CITY OF KENNESAW NAMED TOP 10%

The City of Kennesaw was recently awarded the "Leading the Way Award" by ETC Institute. As a recipient, Kennesaw has ranked in the top 10 percent of all cities surveyed in the U.S. in three areas: satisfaction with the overall quality of services, satisfaction with customer service provided by employees, and satisfaction with the value residents think they receive for local taxes and fees.

ETC Institute created the award to recognize local governments for outstanding achievement in the delivery of services to residents.

"The City of Kennesaw is blessed to have committed staff and a strong leadership group in place," says City Manager Dr. Jeff Drobney. "It takes a robust team game to operate a complex City organization and this is a team award to be shared amongst all employees and every department.

The City of Kennesaw conducted a Community Survey in 2016 and 2022, assessing resident satisfaction with city services. The City of Kennesaw has used these results as a tool for strategic planning and benchmarking over the years.

ETC has administered the DirectionFinder Survey to nearly two million residents in all states since 1999.

To fix leaks in your home, you first need to determine if you have a leak. Look and listen for dripping faucets, showerheads, sprinklers, and other fixtures. Also check for toilets with silent leaks by putting a few drops of food coloring into the tank, wait 10 minutes, and see if color appears in the bowl before you flush. Don't forget to check irrigation systems and outside spigots too.

ANDREW BRAMLETT'S

RESIDENTS OF THE KENNESAW CEMETERY

Richard Allen Chalker's ancestors can be traced back to Nathaniel Chalker, a veteran of the War of 1812 from Warren County, Georgia. Richard was born August 5, 1870, in Glascock County.



Chalker's family

later moved to Flowery Branch, Georgia, and eventually settled in Marietta. Chalker married Mary Gunnin around the year 1890. By 1895 they were living in Kennesaw, as their infant son was buried in our cemetery that year. Chalker owned a number of small grocery stores, including a store near the Brumby Chair Factory in Marietta. The store was located at the corner of Sessions and Campbell Hill Streets.

Chalker and his wife had several children. Their daughters were Mary, Elizabeth, Maggie, Nellie, and Bessie. They also had at least three sons, Oscar, Amos, and Steve. According to the Marietta Journal, young Oscar Chalker passed away in 1906. The notice of Oscar's death stated Richard lived in Atlanta at the time. Unfortunately, Chalker could not be found in that year's Atlanta City Directory.

Richard Allen Chalker passed away in Marietta on May 18, 1927, and was laid to rest in the Kennesaw City Cemetery. When his widow Mary died in 1938, she was buried next to him.
