AMPHITHEATER GROUNDBREAKING **CEREMONY**

The City of Kennesaw and Kennesaw Parks & Recreation celebrated the commencement of construction on phase eight of the Depot Park Master Plan with a groundbreaking ceremony on Thursday, January 19.

Phase eight of the Master Plan includes the amphitheater and festival area. Upon completion,

the amphitheater will feature a 50 x 42 ft. stage, with back of house. The amphitheater will hold up to 2,000 people on the turf lawn. In addition to the stage, construction includes a restroom, storage facility and renovation of the Community House to serve as the green room for performers. The amphitheater will be host to City events & concerts.

In 2015, the City of Kennesaw began planning for updates and improvements to the original Depot Park Master Plan (which had been adopted in 2008). The master plan was updated to include multiple program changes. Depot Park, located in historic downtown, is located in front of the City's Southern Museum of Civil War & Locomotive History, and adjacent to the City's recently completed Gateway Park. Depot Park is planned to host ample green space, an amphitheater and additional amenities to promote active living.

ANDREW BRAMLETT'S RESIDENTS OF THE KENNESAW CEMETERY

Benjamin Harris Carrie, who went by Ben, was born April 15, 1857, in Big Shanty. His father was Gaspard T. Carrie, a prominent early citizen of the town. In 1886, Ben married Tallulah Brintle.



Carrie built a house on Cherokee Street around 1890. Today painted yellow, it is now owned by the City of Kennesaw. Carrie served as mayor of Kennesaw for two terms, serving from 1896 to 1897. By 1901, he held the office of Justice of the Peace and officiated the weddings of many Kennesaw couples. By 1904, Carrie had become involved with the local Meyerhardt Masonic Lodge, and at one point he served as secretary. He later served as city clerk and treasurer for the City of Kennesaw. In 1908, Carrie became a founder of the Kennesaw State Bank, which served the community for over 50 years. Carrie also served as county registrar.

During World War I, Carrie served on the board that sold Liberty Bonds in Kennesaw. When local mailman Frank Burt went to France to fight, Carrie served as a mail carrier.

During his lifetime, Carrie had many interests. He went to auto races in Atlanta, and he was on a local amateur checkers team. Benjamin Carrie passed away on September 8, 1936. He was buried in his family's plot in the Kennesaw City Cemetery.

Last month, work began on Depot Park's new amphitheater. The house B.H. Carrie built in 1890 will be refurbished as the greenroom for the new stage.

INCLUSIVE SWING AT SWIFT CANTRELL PARK

The City of Kennesaw and Kennesaw Parks & Recreation celebrated the opening of the Inclusive Swing at the Inclusive Playground with a Ribbon Cutting celebration on afternoon January 4.

Part of the Inclusive Playground, The We-Go-Swing is a no-transfer inclusive swing that is integrated into the playground setting at Swift-Cantrell Park that invites kids of all abilities to get in on the fun. The 60" x 72" entry deck is connected to the ramp for easy roll on access. There is no need to transfer from a mobility device to take part in the fun and there is plenty of room for the children and the caregivers to sit and/or stand together and enjoy the ride.

Funding for the swing was provided by T-Mobile, as the City of Kennesaw was named one of their Hometown Grant recipients.

The Inclusive Playground has 40 feet of shade, wheelchair accessible ramps that lead to a ropes tower, sensory stations, an eight (8) person wheelchair sway fun, a slide, and now, an inclusive swing. The ramp system also leads to pod climbers, a tunnel system and climbing apparatuses.

The 18,500 square foot space is lined with turf making it accessible to everyone. This is one of the largest Inclusive Playgrounds in the state.







SETTING AND REACHING GOALS PART 2 BY MARLON LONGACRE, ASSOCIATE PASTOR PIEDMONT CHURCH

So many of us have set new goals for 2023. The hardest things about setting goals are thinking bigger than you ever have before and getting started. That is why I have been using the past few EPICS to study Genesis 24 the success chapter in the Bible. In January's Bright Side I shared how to achieve the first five steps. We will finish with the next five steps
6. YOU MUST DIAGNOSE THE PROBLEMS.

You must identify the roadblocks, the obstacles, the things that are holding you back..

1 Peter 1:6-7 reads "So be truly glad. There is wonderful joy ahead, even though you must endure many trials for a little while. These trials will show that your faith is genuine. It is being tested as fire tests and purifies gold—though your faith is far more precious than mere gold. So, when your faith remains strong through many trials, it will bring you much praise and glory and honor on the day when Jesus Christ is revealed to the whole world."

THIS VERSÉ REVEALS 6 TRUTHS ABOUT PROBLEMS:

Problems are temporary. They will not last forever. Problems are varied. They come in all shapes and sizes. Problems are necessary. They are an indispensable part of preparing you for heaven. Problems test your faith. You build muscles by testing them. In the same way,

when your faith is tested, your faith grows stronger.

Problems purify your motives. God is far more interested in your character than in your comfort. You will face trials to refine your character. Problems prepare you for rewards. The

problems we face now do not compare to the rewards in heaven.

The problems we face in 2023 will not be fun. Some problems hurt deeply but the Bible makes it clear that they WILL make our faith stronger and WILL produce perseverance and

that is why we can have hope no matter what we face.

7. YOU MUST DESIGN A PLAN.

You must design a plan to overcome the problems in reaching your goal. Plan out a specific course of action. Write it out. Write it down on paper. Set some deadlines. Schedule it on your calendar. Ask yourself two questions: How do I intend to get there? Specifically, step by step. How long will it take? You must have a plan. You must know where you are going. Write out some specific action steps.

8. YOU MUST DISCIPLINE YOUR PERSONALITY

Nothing significant has ever been accomplished without discipline. It takes discipline and doing things you do not necessarily want to do.

The question you want to ask yourself here is: How do I need to grow personally? While you are working on the goal, God is working on you. God is much more interested in your character than in your project. He is interested in that too, but He's interested in you. So, you ask yourself, "Where do I need to grow to reach my goal? Are there things I need to learn? Are there skills I need to develop? Are there attitudes I need to work on? Are there changes I need to make? Are there unhealthy habits I need to let go of? What kind of person will I need to be to reach the goal?" You develop and you discipline your personality. You work on self-development.

What is the principle? Whenever you are trying to reach your goal, sometimes you must defer personal pleasure. You defer personal pleasure to reach your goal and after you reach your goal, then you reap the fruit of your rewards. Then you sit down and enjoy it.

9. YOU MUST PAY THE PRICE

This is where the truth of the matter comes out. The fact is, in any goal there is always a price tag to be paid. Everything worthwhile costs something. Even salvation. Salvation wasn't free. It cost Jesus Christ His life. It's a gift. But it sure wasn't free. Christ paid for it.

There's a price tag always to be paid in reaching a goal. A price in terms of time, money,

energy, reputation. There are many different prices that we pay to reach our goals. Great goals require sacrifice. That's always a level of commitment. Some people only want to reach their goals if they're convenient. To achieve God's goal for your life, you will have to let go of some security.

In your goal setting you must ask yourself at this stage three vital questions: 1. What will it cost me? In terms of time, money, energy. 2. What am I willing to give? 3 Is it worth it? That's the bottom line. Is it a wise investment?

The Bible says, "What will it profit a man if he gains the whole world and yet loses his soul?" What does it profit a man if he makes a million dollars and loses his family? You must balance it out. What is it worth it? Is the cause worth the cost? Is the prize worth the

10. YOU MUST DEPEND ON PEOPLE

God chooses to work through people. Aren't we supposed to depend on the Lord? Yes. But God uses people, and if people are not available it does not get done.

You will never achieve very much in life until you learn to get along with others. Success

is never a one man show. It takes cooperation, teamwork, people working together.

The question you must ask yourself is: Am I a cooperative person? Which is more important? My pride or the project. My way or the goal. Sometimes there's some compromising





HEART MURMERS IN CHILDREN BY DANA DORRIS, AT RISK INSURANCE "Your child needs open-heart surgery." My husband and I have heard these words



twice, once with each of our daughters. As young parents, we never dreamed we would hear these words once, much less two times. We learned the hard way that 1 in every 100 babies are born with a congenital heart defect. While not all of defects require a surgical repair, it is something that all parents should be aware of. Congenital heart defects are conditions present at birth that can affect the way the heart works. They are the most common birth defect, affecting more than 40,000 births in the United States each year.

A congenital heart defect can be discovered through an ultrasound during pregnancy, a physical examination at birth, or by a baby that is symptomatic. Some are not discovered until adulthood once the body puts greater demands on the heart. For us, a pediatrician heard a murmur in our 22 month old daughter

that made her suspicious enough to send us to a pediatric cardiologist as a precaution. It was at that initial visit that we learned that she was born with an atrial septal defect requiring a surgical closure. The second diagnosis came from our baby being diagnosed as "failure to thrive" and although initial testing showed her heart was fine, persistence by her pediatrician and more testing revealed that she too had an atrial septal defect and a ventricular septal defect that had to be surgically repaired. Our second child had her surgery at 12 weeks and weighing only 10 pounds.

Twenty-five and twenty years post-op, I'm still very interested in learning about heart defects and sharing our story with others. I feel that murmurs and some other symptoms are very easily overlooked and those babies born with less severe defects can grow into their teenage years or even adulthood undiagnosed. How many times have we heard of the athlete going into sudden cardiac arrest or even death only to find out there was an underlying heart problem that the family didn't know about? I believe all parents should learn the warning signs and all babies should be tested at birth.

Our story has a happy ending. We have two healthy daughters who are now 27 and 20 years old. Excellent care from their pediatricians and cardiologists have led them to a healthy, happy, and

As we now transition to adult care, the importance to remember (for us) is that congenital heart disease requires lifelong care and that will continue to ensure a long and happy life. As a parent, my one piece of advice to any other parent caring for a child who has been impacted by a congenital heart defect is not to treat them differently than any other child. A wise mother once shared with me, "even though we want to clip their wings, the hardest and best thing to do is to let them fly".

Editor's Note: February is American Heart Month – a time when the nation spotlights heart disease, the No. 1 killer of Americans. President Lyndon B. Johnson, among the millions of people

in the country who'd had heart attacks, issued the first proclamation in 1964.
