptist Church. She completed the Acworth Rosenwald Elementary School and continued her education at Lemon Street High School in Marietta. She later did domestic work as well as working at the Rothschild Mill and Coats & Clark Thread Mill.

Claude Johnson was born June 15, 1936 in the Mars Hill community, the son of Joe Johnson and Frances Hardin Johnson. He joined Bethel AME Church at an early age. He attended the Acworth Rosenwald Elementary School, walking to school each day from Mars Hill. He completed the course of study in Acworth and went to work on the farm at the age of fifteen. Claude went to work for ARA Food Service at Lockheed from 1953 to 1971 and then at Hewlett-Packard until his retirement in 2000.

Both have been very active in the community and their church and are affectionately known as the Mayor and First Lady of Logan Farm Park. Scores of Acworth residents traverse Taylor Street just to have the opportunity to share a friendly wave with Claude and Willie Mae.

Willie Mae served as vice-president of the PTA at Robert's Elementary School. She was the Event Coordinator for the Carrie Dyer Woman's Club and a Hostess at the Governor's Mansion during Gov. Perdue's administration. At Zion Hill Missionary Baptist Church she has taught Sunday School, served as President of the Youth Choir and been a member of the Adult Choir and Senior Choir. She serves on the Mother Board at Zion Hill. She has coordinated flowers for special occasions and funerals at the church and prepared the Communion Table for services.

Claude organized and coached the first African-American youth baseball team in the early 1960s. With the aide of his wife, they transported team members to and from Coats and Clark Field to surrounding cities for games and practices, supplied the uniforms and covered team expenses. Along with Willie Mae, he cleaned Zion Hill church inside and out for many years. He drove the church van every Sunday to pick up members for services. He has been a member of the Adult and Senior Choirs and has been a member of the Trustee Board and Deacon Board for over 30 years.
