ANDREW BRAMLETT'S

RESIDENTS OF THE KENNESAW CEMETERY

Elmon Reece Wooten was born on November 13, 1896, in Chattanooga, though both his parents were from Georgia. He attended school until eighth grade, and later by 1918 he was living in Cherokee County,



Georgia. He married Ethel Thompson, who went by Mae, around this time. On August 26, 1918, he was inducted in the military for WWI. He did not serve overseas and was honorably discharged on December 20, 1918.

Around 1920, Elmon and his wife moved to Kennesaw. In 1934 they purchased a house on Main Street which still stands today. Elmon became a prominent citizen of our community and worked as a merchant. In 1940, he was elected to the Cobb Board of Education. He was also involved with the Cobb Conservation Club. In 1941, Wooten began construction of a lake on his farm. It was finished in 1943 and became known as Wooten Lake. The lake soon became well known for its fishing.

In the late 1940s, Wooten became involved with the local masonic lodge. In 1946, he constructed a building in Downtown Kennesaw for his store. The building is best remembered as the home of the Whistle Stop Café. From 1950 to 1956, he served on the Kennesaw City Council. Elmon Wooten passed away on February 25, 1961.



HARRISON HS GIFTED TWO GOLF TRAINING SIMULATORS

Harrison's golf teams have a storied history. The boy's team has been to the state tournament every year since the Hoya program began in 1992. The girl's team started a couple of years after the boys, but they also have never missed a state appearance. Golf and success seem to go hand-in-hand at Harrison.

That success looks to be continuing at the school thanks to a generous donation of two training simulators to the Hoya program. The two machines sit side-by-side in the golf room inviting players to practice whenever they like, even if the weather outside is wet and dangerous.

"We have had a connection to the school since 2018," said Adam Blank. "Our daughter, Haven, has been playing golf with me since she was 7, and for Harrison for four years. We recognized a need and decided we could help."

The Blank family donated the simulators several months ago and the Hoya golf team has been using them almost daily ever since. It has allowed the teams to get swings in despite what is happening outside. The simulators also provide tons of information on each swing that players can use to improve their game.

players can use to improve their game.

"They give us unreal data feedback," said head coach Travis Farmer. "Ball speed, club speed, spin rate, accurate distances, just to name a few. All of that data helps the players to identify and adjust their swing path and putting technique."

Harrison is one of only three schools in the District to have a simulator and the only one with two. "It is so convenient to have them right here at the school," said senior Haven Blank. "We don't have to travel to the course or the range. The simulators give you so much information. It has really helped with getting my distances right and helped me improve overall."

The Kennesaw Police Department and its Citizen's Advisory Board is pleased to announce that Juneteenth 2022 will be celebrated again in the City of Kennesaw on Saturday, June 18, 2022 at Swift-Cantrell Park. The entire Kennesaw community is invited to join in family-friendly activities with food trucks, community vendors, bouncy houses, police and fire truck displays, entertainment and more from 11:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m.

This is the second annual Juneteenth celebration in Kennesaw. The event is a result of the Kennesaw Police Department, in partnership with a team of faith and community leaders, teaming up to celebrate the community, the diversity of the community, and unity with a family-friendly event.

Juneteenth is the most popular annual celebration of emancipation from slavery in the United States. Last year, Juneteenth became a federal holiday to be celebrated each year. The holiday was first celebrated in Texas, where on that date in 1865, in the aftermath of the Civil War, those who were enslaved were declared free under the terms of the 1862 Emancipation Proclamation.

The event is free to the public. Food truck vendors will be there selling food and drink.

The City of Acworth will hold a free concert from the Total Package Band.

MEET JUDGE LEONARD

Judge Leonard presently serves as the Chief Judge for the Cobb Judicial Circuit. He has served the citizens of Cobb County since his appointment to the bench in December of 2010. Through his service on the benches of both the State & Superior Courts of Cobb County, he has the unusual distinction of having been appointed by two different Governors and elected three times

Judge Leonard obtained his B.A. in Political Science from the University of Kentucky in 1997 and his J.D. degree from the University of Kentucky College of Law in 2000.

Prior to taking the bench, Judge Leonard maintained his Marietta law practice that he established in 2000, where he employed 11 people practicing primarily in criminal law and civil litigation. He practiced, primarily in Cobb County, but traveled all over Georgia, making almost daily court appearances during his years in practice. This led him to appear in front of approximately 100 different Judges in both the state and federal courts and has played a vital role in how Judge Leonard treats people and runs his courtroom.

As a member of the Council of Superior Court Judges, Judge Leonard serves on the following committees: Pattern Jury Instructions, Uniform Rules, Court Security, and Court Technology. He also Chairs the Automated Data Collection and Case Management Standards Subcommittee. He also serves as the Chairman of the Standing Committee on Judicial Workload Assessment for the Judicial Council of Georgia.

Judge Leonard served on the Board of Directors for the Tommy Nobis Center for 14 years, advocating to remove barriers and provide job training and placement for people with disabilities. He also served on the Board of the Leadership Cobb Alumni Association and is an alumnus of the Leadership Cobb Class of 2013. He is also a member of the 2022 Honorary Commanders class.

Judge Leonard and his wife live in Marietta. They have three children and three black labs.

Here is how Jesus said you could become great. "Matthew 20:26 reads "If you want to be great, you be a servant of all to others."

Let me ask you something. What are you going to be remembered for? If you were to die tomorrow would people say, that person was a real blessing? They were all about helping others. They served. They cared. They shared. They were generous. They were kind.

4 benefits that I want to share with you today about being a blessing to others.

#1 SERVING OTHERS WILL CREATE JOY IN YOUR LIFE

I remember the song by Johnny Lee in the movie Urban Cowboy. Look for love in all the wrong places. We not only look for love in the wrong places, but we also look for joy in all the wrong places as well.

You do not find happiness in the world's values of pleasures, possessions, and prestige. We want to have fun, have lots and toys and we want everyone to notice. None of those things brings satisfaction and none of those things last.

Permanent joy comes through service. By giving my life away. God wired us that way so that when you give your life away that is when joy flows through your heart. Why? Because He wants you to be like him.

LET ME GIVE YOU TWO SECRETS OF JOY.

•The first secret of joy is get the focus off your self. The more you focus on you, the more miserable you are going to be. You have got to shift your focus from an inward focus –(It's all about me) to an outward focus (It's about God and serving others.)

You were not put on this planet to live for you. You have got to give back. You have got to contribute. That is where joy comes from.

•The other way Joy comes is when you use your gifts to help others.

I love this verse. Philippians 2:4 "Forget about yourself long enough to lend a helping

Don't be too busy to volunteer - at church, at your child's school, at a non-profit that needs helping hands, at a hospital, - there are many ways to volunteer your time.





YOUNG ADULTS' LEGAL NEEDS BY ERIKA ORCUTT, ATTORNEY AT LAW

Graduation season is an exciting time for families and students alike, filled with celebrations, adventures, and transitions. Whether your graduate is headed to higher education, vocational training, travel, or a new career, this new season comes with new responsibilities, and your role legally

Once someone reaches age 18, a parent or legal guardian can no longer receive certain information, make financial or medical decisions, or access student college records, even in an emergency. It is

critical to get legal documents in place before a crisis occurs.

A durable general power of attorney will allow you to have access to and handle your adult child's financial affairs when s/he is unable to do so. For example, a power of attorney can allow you to communicate with financial institutions, deposit and withdraw money, and pay bills on his/her

An advance directive for healthcare is crucial to receive medical information and make medical decisions. When your child is a minor, you can legally obtain medical information, make appointments, and decide on treatments. But after age 18, you no longer have access to medical information or authority to make those decisions.

If your student is headed to college, be aware that under FERPA (Family Education Rights and Privacy Act), you will not have access to their academic or financial transcripts. Your child can sign a FERPA waiver, which grants you (or any other person listed) permission to view his/her academic and/or financial aid records. If your child is reluctant to "give up" their privacy rights, you can explain that the waiver can be used as a "safety net" to catch them if they start to fall academically, check for institutional errors, and not to micromanage him/her.

Although the new-found freedoms of being a young adult are likely ones your child has looked forward to for years, young adults still do rely heavily on their parents, guardians, and loved ones for guidance and support. Having the proper legal documents in place allows you to fully support your child especially in an emergency. Giving the gift of legal planning makes a wise and unique graduation wife tool.
