
ACWORTH'S JULY 4 TH CELEBRATION Let freedom ring! The City of Acworth and the Acworth Business Association are proud to present one of the largest fireworks extravaganzas in Metro Atlanta. This July 4th, live music and fireworks will once again take place at Cauble Park. Live music begins at 5:30 p.m. Fireworks will begin at approximately 9:30 p.m. (subject to change depending on weather). As tradition holds, there will be special tribute to all those men and women who have served in our Armed Forces at 7:45 p.m. Then our headliners "FLASHBACK" takes the stage at 8:00 p.m. This is the 21st year in a raw that Elaphage has been statistical at the second statisti

8:00 p.m. This is the 21st year in a row that Flashback has brought their energy to the Acworth state. Flashback takes you through decades of classics; from the best of Motown, Beach, and Disco, then all the way into Current Top Hits. The audience experiences an interactive and energetic performance while dancing to song after song!

This Party Band showcases phenomenal musicians, clever choreography, breathtaking vocals, and carefully chosen medleys of all your favorite songs. Each of the seasoned musicians in Flashback bring years of experience and unimaginable talent to the stage.

Admission to the event and concert is free! There will be food vendors on-site selling a variety of options beginning at noon. Tables are available to purchase for the July 4th concert. Online table purchases may be made at www.acworthparksandrecreation.org. Online table sales close Wednesday, June 23rd at 5:00. Tables may also be purchased in person at the Acworth Community Center through Saturday, June 26 at 2:00 p.m. Tables are \$50 each for City of Acworth residents and \$70 for non-residents. Table purchases include 6 chairs and one parking pass. This parking pass will grant access to park at Cauble Park if spots remain available. Parking at Cauble Park is by parking pass only on July 4th, but Cauble Park parking is not guaranteed with this pass. It is highly recommended to arrive early. Anyone parked at Cauble will not be permitted to leave once the fireworks have begun. Cars will be permitted to leave the park once the fireworks have concluded and the crowd has cleared out.

Those without a parking pass or if the parking is full will need to park downtown and walk down to the park. Shuttles will not be running for this event. Handicap parking will be available at McCall Primary School and there will be a shuttle provided for handicap attendees. Handicap shuttles begin at noon.

MARIETTA TO CELEBRATE JULY 4

Grab your American flag, put on your red, white and blue, and celebrate America's Independence July 4, from 10 a.m.-10 p.m. with an Independence Day parade and celebration on the Square presented by Superior Plumbing, free live concerts, arts and crafts show, food, carnival games and the City of Marietta fireworks finale. HOG DINNER

Ricky MacDonald will be honored on Tuesday June14 at North Star Church, 3413 Blue Springs Dr., Kennesaw. The event is dinner and is from 6:30 until 8:00 pm. No charge for dinner.

January 2018 was the first time we almost lost Ricky. By the time he got to the emergency room, he had lost 8 units of blood. His kidneys and liver had started shutting down and as we now know, the damage to his liver was irreversible. It's called cirrhosis.

In January, he was evaluated for the liver transplant and was told he would likely get his transplant in a matter of days or weeks. Three days later, he had a fever caused by a staph infection that ravaged his body and led to two weeks on a ventilator fighting for his life and 35 days in the hospital. He lost 40 pounds and is working on getting his strength back as he awaits his new liver.

The MacDonalds could use some help to offset medical and living expenses as they prepare for and recover from Ricky's liver transplant.

ANDREW BRAMLETT'S **RESIDENTS OF THE KENNESAW CEMETERY**

Luther P. Mathis was born March 19, 1876, in Forsyth County. Prior to 1910, he married a woman named Mary. According to the 1910 census, the family lived in Kennesaw where Mathis worked



as a farmer. By the 1920s they had moved to West Cobb, near the corner of Kennesaw Due West, Acworth Due West, and Due West Roads. The community went by several names: at one time it had been known as Due West, it is listed in the 1920 census as Red Rock, and the Marietta Journal referred to it as Dixon Schoolhouse.

Mathis worked in the casket industry, and according to his obituary he spent 51 years in the business. From 1920 until his death, he worked for the Atlanta Casket Company. By 1923, Mathis had moved back to Kennesaw from West Cobb. He served as Mayor of Kennesaw in 1930.

In October of 1932, Mathis and 5 other Kennesaw residents were in car traveling down what is now called Old 41 Highway. Near Kennesaw Mountain there was a heavy fog, and the car Mathis was in struck a truck head on. The other 5 occupants were treated for minor bruises, while the Atlanta paper reported Mathis was seriously injured and in a "semi-conscious" state. He survived the accident and returned to Kennesaw.

Luther P. Mathis passed away on September 2, 1941, at an Atlanta hospital. His funeral was held at the Methodist Church, where Mathis had been a member for 46 years. He was buried shortly afterwards in the Kennesaw City Cemetery.



A LOVE OF READING BLOSSOMS AT KENNESAW ELEMENTARY When school doors close for summer break, students near Kennesaw Elementary School

will still have access to books. Adding a little free library to the school campus has been a dream of Kennesaw's media specialist, Beth Finnigan, for several years. Thanks to a former Kennesaw student, that dream is now a reality.

Alex Grecko returned to his elementary school to install a Little Free Library for his Eagle Scout project. The Allatoona High School junior was inspired to build the little library so young readers would have an opportunity to learn, even when school is not in session. In addition to the easily-accessible books, Alex also helped with the school's new story wall, which provides different open-air reading experiences for the elementary students.

"So, Alex really took on two huge projects, and I am just super excited. I feel like at our school, I can give the kids a love for reading. These are two more opportunities that I have to promote books and reading out to the community," Ms. Finnegan added. When families park at the school to walk to the nearby park, students can first pick out

a book at the little free library, named the Finnegan Express, in tribute to the school's media specialist.

"To me, reading is the key. I tell the kids all the time that if you can read, you can do anything, you can learn anything. So, this is just one more opportunity to try to give back to the kids," Ms. Finnegan added.

Inside the school, Ms. Finnegan, with the help of Kennesaw teachers, has taken steps to create a learning commons where there is more going on than just checking out books.

There are lessons based on standards. Kids are engaging content on computers. There is even a Lego wall inside Kennesaw's learning commons. All their work resulted in Kennesaw earning a Library Learning Commons certification. An accomplishment celebrated at the ribboncutting for the Little Free Library-Finnegan Express

"Library media specialists are book providers, tech experts, construction collaborators, space designers, construction leaders, creators of engaging programs, and the list goes on and on. It takes energy, passion, a desire to make this space student-friendly, the right ways to keep kids reading, and emphasis on the importance of digital literacy and collaborating with," said Holly Frilot, Cobb Schools Supervisor of Library Media Education

Library gardens are a natural setting for promoting nutritional literacy and hands-on environmental learning. The North Cobb Garden reflects Cobb County Public Library's mission of being a vital resource center providing services to enrich people's lives.

In addition, a sensory garden that encourages patrons to see, smell, touch, hear, and taste, promotes cognitive learning, improves gross motor skills, and calms and nurtures the mind. The North Cobb Library hosts a weekly meetup for neurodivergent adults every Thursday morning and it was with this group in mind, that Makerspace Coordinator, Vidhya Jagannathan, created two ADA compliant wheelchair accessible beds with the help of an Eagle Scout from Troop 75. Along with the two ADA compliant beds, the garden also has six regular raised beds that Cobb County PARKS generously constructed for the garden. Funding for garden supplies and infrastructure has been made possible by a grant from Food Well Alliance that Vidhya applied for with support from The Cobb Library Foundation and the branch manager, Nichole Knox.

the branch manager, Nichole Knox. Immense help, support, and advice for the North Cobb Garden has been received from Cobb County Master Gardener, Jeanne Young. Jeanne generously donates her time, expertise, and plants to the North Cobb Garden! In addition to the Boy Scouts, Master Gardener, and Parks, the Cobb Library Foundation has been extremely supportive in acquiring needed supplies. Besides Vidhya, North Cobb Staff Rita Spisack, Dennis Baswell, Alice Cavallaro, Marie Lee, and Sachin Kamra are also involved in the care and maintenance of the garden.

Vidhya plans to start a North Cobb Garden Club to involve the library's families in the garden and get the rest of the beds planted. This club will meet whenever there is planting, weeding, and harvesting involved. Produce harvested from the garden will be donated to the "Plant a Row for the Hungry" program. North Cobb will also use the produce in the library's STEM learning, food literacy, and cooking programs. 

Some of you have not been able to come to the Love Does 365 Conferences in person to hear the stories and impact your support of Love Does makes in our community. In God's hands our deepest hurt can become our message to the world.

JENNIFER MOODY, FOSTER4LOVE, SHARES THEIR STORY

Jennifer Moody and her husband adopted three kids that suffered from fetal alcohol syndrome. One of the biggest needs she had was getting the medical records history for her newly adopted children and a one stop shop of services for kids experiencing foster care. Being a nurse, she realized that this was not only a need for her family but for so many other parents who adopted children and for foster parents as well. She started Foster4Love. She wanted to share with you how your support of Love Does projects has helped her meet some of the deepest needs for Foster Parents.

Jennifer is so honored for this opportunity to share how Piedmont Church's Love Does ministry has helped our mission.

The first memory that comes to mind is when Love Does donated soup, laundry detergent, underwear, socks, diapers, and wipes. When I arrived at our office to refill our resource closet a sweet grandma raising four little kiddos happened to be in the office. We offered her some of the donations because she never asks for anything, but we could tell she was struggling. When we put a box of items together for her, we learned that her husband had recently left her and she was struggling to put food on the table, had to stretch the diapers and wipes with three little kiddos in diapers. We were able to show this grandma, who had stepped up to raise her grand kids and keep them from entering foster care, that she matters, and her community is here to walk through challenging times with her. Our resource closet, filled with your donations, has been so important for families suddenly experiencing raising kiddos unexpectedly. You are helping fill a role with these families to help them be reunited or just need a little extra help to make sure the children do not go without.

Love Does has also stepped up and filled the gap for our Together 4 Grads program. This program partners with DFCS to host a graduation party to celebrate teens experiencing foster care graduating from high school or college. These teens do not have a family that is there to celebrate them or recognize their achievements. Without this event they would not be noticed. These remarkable teens have beaten the odds and graduated! The graduation rate for teens experiencing foster care is 11% for high school graduates and only 3% go on to graduate college. With Love Does generosity they will have a enjoy a meal as their caseworkers and mentors recognize them and their achievements.

We cannot thank Love Does enough for helping us love on this community that is struggling and needs to know they matter. We prayerfully hope that Love Does continues to assist us with meeting these family's needs and letting Jesus' light shine bright in the darkness they are walking through. THANK YOU PIEDMONT CHURCH.






