Governor Brian P. AT RAILROAD RENDEZVOUS

The popular annual Railroad Rendezvous event will return to the Southern Museum of Civil War & Locomotive History on Saturday, July 23.

A variety of activities celebrating the railroad and other industrial enterprises will be taking place throughout the day. A tractor show on the museum's front lawn will be the highlight of the event, featuring a 1917 Rumley steam tractor that will be fired up and blowing its whistle. A large interactive model train layout and various remote control vehicles will be on display inside the museum, alongside historic demonstrations, such as chair caning, a vintage printing press, and quilting. Additionally, a railroad silent film festival is scheduled and arts and crafts will be available for children.

Railroad Rendezvous also offers the rare opportunity to step aboard the General locomotive, made famous made famous during the Civil War's Great Locomotive Chase of 1862, and look inside the cab.

CITY OF KENNESAW RECOGNIZES THREE OUTSTANDING COMMUNITY LEADERS

The City of Kennesaw presented three community leaders with the inaugural Follow the Leader award on Monday, June 20. The goal of the Follow the Leader award program is to recognize local community leaders who have made a difference in their service to the City.

The inaugural recipients of the Follow the Leader award are Allison Giddens, Rod Green and Ann Pratt. Allison Giddens is the Founder of the Dave Krache Foundation whose aim is to assist with financial fees related to metro Atlanta kids' sports' leagues and teams. Pastor Rod Green, co-pastor of One Church in Marietta, serves on the Kennesaw Police Chief's Citizens Advisory Board. Green helped organize and lead the City's Juneteenth events, which spread unity amongst the citizens of our community regardless of race, religion or creed. Ann Pratt was a driving force for building the Inclusive Playground at Swift-Cantrell Park, which is one of the largest inclusive playgrounds in the United States.

The award program is a project of the inaugural class of the Kennesaw Leadership Academy. The Kennesaw Leadership Academy is comprised of ten young professionals, representing seven different departments across the City. Leadership development and professional development are the two most important succession-planning tools the City of Kennesaw uses to invest in employees to help them learn, train and grow. By enhancing leadership skills and competencies, the goal of the Kennesaw Leadership Academy is simple: to create a deep pool of potential candidates with wide-ranging leadership skills who are able to step into future leadership roles within the City of Kennesaw.

In return, the Kennesaw Leadership Academy participants will partner with a selection of the award recipients to volunteer their time to support projects, organizations or causes which the award recipients are involved with.

ANDREW BRAMLETT'S RESIDENTS OF THE KENNESAW CEMETERY

Edward Emmett Skelton was born August 24, 1889, in Kennesaw. His parents were James and Mary Skelton. Edward attended school until seventh grade. In 1908, Skelton went to work



for the railroad as a brakeman. His father and many of his siblings also worked for the railroad. In 1917, he registered for the World War I draft, and his draft card described him as stout and short. After registering for the draft Skelton married Irene Hill.

Skelton was one of the first men from Cobb County called to serve in World War I. He trained at Camp Wheeler and served overseas from October of 1918 till June of 1919. After the war Skelton returned to the railroad.

In 1922, Skelton and his wife moved to Smyrna. They had three children, Frances, Jeanne, and Robert. Skelton and his wife were active in the Smyrna Methodist Church, and both served on the church's board of

In 1924, Skelton was promoted to conductor on the railroad. He was a conductor until his retirement in 1952. In total, he had worked for the railroad 44 years. Sadly, Irene Hill Skelton had passed away in 1951, and wasn't able to enjoy her husband's

In 1954, Skelton and his daughter Frances moved into a house on Memory Lane in Smyrna. Skelton died on August 30, 1975, at the age of 86, and was buried soon afterwards in the Kennesaw City Cemetery.

"Presently, and as if by magic, there sprung from the earth a host of men, and in one long, waving line of blue the infantry advanced."- General Samuel French.
