Tinlei was sent to the hospital earlier this year because she'd been having bad headaches caused by excessive spinal cord fluid building up and putting pressure on her optic nerve and brain stem. (This was partly discovered during an eye exam that resulted in a trip to the ER. ACT scan at the ER found a 3.5×4.5cm mass on her brain.

Tinlei had one surgery on June 22nd, to add an EVD tube to drain the fluid and make a plan of attack to remove the tumor. The tumor looks like it is completely surrounded by fluid so Tinlei's neurosurgeon team is very positive that this could be a best case scenario, but only time will tell. The family is providing updates as they get them. For now, they declare that this diagnosis "will not get them down and they will all be strong for their sassy Tinlei girl!'

In 1889, the Independent Normal School opened in Acworth on today's Park Street. Professor N. E. W. Stokely ran the school, and it was hoped this would solve the problem of overcrowding in Acworth's school.



Students came from across the area to attend the new institution. In addition to the usual classes, the school also offered a variety of other subjects including bookkeeping, surveying, photography, and telegraphy

The school was located near a park with a mineral well, which became a landmark to describe the school's location. The greenspace gave Park Street its name. The Independent Normal School utilized several buildings and was affiliated with the Mineral Park Hotel where boarders could live for \$10 a month.

While the school is sometimes remembered as a college, a middle school or high school would be a better comparison. The youngest students accepted were ten years old. According to the December 7, 1890, Atlanta Constitution, the rates per month were as follows: Literary and Business, \$3; telegraphy, \$5; stenography and typewriting, \$10. The study of photography required a \$40 scholarship.

In 1891, a disgruntled schoolteacher quit and founded his own school down the street. Several of the Independent Normal School's students began to attend the new school and sued N.E.W.Stokely for their tuition.Stokely left the school soon afterward and later returned to Acworth in 1893. The disagreement severely injured the school, and the last record of its existence in newspapers is from 1893.







FOUR-LEGGED BLOOD DONORS: STORIES OF PETS SAVING LIVES IN CHATTANOOGA **BY DAVID COOK**

Whenever there's an accident or trauma, humans need blood transfusions.

But we're not the only ones. Consider our beloved pets and four-legged friends. What happens when they're hit by a car, ingest rat poison or require major surgery? "Humans need blood transfusions," said Jenn Best. "So do animals."

Jenn Best is the blood bank manager at Veterinary Care and Speciality Group (VCSG) in Chattanooga, Tenn., with a team of more than 100 emergency and specialty doctors, veterinary technicians and support staff. When VCSG opens its new cancer care center this fall, it will be one of the largest small animal veterinary emergency and referral centers in the Southeast.

Thankfully, VCSG operates an in-house blood bank. There are very few animal blood banks in the country, Best said. And animal hospitals with their own blood bank? "Even fewer," she said.

Most hospitals order from blood banks around the country, relying on a wait time that's often 16 to 18 weeks, Best said. Two problems quickly emerge:

Animals need blood transfusions quickly, within minutes or hours of initial trauma, to have a chance to live. Waiting one day, let alone one week, can result in the loss of a pet.

Second, the nationwide blood shortage and lengthy ordering process can create a "vicious cycle of supply and demand," explained Best. Some hospitals will over-order blood, yet, with its 31-day shelf-life, stored blood may go unused. This explains VCSG's vision: a self-sustaining blood bank. "The goal is to supply not only our hospital," Best said, "but other hospitals in our area."

Dogs can donate safely every six weeks and one donation - split into red blood cells and plasma - can save multiple pets.

Best would love to hear from any interested Acworth or Kennesaw pet owners. Before any pet can donate, there's a complimentary physical examination and screening process. Our donors must be healthy and young, two to eight years old, and live a relatively healthy lifestyle. Pets enjoy the direct attention of three blood bank staff members, including Best, who - with some help from peanut butter - make sure your dog's tail is wagging the whole time.

"They spoil him rotten," Jenny Daniels said. Her golden retriever mix Nero has donated three or four times. When Daniels, who works in a nearby veterinary clinic, heard VCSG was accepting dog-and-cat-donors, she gladly volunteered Nero. He loves it. "They are really gentle with him," she said. "It's a very quick procedure and they spoil and love him the whole time."

For Best, the process is deeply rewarding. Donors are potential life savers. "It will give a dog or cat in our hospital another chance at life," she said.




