

### **BIG SHANTY FESTIVAL HISTORY**

In 1975, merchants in the downtown area of Kennesaw created a business organization that would promote and preserve the historical heritage of the downtown area of Kennesaw and encourage people to patronize their businesses. Thus the Kennesaw Business Association was chartered. The General at the Big Shanty Museum (original name) was the focal point of the City's heritage.

Town Center wasn't even a gleam in anyone's eye then — the area was still being farmed. I-75 stopped in Marietta and resumed in Cartersville, and Highway 41 (now Cobb Parkway) was dotted with Stuckey's, quilts, and boiled peanuts.

The idea started with Gayle DeSpain, Lynda Spence, Carol Thompson and Jean Guess, all local business women and members of the KBA. In discussing ways to bring new people



and business into Kennesaw, they planned a spring outdoor sale in an open area between their shops on Main Street, with the hopes of attracting customers with a colorful display of antiques and craft items."

Dr. Frank Boone, President in 1975, suggested that their plans be sponsored on a larger scale by the business association and supported by the City of Kennesaw (he was a Councilman too). Thus the first Festival was born. Originally known as Trade Days, that first Spring, 36 booth spaces were set up. In 1977, Festival Chairman, the late Dent Myers, added a civil war battle reenactment and over 10,000 people attended the Spring event.

The rest is history, with the sponsorship of the KBA and the active support of the City of Kennesaw, the Festival has spread from the front lawn of By-Gone Treasures to encompass the lawn of the Museum, the Depot Parking lot, line the streets of J. O. Stephenson Ave and Main St.. and fill the parking areas at City Hall. Over 250 booths have been sold for this year's festival — I don't think any of us who were involved in the planning of the first event ever envisioned how large and successful it would grow..



#### SOUTHERN MUSEUM OF CIVIL WAR & LOCOMOTIVE HISTORY CELEBRATES 50TH ANNIVERSARY

The Southern Museum opened fifty years ago on April 12, 1972, in historic downtown Kennesaw, Georgia. Originally called the Big Shanty Museum, it showcased the famous General locomotive and was dedicated to telling the story of the Great Locomotive Chase. The event, which took place 110 years earlier on April 12, 1862, elevated the engine and Big Shanty (today the City of Kennesaw) to prominence during the Civil War.

Over the next fifty years, the Museum grew in size and expanded its collection to include other artifacts from the Civil War period and railroading in the Southeast. In the mid-1990s, the Museum acquired and curated an impressive collection from the Glover Machine Works of Marietta, Georgia, the last builder of steam locomotives in the South. The name was changed to the Kennesaw Civil War Museum soon thereafter. Beginning in 2001, a two-year renovation and enlargement project culminated in a nearly 50,000 square foot facility housing three permanent exhibits: Railroads: Lifelines of the Civil War, Glover Machine Works: Casting a New South and The Great Locomotive Chase featuring the General locomotive. The name was changed, yet again, to the Southern Museum of Civil War and Locomotive History.

The Museum expanded further in 2007 with the opening of the Jolley Education Center. The 8,000 square foot facility offers classroom space for programs and a dedicated area for the very young to play safely alongside older children. The Jolley Education Center also houses Georgia's Merci Boxcar, a gift from the French people to the state of Georgia following World War II. The Southern Museum's Library and Archives, which opened to the public in 2015, contains extensive documentary records, manuscripts and photographic materials related to the Civil War and railroad history in the South.

Today, the Southern Museum is a prestigious Smithsonian Affiliations member devoted to history and education. The Museum provides a family-friendly experience that fosters conversation about the strategic and economic use of railroads in the region during and after the Civil War.

This year's theme is "45 Years of Empowerment." Tommy Nobis Center will look back at its rich history of serving the community and celebrate the thousands of people whose lives have been changed by their programs and services over the years.

"We look forward to a meaningful event

commemorating an incredible four and half decades of empowering people with disabilities and their families," said President & CEO Dave Ward.

Honorees include former Atlanta Falcons Coach Dan Reeves for Lifetime Achievement, Community Champion Jim Budzinski, Family Member Advocates Marlon and Libby Longacre, and Tommy Nobis Rising Star Clarence Wine.

### ANDREW BRAMLETT'S **RESIDENTS OF THE KENNESAW CEMETERY**

Charlie Jackson Guess was born in Kennesaw on Christmas Day of 1893. His parents were Murat and Mary Guess. He attended school until 8th grade. Guess had an early interest in mechanics, and once created a



miniature steam locomotive out of tin cans. By 1917, he was working as an Auto Mechanic. He registered for the WWI draft and was inducted on June 21st, 1918. Guess served at Camp Gordon and Fort McPherson as a mechanic. He served overseas from September 14th of 1918 to July 11th of 1919. During his time overseas the Cobb County Times described him as both musical and a mechanical genius.

On July 21st, 1919, Guess was honorably discharged. He returned home and purchased a garage. By 1920 he had moved to Atlanta, but he soon moved back to Cobb County. In 1923, he married Lura Ellis. By 1930, he was working as an Assistant Foreman with the railroad. He later served as mechanic. During the 1940's, Guess served as a city councilman, and he was reelected at least 14 times.

His wife Lura died in 1965. Charlie Guess passed away April 20th, 1971, in Chattanooga and was buried in the Kennesaw City Cemetery.

### SMITH-GILBERT GARDENS RECOGNIZED AS CAMELLIA TRAIL GARDEN

On Thursday, March 17, the American Camellia Society (ACS) recognized Smith-Gilbert Gardens as a Camellia Trail Garden. This national recognition reflects a partnership the ACS has with public gardens who hold notable camellia collections located across the country. Along with a Trail Marker, a Certificate of Recognition was presented.

The American Camellia Society representatives joined Smith-Gilbert Gardens staff, Kennesaw elected officials, City staff and SGG Foundation Board Members to recognize the Paladino Camellia Garden at Smith-Gilbert Gardens as a destination garden on the Camellia Trail.

Smith-Gilbert Gardens has 94 camellia plants in the collection with four different species of camellias represented, including an evergreen camellia called Camellia sinensis, also known as the tea plant. Visitors will find camellias throughout the Garden, but the majority of the collection can be found in the Paladino Camellia Garden

This naturally occurring sport (a mutation) was recently certified as a new cultivar. 



### **AFTER 40 YEARS, JUDGE MARY STALEY CLARK STEPS OFF THE BENCH**

Judge Mary Staley Clark, who has served as a Cobb County judge since 1982, has announced her retirement. Her last day will be May 1,2022.

"It will take time to adjust to not being on the bench every day. Of course, I'll continue to help as a senior judge, but I am looking forward to getting married this spring and being able to spend more time with my parents and family," Judge Staley Clark said. She was elected to the Superior Court bench in

1992 and served as Chief Judge from 2005 to 2007. An advocate and pioneer of accountability courts, she helped create Cobb's Mental Health Court in 2013, and she now presides over Cobb's Drug Treatment Court. She has practiced law since 1978, when she earned her Juris Doctor at the University of Georgia and went to work as a criminal prosecutor under District Attorney Thomas Charron.

Before joining Superior Court, she was elected to Magistrate Court in 1982 and then to Division I of State

Court in 1984. Judge Staley Clark was elected, without opposition, to every position she ever held and was the first female initially elected to any judgeship in Cobb County. "She has been a leader in promoting accountability courts," Schuster said. "Judge Staley

Clark realized there was a better way to treat those with illness than incarceration. She saved many lives and returned many in our population to be good citizens.'

Throughout her tenure, Judge Staley Clark has been equally active outside the courtroom. She was a member of the 1996 Class of Leadership Georgia, and she co-authored a volume of Georgia Jurisprudence on family law. Judge Staley Clark was also instrumental in establishing Cobb's Family Law Workshop, a free monthly seminar for self-represented litigants.

From 2014 to 2015, she served as president of both the Kiwanis Club of Marietta and the Council of Superior Court Judges of Georgia, which sets rules for the hundreds of judges the Council of Superior Court Judges of Georgia, which sets rules for the number of Judges that sit in the state's 50 judicial circuits. Judge Staley Clark also served as an officer on the Council of Accountability Court Judges until this year. Chief Judge Rob Leonard said Judge Staley Clark is irreplaceable. "As Chief Judge, I've relied upon her wisdom and depth of experience on many occasions. She will certainly be missed by averyone, and Llock forward to be ining our group of distinguished Senior

be missed by everyone, and I look forward to her joining our group of distinguished Senior Judges following her appointment by the Governor.

They put me on the path I've been so blessed to travel these 40 years," she said. "And, of course, my late husband, Chuck Clark, was a great source of strength, love, and support." "I am thankful for the vision and courage Tom Charron showed in hiring female prosecutors for the first time in the office's history, and I am thankful that the Mental Health Court and Drug Treatment Court helped people live better lives." "And, I am thankful for the wonderful Cobb community that gave me the privilege to serve as a judge and administer justice these many years. Cobb is a wonderful place with the best bench in Georgia."







#### **CALLED TO BLESS (PART ONE)** BY MARLON LONGACRE, ASSOCIATE PASTOR, PIEDMONT CHURCH **CALLED TO BLESS**

We are looking at the five callings of your life. The five purposes of your life. The five reasons God created you. The five assignments that he has for your life. The word "calling" is used more than the word "purpose" in the Bible. Over the past few weeks Ike and Daniel have talked about the callings on your life. We looked at God's first calling in your life – you're called to be loved. God made you to love you. The second calling is you're called to belong – to belong to his family, the body of Christ, the family of God. Last week we looked at your third calling up to graph up to graph up to graph up to graph up to graph.

 you're called to become. God wants you to grow up, he wants you to mature, he wants you to become who he wants you to be. The whole reason why we exist is because God wanted a family.
This phrase, "God's call", I used to think it was a special thing for people like missionaries were called or priests were called of God or pastors, or nuns had the call, that it was some kind of special thing. thing. You're walking down the street one day and you're zapped and you are "called by God -- from now on I must serve Him with all my life."

But the fact is, the Bible says every Christian is called. The Bible says the call to salvation and the call to service are identical. The moment you signed up and said, "Yes, I want to go to heaven and I want to have my sins forgiven" you also said, "And I'm willing to serve You the rest of my life." The Bible says every Christian is called to serve; every member of God's family is a minister. Not everybody's a pastor. But a minister. What's a minister? A servant. What's a servant? Somebody who serves. Anytime you use your abilities to help other people in the name of Jesus, you're ministering to them. The Bible says I've been called to serve. Every Christian is called to serve. A non-serving Christian is a contradiction.

Today I want to focus on the fourth calling on your life and it is You are called to bless. You are

called to bless other people. How do you do that? You bless others by serving them. There are so many ways to serve others. It may be physical assistance. It may be financial assistance. It may be emotional support. It could be relational support. Countless ways to serve others.

I want you to write this down in notes. The fourth purpose of my life is God SHAPED me to serve him.

#### **S- SPIRITUAL GIFTS**

Supernatural abilities that God gives you the moment you become a believer in order to fulfill His purpose in your life. God gives you specific talents, multiple spiritual gifts the moment you become a believer. Many of you don't even know you've got spiritual gifts. You've never unwrapped them but you have them. He gives you these spiritual abilities the moment you become a believer.

But I need to be honest with you. Some of you don't have any spiritual gifts. You're not believers yet. You haven't stepped across the line. You haven't established that relationship to God through Jesus Christ. But the moment you do, you will be given those spiritual gifts, which are abilities to help you fulfil your purpose in life. Every Christian has at least one. H- HEART

This is your motivations, your interests, your core passions, the things that "turn your crank." Have you noticed that some things really interest you and other things bore you to tears? Have you noticed that some things really turn you on, really get you excited, and others you couldn't care less about? Where do you think you got your innate interest? God gave them to you. God gave you your heart, the things that really interest you, that cause you to get passionate. Why did He do that? Because He wants you to be you. A-ABILITIES

Those are the natural abilities you were given the moment you were born. And everybody has some natural abilities. Some of you are really good at numbers. I was really good at math until they started putting letters besides the numbers. I lost my heart for math after that. Some of you are good with words. Some of you are good with people; some of you are not so good with people. Some of you are really good with animals. Some of you have natural athletic ability. Some people have mechanical abilities the ability to werk with mechanics. I don't have one owned of mechanical ability in my head. abilities, the ability to work with machines. I don't have one ounce of mechanical ability in my body. I have shared with you many times that Libby puts things together in our house. I came home the other day and she was fixing the chain on the toilet. Some of you have musical abilities – you pick up an instrument and in a few days you're playing the thing. Some of you have great voices and you can sing. Others of you are prison singers – you're always behind a few bars and never have the right key. **P-PERSONALITY** 

God shapes you by giving you unique personality. And some of your personalities are very unique. God loves variety; you've probably figured that out by now.

For instance when you go swimming do you like to plunge right in or do you like to test the water and wade in? Typically plungers marry waders. How many of you would say, "I love to be organized!" How many of you would say, "Organization cramps my style"? That's me! How many of you would say, "I really like routine. I like things to be set up, a system." How many of you would say, "I like things to be different." It's not right or wrong. We're just different. The point is that God uses different personalities to get all the work done in the world.

#### **E-EXPERIENCE**

Obviously God gives us lots of different kinds of experiences. There are vocational experiences. Jobs that we have had in the past that shape our lives. There educational experiences. The things you learned at through schools and seminars. There are spiritual experiences. Things at church, camps, retreats, tapes, quiet times. Relational experiences. Painful experiences. God never wastes a hurt. Sometimes your greatest ministry comes out of your pain, your tragedy, your failure your mistakes.

Since its inception in 2010, the Foundation has contributed to the creation, upgrades, and maintenance of the skate park, creation of the splash pad, addition of shade structures, and tree planting. Notably, in January 2020, the Foundation donated \$100,000 for the Inclusive Playground addition, a project championed by the Foundation and presented to the City in 2018

The Foundation's main fundraiser is the Swift-Cantrell Classic 5K run, held annually in May. Known as the "May Day Race for More Play Space," this year's race will take place on May 14, 2022. The race is a qualifier for the Peachtree Road Race and is the lead race in Kennesaw's Grand Prix race series

Other fundraising opportunities include Memorial Tree Plantings at the Park, Buy-A-Brick from the Old Kennesaw Schoolhouse, t-shirt sales, corporate grants, and partnerships and sponsorships with local businesses. The Board also participates in the Big Shanty, Pigs & Peaches, and Taste of Kennesaw festivals to bring awareness to both the Swift-Cantrell Park Foundation and Park.



### LOCAL HISTORIAN, MICHAEL K. SHAFFER'S DAILY ACCOUNTING

Until now, a daily account (1,630 days) of Georgia's social, political, economic, and military events during the Civil War did not exist. Each daily entry derives from a quill scrolling the parchment or a press imprinting type on the day the activity occurred. With this effort, historian Michael K. Shaffer strikes a balance between the combatants while remembering the struggles of enslaved persons, folks on the home front, and merchants and clergy attempting to maintain some sense of normalcy. As such, this work will become the standard reference book for those studying the Civil War in Georgia.

Michael K. Shaffer is a Civil War historian, instructor, lecturer, newspaper columnist, and author. He is a member of the Society of Civil War Historians, Historians of the Civil War Western Theater, and the Georgia Association of Historians. Shaffer teaches Civil War courses at Kennesaw State University's College of Graduate and Professional Education and at Emory University.

I like to walk a labyrinth with no shoes. The Spa at Dahlonega has a wonderful one on their property too. They are always planting new flowers and plants around the edges.
