
INAUGURAL GEORGIA FOOD + WINE FESTIVAL

Parents/guardians of a student zoned to attend a District school may apply for an HB 251 transfer in accordance with Georgia's Quality Basic Education Act and District Administrative Rule JBCD-R in order to pursue a transfer to another District school.

Available space at a school is based on permanent classroom space. In the event that the number of transfer requests exceeds the available capacity of a school, the District will conduct a random lottery.

Jesse is a City of Acworth Power Department employee for more than 15 years. He is a 35-year-old husband, father of two girls, and provider for his family. In June of 2021 Jesse's 9-year-old daughter, Nieva, was diagnosed with bone cancer in her left leg. Research on how to stop her cancer started right away, and by July she was admitted for an experimental surgery to replace her tibia. The surgery was successful, and now Nieva must go through chemotherapy and regular procedures to "grow" her prosthetic bone. In August 2021, Jesse's wife, Diana, gave birth to their second child. After baby Raya's birth, and due to complications from a previous diagnosis with cancer, Diana started going into kidney failure. After being admitted to the hospital, Diana checked herself out and delayed treatment to be available for her daughters. The family has continued to go through serious health issues.

ANDREW BRAMLETT'S **RESIDENTS OF THE KENNESAW CEMETERY**

LUTHER CHALKER

Luther Chalker was born March 17, 1888, near where Kennesaw State University is today. His family were farmers and he originally attended school in a two-room



building in Kennesaw. He was one of the few in his family that was able to further his education as he attended the Macland School of Agriculture and Mechanical Arts that was located roughly where McEachern High School is located today. Chalker married Bertha Gilham on

December 25, 1918. He was a teacher and farmer in his early years and later became the cashier for the Kennesaw State Bank. In 1920 he donated property on Shiloh Road for a school that was known as Chalker School. He was a teacher there for a time in addition to teaching at a few other one-room schools nearby. The Chalker School building is still standing and is a part of the Wildwood Baptist Church.

Chalker believed in helping other members of the community and he decided to enter politics. He served as mayor of Kennesaw from 1931 to 1945. Some of his accomplishments while in office were helping to raise money to replace the Kennesaw Elementary School building after it burned in 1938 and he was involved with the purchase of the land that became Adams Park

In 1934 and again in 1948, Chalker purchased plots of land that had been used for burials that were next to the cemetery. These plots were later both deeded to the city to be added to the cemetery and are located near the gazebo. Today, this land is known as the Chalker section.

Because of his focus on helping the community, Chalker Elementary School was named in his honor when it opened in 1997. Luther Chalker died on December 30, 1975.





For Instance ...did you know that the building the Art House is in is believed to be the site of the first African American owned business in the city? Now home to the Acworth Arts Alliance, Acworth is proud to have this historic building preserved while serving a new purpose in bringing the Arts to Acworth. Right across Cherokee Street, Doyal Hill Park commemorates Acworth's first African American Alderman. Nestled within this park is the Rosenwald School Community Center built in the 1920's during segregation in the south. This historic school is one of just a few of these schools left in the entire country. Don't forget, the Depot History Center on Main Street serves as a wonderful resource for learning more about Acworth's heritage. Be sure to stop by



next time you're downtown to listen to the oral history series that the Save Acworth History Foundation has worked so hard to create for citizens and visitors alike.








FREE TREES - MARCH 5!

COBB COUNTY LOCAL COURTS IN A NUTSHELL BY DANIELE JOHNSON, ATTORNEY AT LAW

Cobb County has six trial-level courts, all of which have distinct roles from each other. Those courts are Superior, State, Juvenile, Probate, Magistrate, and Municipal.



The Superior Court has exclusive jurisdiction over family law matters, such as, divorce, child custody and child support. Superior Court also has exclusive jurisdiction over felony crimes, including homicide, rape, and aggravated assault.

Secondly, we have State Court, which handles civil actions not otherwise within the exclusive jurisdiction of Superior Court, including land-lord tenant disputes, certain traffic cases and personal injury cases. Further, State Court has exclusive jurisdiction of misdemeanor crimes, such as, simple assault, criminal trespass, and disorderly conduct. Next, we have our Juvenile Court. If a child does not have

biological parent willing and capable of providing a stable home-environment, Juvenile Court will place the child in a proper home. Juvenile Court also hears cases involving allegations of unruly conduct, delinquency, or traffic violations concerning children under the age of seventeen.

The primary function of Probate Court is to ensure that estates are administered in accordance with one's will or intestate laws. Probate Court also hears guardianship cases involving children and adults.

Magistrate Court has jurisdiction over civil claims of \$15,000 or less, county ordinance violations, applications for and issuance of arrest and search warrants. In an attempt to relieve Superior Court's docket, Cobb County Magistrate Court will also hear cases involving temporary retraining orders.

Finally, we have our Municipal Court system. These city-level courts have jurisdiction over traffic cases arising within the city limits. Municipal Courts also have limited jurisdiction over minor misdemeanor offenses, such as shoplifting of \$500 or less and minor traffic violations

And that is your Cobb County Court system in a nutshell.
