9-11-2001:

77 MINUTES THAT CHANGED OUR WORLD ARTICLE BY MARY LOU CAGLE, MARIETTA

September 11, 2001, did not start as an unusual day for me. It was 8:30 a.m. and I was following my regular routine which was to have breakfast and then take my second cup of coffee to the living room



where I would turn on Good Morning America and read the paper. I could get the local weather and news. It was a nice fall day in Marietta, Georgia and, in New York City, it was also a beautiful early morning with temperatures in the mid-60's. Suddenly, I heard Diane Sawyer say...." some sort of explosion at the World Trade Center in New York City ...a plane may have hit one of the two towers at the World Trade Center..." This began a day which went long into the night and continued for days to come as we watched the unbelievable and horrific events

of 9-11 broadcast continually on TV. It has been 22 years since this attack. Following is a recap of some of the events of that day. This was a well-planned attack on the United States of America by Islamic jihadist mastermind, Osama bin Laden, and al-Qaeda. This, the deadliest terrorist attack in human history, began early in the morning of September 11, when four commercial passenger planes left the East Coast fully fueled and headed for California. Departure times were from 7:59 a.m. until 8:42 a.m. and the origins of the flights included 2 from Boston, MA, 1 from Washington, D.C., and 1 from Newark, N.J. Nineteen hijackers were aboard these planes.

American Airlines Flight 11 had 81 passengers and 11 crew members: 5 terrorists. It departed from Logan International Airport in Boston, MA at 7:59 a.m. and was hijacked at 8:14 a.m. At 8:46 a.m. this plane, travelling at 466 miles an hour, crashed into the North Tower of the World Trade Center between floors 93-99 and the 77 minutes began. One hour and 42 minutes later at 10:28 a.m. the

North Tower collapsed.

United Airlines Flight 175 had 56 passengers and 9 crew members: 5 terrorists. It departed from Logan International in Boston at 8:14 a.m. and it was hijacked at approximately 8:45 a.m. This plane, travelling at 590 miles per hour, crashed into the South Tower of the World Trade Center at 9:03 a.m. between floors 77-85. At 9:58 a.m., 55 minutes after impact, the South Tower became the first building

American Airlines Flight 77 departed from Dulles International Airport in Washington, DC at 8:20 a.m. and had 58 passengers and 6 crew members: 5 terrorists. Approximately 30 minutes after take-off, the plane was hijacked. At 9:37 a.m., this plane, travelling at 530 miles per hour, crashed into the Western Side of the Pentagon killing all aboard plus 125 Pentagon personnel.

United Airlines Flight 93 departed Newark International Airport in Newark, NJ (now Newark Liberty International Airport) at 8:42 a.m. had 37 passengers, 7 crew members: 4 terrorists. Approximately 46 minutes into the flight, it was hijacked. It is believed that the planned target of this plane was the White House or Capital in Washington, D.C. The passengers on this flight were heroes. They had been in communication with loved ones and knew of the attacks in New York and the Pentagon. They decided to fight back and stormed the cockpit. Approximately 6 minutes later at 10:03 a.m., this plane, travelling at fight back and stormed the cockpit. Approximately 6 minutes later, at 10:03 a.m., this plane, travelling at 583 miles per hour, crashed into a field in Starkville (Somerset County) Pa. killing all aboard. Starkville is 267 miles from Washington, D.C.

From 8:46 a.m. until 10:03 a.m. is 77 minutes, a lifetime that changed our world forever.

This, by far, does not begin to tell the story of the events of that day and the days to come. The number of people killed in or due to the 9-11 attacks was 2,996. Included in this number are more than 400 first responders: 343 members of the New York City Fire Department, 60 Police Officers, and 8 Paramedics. Fires continued to burn 99 days after the attack. When asked, "How many casualties at the World Trade Center?",

the Mayor of New York, Rudy Giuliani, answered, "more than any of us can bear."

I could write more about this day. but I will close with this. The next time you are in the line at one of our airports and complain about the wait, just remember the 19 terrorists who went through check points and entered the four airplanes without question carrying the box cutters that allowed them to take over the planes and complete their murder-suicide assignments that changed our world forever.

ANDREW BRAMLETT'S LOCAL HISTORY STORIES

In his day, Hiram "High" Sherman was one of the oldest in dividuals in Kennesaw. According to the August 18,1887 edition of the Marietta Journal, Sherman was "97 years old" and "walking around



quite lively.

Two years later, in a November 19, 1889 article titled "The Oldest White Man in Cobb County," the Marietta Journal recorded Sherman's age as 105. According to the article, he had served in one of the Seminole Wars, the Mexican American War, and the Civil War. Even at 105, he was still farming in Kennesaw. "He never used a pair of spectacles and says he can now see to shoot a rifle with accuracy."

The following year, the November 20, 1890 edition of the Marietta Journal contained Sherman's obituary. According to the article, he was 107, meaning he had aged ten years in the three years since the original 1887 article.

So, what is the truth about High Sherman? No gravestone is known that might offer insight into his birth and death. What is likely an accurate (or more accurate) estimate of his age is found in the 1870 census, when Sherman said he was 73, making him 93 years old when he passed away twenty years later. If the age in the census is correct, Sherman would have been born the same year John Adams became president and passed away twenty-one presidents later.

YOUR CALL IS MONITORED MICKEY MELLON, GREENMELLON

Back in the day when calling a company you'd often hear a messaging saying that "your call may be monitored", which I suspect was true. We hear the same thing on those calls today, but it's a lie — your call absolutely is being recorded and studied (and with AI, even

As Seth Godin said in his book "The Song of Significance": "Your call may be monitored". Except not the way we expected — now it's every call,

It goes well beyond that. We all know how much we're being tracked online by cookies, ads, and social networks, but little things do more than you expect too.

I recently reached out to a client about an overdue invoice and they said "I'm sorry, I never got it. Can you please re-send it?", seemingly unaware that we know that isn't true. We sent a month ago, and they viewed it twice the next day. Of course, we didn't want to damage the relationship by calling them out and we were happy to re-send, but you can't just hide even on little things like that.

The chat sees all

The big one that surprised me a few years ago is when we put a chatbot on the GreenMellen site, and I was the one that generally was running it. It wasn't a great fit for us so we took it down a few weeks later, but it opened my eyes in a big way — we could see everything the person on the other end was typing. Not just when they pressed "enter", but every keystroke.

It was kind of agonizing. I'd be watching people type, and I knew exactly where their question was going, but I couldn't answer too quickly because they didn't know I could see.

Worse, I'd have some people type their question, then delete it, re-word it, erase another word or two, and keep tweaking it, while I had to wait around for them to officially submit it so I could answer.

The point here is that "they" can see everything. Ad companies know what sites you've visited, chatbots know everything you type, companies know when you view their invoices, and every call you make to a big corporation is being recorded and studied by them.

There's not much you can do with this info, since most of it you already knew anyhow and all of it is hard avoid, but just be aware of how much others can see with every little action you make online.
