
PIEDMONT CHURCH - ABA BUSINESS OF THE YEAR

MAIN STREET ON THE MOVE FLEX GRANT

In 2023, the Kennesaw Downtown Development Authority will sponsor the Main Street on the Move Flex Grant. KDDA will award grants ranging from \$500 - \$2500 to small businesses in Downtown Kennesaw for projects that will enhance productivity, expand or improve business processes, improve service delivery, support business expansion, or improve business facilities/infrastructure. Grant amounts are discretionary and will be awarded based on need and potential impact.

Grant applications will be available starting January 1, 2023, and will be due no later than 5 p.m. on February 1, 2023. An applicant information session will be held at City Hall on January 11, 2023, to answer any questions that potential applicants have regarding the application process or project eligibility.



Rufus Dewberry, was born on October 2, 1884. He went by Will. His sister, Ethel Rebecca Dewberry, was born on October 20, 1888. The Dewberrys lived on



Washington Avenue in Marietta and attended the Marietta City Schools.

Around 1903, Will Dewberry became a postman. He later worked as a foreman for the Louisville and Nashville Railroad. Will was considered a quiet and industrious man and an upstanding citizen. Ethel Dewberry attended Marietta High School and planned to graduate in 1907. She was baptized in 1905

In late August 1906, Will Dewberry contracted typhoid. Around 9 o'clock on September 7, 1906, he passed away at the age of twenty-two. The Marietta Journal said that he was "Cut off in the prime of manhood and usefulness." His funeral was held at the Kennesaw Baptist Church and was buried in the Kennesaw City Cemetery

Shortly afterward, Ethel also caught Typhoid. She passed away on October 6, 1906. Her obituary stated that "our entire community was shocked by this sad death, and sympathize with the heart-stricken family in their sorrow and bereavement." The same pastor from her brother's funeral preached at Ethel's funeral, and she was soon buried next to her brother.

In 1912, Ludie Dewberry suffered a "brief illness" and passed away on August 24. Her husband, William, passed away several months later on October 21, 1912. They were survived by one child, a daughter named Alison.



PIEDMONT CHURCH'S LOVE DOES PROGRAM

For over a year, the Bright Side has written each month about the Love Does Program at Piedmont Church. This program is funded by the congregation with FREE WILL GIFTS - meaning they donate money over and above their tithing commitment.

Below is a brief breakdown of what Love Does has contributed to our frontline ministries and local schools in our community.

January: Over 8500 soup cans were given that stock, store house, ministries, MUST Ministries, and various other local school and partner food pantries

February: Seven Sensory rooms were funded in Cobb and Marietta schools for a total of \$17,500. Refurbished the Special-Needs Cobb adult home for \$10,000. Love Does supported Camp Trach Me Away, Tommy Nobis Center, Brookwood Christian School and Grace Point School for the Dyslexia. And provided the buses for all special-needs dances in Cobb ALL TOTALING \$31,500 donated for special needs children and adults in our community.

March: Piedmont donated funds to purchase over 96,000 eggs and candy for the Northeast Cobb egg drop. Raised \$24,500 that was given to all the Northeast Cobb Schools and Marietta City Schools. (Pictured above are Marlon Longacre presents the principals of these schools with a check from the Egg Drops.

April & May Piedmont Love Does program fed 17 schools with over 1600 teachers breakfast and lunch

June: Gave \$55,000 to local Frontline ministries and partners including \$25,000 to build MUST Ministries chapel in their new shelter and \$10,000 for their local summer lunch program.

July: Over 742 fully loaded backpacks were given to local schools for kids in need August: Over \$24,500 worth of undies were donated to local shelters and schools as

well as over 21,000 diapers donated to local shelters and Frontline ministries **September**: Love Does donated \$5000 to Wreaths Across America and donated \$6000 to seven local high schools' NJROTC and JROTC programs

October/ November:

Love Does donated over 640 love does grocery bags to local schools for holiday meals including turkeys for each bag. See photo at right.

December: Love Does raised money to purchase meal plans for ten homeless KSU students (who have graduated out of the foster care program) and money to provide scholarships for kids to attend summer camp.



SETTING AND REACHING GOALS BY MARLON LONGACRE, ASSOCIATE PASTOR PIEDMONT CHURCH

So many of us take the week after Christmas off to relax and begin to think about next year's goals and dreams. If I had one wish for all of you it would be for you to know the dream and vision that God has for your life. Everything that God wants to do in your life will start with a dream. The bible tells us in Proverbs 29:18 "Where there is no vision, the people perish." You must have a dream for your life. The two most important things, the hardest things in life -- are: 1) Thinking bigger than you have ever thought before, and 2) Getting started.

With this month's EPIC Emails, we are going to look at how you get started. In Genesis 24, there is a passage with ten practical steps on how to reach your dreams. This month's column will address the first five steps. You cannot skip any of these steps. They are a process -- God's process -- for how to reach your goals. Genesis 24 talks more about success than any other chapter in the Bible. If you follow these things, I guarantee that they will help you reach your goals

1. DETERMINE YOUR POSITION

You must evaluate your present condition. Do a self-assessment. Honestly look at your own life. If I were to call you on the phone and ask you for directions to your house. The first thing you would say to me is "Where are you at right now? Starting the goal, you first say, "Where am I?" In each step, I will give you at least one question to ask yourself. The question you ask in this step is this: Where am I now? Why am I where I am? What would I like to change in my life? Where am I now? This step may require a little humility. It is ok to ask for help. I got up early this morning and talked to God first before I talked to anyone else. I have heard Ike say too many times "You cannot rise up above in public what you are not in private with God." I have many dreams, but before reaching them I must develop my quiet time.

2. DEFINE YOUR PURPOSE.

If you are to reach your goal, the second thing is defining it. Be clear, be precise, get a picture of it. Visualize it. A fuzzy goal will never be achieved because you do not know how to get there. You do not

Visualize it. A fuzzy goal will never be achieved because you do not know how to get there. You do not know when you will be there. You must be specific, clear-cut. You focus on your target. You define it. Three questions to ask yourself here: 1. Where do I really want to be? Ask yourself that. Force yourself to think bigger by asking yourself tough questions. 2. What do I really want? What do I really want in life? 3. How will I know when I get there? When you set a life goal, you must be specific. You say, "I want more income." How much? You say, "I want to travel." Where? You say, "I want to witness somebody." Who? You say, "I want to read the Bible." How often? Be specific about it. "I want a job." What kind of job? Define your purpose. Proverbs 16:9 reads "We can make plans, but it is the Lord that determines our steps." Please as your setting goals for 2023 stay connected to God. Develop that quiet time. Remember God is far more interested in your development than He is about you reaching your goals.

interested in your development than He is about you reaching your goals.

3. YOU MUST DISCOVER A PROMISE

You do not look at your own resources. You do not look at your own abilities. You do not look at what you can do. You look at God. You look at what He wants to do, and you find a promise. You do not worry about all the "How's" and all the problems. That is another stage later. Right now, you simply discover a promise.

Do you believe that faith can move mountains? He can move mountains and it is through the power of believing that God acts. When you study the word of God and you find that every time God moved out of heaven, moved on earth, and did a miracle it was because somebody believed. God is going to do a miracle through you in 2023 because you believed and claimed a promise from God.

The fourth step that Genesis 24 teaches us on how to reach our goals in 2023 is:

4. YOU MUST DESCRIBE THE PROFIT

In any goal, whether it is a personal goal or a church goal or a family goal or whatever, the next step is to describe the profit. Every goal must have a payoff, or you will not be motivated to achieve it. There must be a reward. There must be a payoff, a profit. Settle the value of the goal in your mind and say "I'm going to give my time and my energy to this because I know it's worthwhile. There's value to

it." Describe the profit and know exactly what it is. Questions: Why do I want it? In reaching any goal, before you can reach it, you must stop and ask, "Why do I want it? What is the reward, the prize, the payoff? How will I feel when I achieve it?" Visualize it in your mind. This produces a powerful desire, and you must have a consuming desire. Most people in life are not consumed by anything. They are lukewarm about it all. When you have a

consuming desire, you will reach your goal. God is not the author of chaos. Ephesians 2:10 and Jeremiah 29:11 talks about how God plans. If God plans, then we are to plan. It is biblical to plan and set goals.

5. DESIRE IN PRAYER

The question you ask yourself on this step is: How often do I pray about my goal? You may have never thought about it, but your prayer life reveals two things: 1. It reveals your desire. How badly do I want my goal? Just look at your prayer life and how

much you pray about it. A lot of times God delays an answer, delays a goal, just to see if you really are serious. He is saying, "Is this just a passing whim or is it really a gut level desire of your life? I want to see how much you pray for it." If it is just a whim, you will mention it once. If you are serious about it,

you will bring it to me until it happens. 2. It shows your reliance on God. Prayer says, "This is how I'm depending on God." If I do not think I need God, I will just go out and achieve it on my own. But my prayer life shows how much I am trusting God to help me with the goals. Pray regularly.


