The City of Kennesaw Parks & Recreation Department received the Georgia Recreation and Park Association (GRPA) District 5 Class A Agency of the Year Award during the GRPA

District 5 banquet last night, hosted at Kennesaw's Recreation Center.

The GRPA District 5 Class A Agency of the Year award recognizes exemplary agencies who deliver recreation, park or leisure related services. Nominees are judged on staff development, staff involvement in park organizations, park facilities, new and outstanding programs, and major accomplishments over the past year.

The Kennesaw Parks & Recreation Department maintains 112 acres of developed parks and recreational facilities, comprised of three community parks, 15 neighborhood parks, a community-wide trail and two buildings.

The opening of the new award-winning Recreation Center in January opened new opportunities for the department and their offerings to the community. Over the past year, staff has hosted 18 special events and created 20 new programs, including

pickleball, volleyball, basketball, teen summer camps and after school programs, special needs sports clinics, cornhole tournaments and a senior luncheon series.

In addition to receiving the Georgia Recreation and Park Association's District 5 Class A Agency of the year award, three of the Kennesaw Parks & Recreation staff members were also honored. Rolando Pardo, Park Maintenance Supervisor, received the GRPA District 5 Outstanding Facilities & Grounds Maintenance Award. Rolando has been a part of the Parks & Recreation team for 20 years. Laura Woolsey received the GRPA District 5 Administrative Assistant Award, and Director Steve Roberts (pictured at left) was recognized with the GRPA District 5 Distinguished Professional Award. Steve has been with the department for almost four years and has led the team through many accomplishments including the addition of the Inclusive Playground and Recreation Center, updates to Depot Park and many pocket parks.

VECTR CENTER OPENING CELEBRATED

Chattahoochee Technical College celebrated the opening of the Superior Plumbing Veterans Education and Career Transition Resource (VECTR) Center at the college's Marietta Campus on Tuesday, Oct. 4, with a ribbon-cutting ceremony and open house.

on Tuesday, Oct. 4, with a ribbon-cutting ceremony and open house.

Through the Superior Plumbing VECTR Center, Chattahoochee Tech will help veterans translate military skills and experience into training programs for high-demand and meaningful careers. It will provide active and retired veterans with a place to assist them as they transition into the civilian workforce and into post-secondary education institutions. "My colleagues in the General Assembly and I, along with Gov. Kemp, take seriously the state's responsibility to help active duty military and veterans," said House Speaker Ralston. "While we can never repay them for their service or sacrifice, we can ensure that they have every opportunity for success when they enter the civilian workforce."

The TCSG State Board approved naming this facility the Superior Plumbing VECTR Center in honor of a \$500,000 donation presented by Jay Cunningham to the Chattahoochee Tech Foundation. This donation worked in conjunction with a \$2.25 million appropriation from the General Assembly for establishing a VECTR Center at Chattahoochee Tech. This is the second VECTR Center in the state, following the establishment of the first VECTR program near Robins Air Force Base in Warner Robins.

The Superior Plumbing VECTR Center is also home to the Jim Cunningham Veteran Services Center, which is named for Jay Cunningham's father, a U.S. Army veteran who served in Vietnam. This facility provides a supportive environment for the college's vast student population of veterans and military-affiliated students.

In an additional expression of gratitude to the Cunningham family for their many years of steadfast support, Chattahoochee Tech President Dr. Ron Newcomb announced at this event that the first floor of the college's Health Science Building on the Marietta Campus has been named the Jan Cunningham Nursing Wing in honor of Jay Cunningham's mother. She served for over 50 years as a nurse, working everywhere life took her as a military wife.

Prayer is an integral part of a faith-based life. But how does one pray? Prayer may seem like something everyone just know how to do, but it can be so much more meaningful than



ANDREW BRAMLETT'S

RESIDENTS OF THE KENNESAW CEMETERY

Wylie Blake Skelton was born November 14, 1880. in Kennesaw. There was evidently some confusion about his name, as his obituary says he was named Blake Wood Skelton. His



father was James Skelton, who was known for having witnessed the beginning of the Great Locomotive Chase and who later became a railroad worker. By 1900, W.B. was serving as a farm laborer in Kennesaw. Wylie next went to work for the Western and Atlantic Railroad, following in his father's footsteps.

On Wednesday, September 12, 1906, Skelton was serving as the brakeman on the southbound #13 Freight Train. Near Ringgold, C. H. Clements, an engineer for the Northbound #8 Freight Train, didn't notice a signal to stop to let the #13 Train pass. A mile north of Ringgold, the trains collided. Skelton was one of seven crewmen killed in the accident. His obituary stated he was found under five feet of coal

At the time of the accident, his father was sick in bed. It was thought James Skelton might not survive both his sickness and learning of his son's death. W. B. Skeleton was buried in the Kennesaw City Cemetery the day after the accident. James Skelton recovered from his sickness and lived for thirty-five years.





TOWN CENTER CID CELEBRATES 25 YEARS


MEET ROBERT TRIM



I remember a Peanuts Cartoon where Charley Brown and Linus are inside all bundled up and warm while Snoopy is out freezing to death in the doghouse right in front of an empty dog food bow. They have a discussion on how sad it is that Snoopy is hungry and cold. They felt led to do something, so they walked outside and said to Snoopy "Be of good cheer, Snoopy!" Charles Schultz the founder of Peanuts got the idea for that comic strip from James 2:15-16.

Survivors include daughters Linda S. Ross of Sandy Springs, GA; Brenda R. Durham of Dallas, GA; and son Gary L. Ross of Chatsworth, GA; grandchildren Tara Jones, Nathan Durham, Cindy Whitman, and Jimmy Ross; and several great-grandchildren. Daisy was born on January 9, 1927 in Breckinridge, KY, to the late Wyatt Lambert Haynes and his wife, the late Nannie Beard Haynes. Daisy was the third of six children, all of whom are now deceased.

Daisy met her husband, the late Jim M. Ross, on a double date with one of his friends. The two of them were married on October 6, 1941. Jim was enlisted in the U.S. Army and upon assignment to active duty overseas, he left Daisy in the care of his mother, who ran a boarding house in Alexandria, Virginia.

While living with her mother-in-law, Daisy worked various jobs including secretarial and retail sales. She also worked at the Department of Defense munitions facility (known as Torpedo Station), working on rocket parts, assembly line production, and eventually department administration. Once she was able to join her husband, the two of them shared many adventures living in both Germany and England.

After returning to the U.S., the couple were busy raising their family of two when Jim received an opportunity to work at Lockheed Martin in Marietta, GA. While employed at Lockheed Martin he and Daisy purchased a daycare, Ross Daycare, and owned it for eight years. It was one of the few daycares in the area equipped to care for 50+ children and was state-certified. During this time a third child was born to Jim and Daisy, which completed

In 1965 with the purchase of five-plus acres of property in Kennesaw, Jim and Daisy built their dream home. The daycare was sold and the family moved to Kennesaw. Jim turned his efforts into running a small garage, Ross Garage, also located in Kennesaw. Daisy helped her husband manage the bookkeeping and day-to-day operations. Ross Garage quickly became known for its excellent repair work and was always busy, especially as it was centrally located on downtown's Main Street. Today the building has been refurbished and is home to a local favorite restaurant, Trackside Grille. Ask for the fried green tomatoes: it was one of Daisy's foverities! favorites!

Never one to be without a project, Jim and Daisy eventually sold Ross Garage and bought property in Cedartown, GA, establishing one of the area's first mobile home parks. The park was expanded and maintained by them for

several years. When Jim passed away in 1985, Daisy managed the park for a few more years before selling it. Still settled in Kennesaw, she focused her energies on her home and family. Daisy, or Miss Daisy as she was often called, was loved by all who knew her and will be missed by many.







