The event kicked off Public Safety Appreciation Week, a community-wide effort to say "thank you" to the men and women who work tirelessly to keep Cobb County safe.



AWARD OF MERIT - KENNESAW AND COBB COUNTY OFFICERS

The Award of Merit recognizes a deserving recipient for acts of courage, demonstrating genuine care and concern for the citizens of the community and going above and beyond the call of duty, often resulting in a life being saved.

Kennesaw Police Officer Jared Wheeler and Officer Blake Arnold and Cobb County Police Sergeant Coty Thompson, Officer Andrew Brock, and Officer Jessica Richardson, Kennesaw Police Department and Cobb County Police Department

On the 28th of December in 2022, Kennesaw Police Officers Blake Arnold and Jared Wheeler got a call about two teenagers playing near a frozen lake. When they arrived at the scene, they could see a boy hanging off the ice with the rest of his body suspended in frigid water. Cobb Police Sergeant Coty Thompson arrived on the scene and presented the idea of reaching a hose out to the boy. Officers Wheeler and Richardson removed their gear to lighten themselves and began moving onto the ice towards the teen to bring him the hose. Once the boy took hold of the hose, Officer Arnold, Cobb Police Sergeant Thompson, and Cobb Police Officer Andrew Brock began to pull him back to the safety of the shore.

Immediately, Officer Wheeler grabbed the hose and ran back onto the ice. But as Officer Wheeler was navigating the ice, it gave way beneath him, and he fell in. Luckily, the officers were able to pull Officer Wheeler out of the frigid water, but they quickly determined the rescue was too dangerous without the proper gear. The rescue efforts put forth by this unit were incredibly honorable. They employed quick thinking,

The rescue efforts put forth by this unit were incredibly honorable. They employed quick thinking, took action, and put their own safety on the line. The crew evaluated the situation and understood what was best, given the dangerous variables. Thanks to their lifesaving actions – that went above and beyond their police training – the life of a 16-year-old boy was saved.

A skill like this is difficult to teach, but she has built hers up from years of keen observation, situational awareness, and taking information from numerous sources before every decision. Last December, Officer Palarche was placed into a situation of great danger. She had to face a

Last December, Officer Palarche was placed into a situation of great danger. She had to face a dangerous person twice her size as he violently attacked her and those nearby. During the length of the incident, Officer Palarche kept the man away from the bystanders at the location, keeping the aggression of the man focused on her. She was attacked violently time and time again, and while there were many justifications for using deadly force, she withheld and attempted to subdue the assailant instead. The bravery demonstrated by Officer Palarche was brilliant and the community is beyond grateful for her. This incident shows how truly determined she is in keeping her community safe.

On your left, as you travel down Acworth's Main Street, shortly after Highway 92, is Cemetery Road. Following this road will bring you to Acworth's Liberty Hill Cemetery, one of



the oldest in North Cobb. The cemetery rests on top of Liberty Hill, though it is not known how the hill got its name. In the 1840s, a small log church was built on the hill. The church was called Liberty Hill Baptist, and it was the first Baptist church in Acworth. Sometime after the church was built, a plot of land on the church grounds began to be used for burials. The first known internment was Nancy Morris Gragg, who passed away in 1847.

In 1864, the Civil War came through Acworth, and Liberty Hill Baptist was burned. It was rebuilt in 1866 on the same site. The church later moved closer to downtown and changed its name to the First Baptist Church of Acworth. The cemetery was deeded to the City of Acworth and is still used as the Acworth city cemetery. Many movers and shakers of Acworth's history are laid to rest within its gates.

Today, Liberty Hill Cemetery has over 3,500 burials and remains one of the most historic spots in Acworth. On the city's website is an interactive map that allows users to find the exact location of the cemetery's residents.


HOW MUCH WATER AND WHEN

CHATT TECH AND KENNESAW STATE LAUNCH LINK PROGRAM

Many college students in the Metro Atlanta area begin their goal of earning a bachelor's degree by first taking courses at Chattahoochee Technical College and then transferring into Kennesaw State University, the third largest university in Georgia. Now making this transfer process even better for students is the new LINK program, an academic bridge from Chatt Tech to Kennesaw State.

College officials from Kennesaw State and Chattahoochee Tech met at the Chatt Tech North Metro Campus on Tuesday, Nov. 14, to formally launch the LINK program with a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) and Transfer Articulation Agreement. This initiative represents a valuable college partnership, which empowers students to transition seamlessly from Chatt Tech to Kennesaw State. Through the new LINK program, students are encouraged to first complete 30 credit hours at Chatt Tech representing 10 classes of General Education courses. Then these students apply as a transfer student to Kennesaw State with a solid foundation of courses that transfer seamlessly into Kennesaw State programs of study. Chattahoochee Tech students who enroll in the LINK program will receive professional

Chattahoochee Tech students who enroll in the LINK program will receive professional academic advising at Chatt Tech and have access to a transfer evaluation counselor from Kennesaw State. Beginning college at Chatt Tech allows students to explore interests, complete general education requirements, and ease into the college experience. Chatt Tech students in the LINK program who complete transferable credit hours with a 2.0 or higher GPA will have their Kennesaw State application fee waived, and their Chatt Tech transcripts will be released to KSU for free. In a practice known as reverse transfer, credits earned at Kennesaw State also can be applied toward possible associate degrees awarded by Chatt Tech.

The MOU and Articulation Agreement was entered into between the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia by and on behalf of Kennesaw State University, and Chattahoochee Tech, a Unit of the Technical College System of Georgia. 
