# **NEVER FORGET: KENNESAW MOUNTAIN HIGH** SCHOOL PAUSES TO REMEMBER 9-11

"On that day 21 years ago, America was changed forever. History books were rewritten, and families were never the same again. Innocent people lost their lives, and brave first responders sacrificed everything to make sure they saved American lives.

Twenty-one years ago, families lost sons, daughters, mothers, and fathers. Nothing would fill the void in these families' lives, but with us gathering here today, we show these families that we will never forget, and their loved ones will always be remembered.

By us coming together today and putting on this ceremony, we show America's spirit will er be broken. We will always show hope, faith, and resilience."

Sophomore Anja Remolina spoke those somber words as her fellow Kennesaw Mountain High School NJROTC cadets prepared to raise the flag during the school's 9-11 Remembrance Ceremony.

Local first responders, U.S. service members, and veterans stood among the silent crowd of high school students who were born after the tragic events of September 11, 2001. Their parents remember where they were when they heard the news 21 years ago. The students remember where they first learned about the events that rocked the nation and the entire world before they were born.

Senior Jaise Green was in elementary school when she heard President Barack Obama announce the news that Osama bin Laden had been killed. Her dad, a military veteran, explained the history to her.

Morolaouwa Kamson, 9th grade, did not learn the history of 9-11 until she moved to this country.

Jaise and Anja both recall seeing people still cry about what happened that fateful September

day. Some were students, students they didn't expect to see cry.

All the cadets agreed that it is important for students to continue learning about what happened on 9-11 and to stop and come together in ceremonies like the one at their high school.

"The importance of learning about 911 is so that we can remember that attacks will happen to us, and we need to stay united as a country so that we can overcome all the people that are trying to hurt us,"

# RESIDENTS OF THE KENNESAW CEMETERY

Reverend Joseph Lacy was born January 19, 1847, in Tilton, Georgia. There are rumorshe was connected to the Lacy Family that operated an early Kennesaw hotel, but no connection has been confirmed. By 1870, Joseph Lacy was living in Acworth. It is not



known when he married his first wife, Sarah Smith, though their first child was born in 1867. Sarah and Joseph had seven children: Francis, Zachariah, Delia, Anna, Huldy, Ollie, and George. By 1880, the family had moved to Kennesaw. According to ancestry com. Sarah Lacy passed away in 1880.

By the late 1880s, Lacy had become a prominent citizen of our community. In 1888 he was nominated for the position of Notary Public, and he was a member of the Order of Odd Fellows and the local Meyerhardt Masonic Lodge. In 1899, he married Ella McCurty.

Around 1904, the three-story Lewis Building was built downtown. For many years, the building was the tallest in Kennesaw and when it was built the third story was used by the local Masonic lodge for their meetings. Joseph Lacy was a chairman of a committee that helped build the lodge's part of the building, and he was later remembered for his instrumental role in its construction.

According to the newspapers, Lacy also had a bit of bad luck. In 1881 he was struck by lightning, and in 1903 he lost \$38 to an Atlanta pickpocket. Adjusted for inflation, those \$38 would be worth more than \$1000 today.

Joseph Lacy died on February 25, 1907, and was buried in the Kennesaw City Cemetery. His second wife Ella was buried next to him when she passed away in 1942.





I remember April 11th, 1987, the day Libby and I got married. (Praise God!)

I remember September 11th, 2001, the day the twin towers in New York were attacked. I was at Kennesaw Mountain High School teaching Character Education to their first ever graduating class. As we were watching the tv news reports together I could only think of how the world would forever be changed.

A few Fridays ago, I was walking the halls of Allatoona High School with my son Jacob who teaches special education at the school. On the walls of the hallway were group pictures or ROTC students through the years. At Kennesaw Mountain they have the same group pictures, but they also have pictures of former students who have lost their lives in active service.

At my home school in Fairdale there is a memorial for all the Fairdale High School students who have lost their lives in active service.

During our service on Sunday, September 11th, we are took timeout to honor all the ROTC and NJROTC students from six of our local schools. many of which will soon be on the frontlines defending the freedoms that we enjoy today.

Representatives from the Georgia National Cemetery will be on hand as Piedmont will be contributing to "Wreaths Across America" to place wreaths on all 21 thousand graves this coming December 17th.

Sunday, September 11th is going to be a day to remember in the life of Piedmont Church as we remember those who have fought and served and honor those who will continue to defend our nation and the freedoms that we have and enjoy.


# **ACWORTH COMMUNITY GARDEN'S BOUNTY**



Doyle is survived by his wife of 63 years, Margie Huddleston; daughters, LeAnne Galloway (husband,


