The locomotive General returned to Kennesaw in April 1972, almost fiftyone years ago. Efforts to return the engine to Georgia had long been underway by the time it finally happened. In March 1939, around the



same time the locomotive was at the World's Fair in New York City, the Georgia General Assembly passed a joint resolution calling for the return of the General. James V. Carmichael of Marietta proposed the resolution.

The plan was to place the engine at tennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park, which had recently been established. The resolution also mentioned that it could return to Kennesaw if the option at the mountain did not work out. The son of William Fuller, the train's conductor during the chase, said he would write "the railroad officials and the state administration in protest." He felt the railroad would take better care of the train and more people could visit it in Chattanooga.

According to meeting minutes, in April, the men who served on the Kennesaw City Council were "instructed to do anything in his power to help get the 'General' brought back to Kennesaw." It is not known why these 1939 efforts failed.

Similar efforts were made in the years leading up to the centennial of the Great Locomotive Chase in 1962. The most notable came in 1962 when the General returned to Kennesaw temporarily. It would take ten years after this event for the engine to return permanently.

FIRE SAFETY IN THE **HOME**

When considering a healthy and clean home, often times tasks such as disinfecting surfaces, regular sweeping, mopping, and tidying up are the first items that come to mind. However, one crucial aspect that is frequently overlooked is the annual cleaning of dryer vents. This seemingly minor task can have significant implications for both health and safety. The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) reports that nearly 15,000 fires are caused each year by dryers. This results in approximately \$200 million in property damage. The NFPA states that dryer exhaust vents should be cleaned on an annual basis for fire prevention. When further considering fire safety in a home, the kitchen is the most hazardous in terms of fire hazards. According to the U.S. Fire Administration, in 2021 fire departments in the United States responded to an estimated 170,000 home cooking fires. - •Keep a Class ABC extinguisher in an easily accessible location; such as under the kitchen sink, above the fridge, or in a cabinet





2024 - "THE YEAR OF THE SUPER HERCULES" MARY LOU CAGLE, CONTRIBUTING EDITOR

As the author of this document, I am proud to say that I retired from Lockheed after 37 years' service. I started my career in Procurement the same year the C-130 made its first flight, 1954. I worked in Procurement all those years retiring in December, 1990 as Purchasing Agent responsible for the procurement of Standard Parts and Electrical Standard Parts for the C-130 and all the other aircraft built by Lockheed. It was with great joy that I had the opportunity to fly on the C-130.

On January 17, 2024, the United Sates Georgia General Assembly approved a resolution commemorating the 70th anniversary of the first flight of the Lockheed C-130 manufactured at the company's Marietta, Georgia facility. The resolution designates 2024 as "the Year of the Super Hercules" and was introduced by five State Senators, acknowledging the significant impact of the C-130 on Georgia's aerospace sector. For the past seven (7) decades the Lockheed Marietta facility has been the exclusive birthplace of every Hercules aircraft earning it the title of "Georgia's aerospace ambassador to the world." On July 2, 1951, Lockheed Aircraft Corporation, Burbank, California, won the competition and was contracted to produce two prototype YC-130 aircraft. The first flight of the YC-130 took place on August 23, 1954, at the Burbank plant; it has been in uninterrupted production ever since. Its four turboprop engines enabled the YC-130 to take off in only 800 feet. In addition to its tremendous lift capability, the aircraft also proved to be far more maneuverable than expected while meeting or exceeding all of the other U.S. Airforce performance requirements. This success of the prototype led to a production contract; however, the Burbank facility was at capacity. The entire C-130 program was moved to Lockheed's facility in Marietta Georgia - known then as Lockheed Georgia Company. The first production C-130A, which was nearly identical to the prototypes, was flown for the first time at Marietta Georgia on April 7, 1955. The C-130A featured four powerful Allison turboprop engines, each delivering 3,750 horsepower.

Since the first flight 70 years ago, more than 2,500 C-130s have been ordered and/or delivered to 63 nations around the world. Seventy countries operate the C-130's which have been produced in more than 70 different variations. From the highest of air strips in the Himalayas, to landing on an aircraft carrier runway in the middle of the ocean or the ski-equipped C-130 landing in the Arctic and Antarctic, the C-130 always and proudly defies expectations. The Hercules is known for its ability to tackle any mission, anywhere at any time.

The C-130J Super Hercules is the latest version of the C-130 flying its first mission April 5,1996. It is powered by four turbo prop Rolls-Royce engines. It offers superior performance and new capabilities, with the range and flexibility for every theater of operations and evolving requirements. The C-130J has set 54 world aviation records.

The C-130 Hercules operates worldwide; its mission of flying in combat, humanitarian missions, special operations, aerial refueling, firefighting and search and rescue missions around the world, the C-130 stands ready for its next missions for whatever the future holds. The C-130 is the longest-running military aircraft production program in history.

No matter the mission, no matter the location, Hercules has gone there, is going there and will go back thanks to its constant state of innovation. Today's Hercules is ready for tomorrow's missions.

CONGRATULATIONS DEANNE BONNER MARIETTA DAILY JOURNAL CITIZEN OF THE YEAR

The Marietta Daily Journal presented Deane Bonner, Cobb County NAACP president emerita, with the Citizen of the Year Award. MDJ Publisher Otis Brumby III surprised Bonner with the award during the Cobb Chamber of Commerce's annual dinner at the Cobb Galleria Centre before an audience of 1,100.

"Mrs. Bonner has done so much for so many in this community," Brumby said. "Cobb County is a better place because of her decades of tireless efforts and leadership.

Initially overcome with emotion when her name was announced, Bonner received a standing ovation as she took the stage.

Bonner said this had been a difficult week with the deaths of such friends as David Hankerson and former Marietta City Councilman Van Pearlberg.

"I have had a hard week because my heart was hurting from some of the people that were near and dear to me, but when (Cobb Chamber CEO) Sharon Mason said you're going to be sitting at the Braves table, I was real happy about that," Bonner said with her trademark humor.

Bonner, who is 88, spoke of growing up as "a little Black girl" in the segregated town of Weirton, West Virginia, thinking the only job she could ever have was that of a maid, as that was the job of her mother.

"And tonight to be standing here to see this Citizen of the Year Award, do you know how much that means?" she asked, as the audience roared with applause.

Bonner called for her husband, retired Air Force veteran Jesse Bonner, to join her on stage. She spoke of knowing him since he was 15, of the life they have shared together, and that while they both have health issues, they have each other.

Bonner also noted her daughter, Jeriene Bonner Willis, who succeeded her as

Cobb NAACP president, was in attendance with her husband, Gus Willis.

"Thank each and every one of you for being here tonight and sharing this night with me, and thank you for indulging me," Bonner said. "I'm humbled and rarely without words, but thank you, thank you for this great honor."

Described as "the moral conscience of the community," Bonner served as president of the Cobb NAACP for 20 years, where she was at the forefront of civil rights activism in Cobb County and Georgia. Under her leadership, the Cobb NAACP developed many community based presents in the leadership, the Cobb NAACP developed many community-based programs, including voter registration drives, education forums, partnering with the county to host the annual Martin Luther King Jr. Day observance, and hosting the Juneteenth celebration on Marietta Square long before President Joe Biden recognized it as a national holiday.

WHAT OTHERS HAVE SAID.

Former Georgia Attorney General and Cobb County Chairman Sam Olens has quipped how he used to be a lot taller until he met Bonner.

The nice thing about her from the get go, Olens has said, is that while Bonner

had requests of him, they were appropriate and needed requests.

"And she would cajole you to improve the community. And when people are polite, and friendly and right, your obligation is to do what they say, and improve the community. And I think when you see Cobb County now, it's very different than it was, say, in 1980. And the improvement has been very, very positive to our county, and a large part of that improvement is due to Deane," Olens has said.

While serving as Cobb's district attorney, Vic Reynolds, now a Superior Court judge, said it was through conversations with Bonner that he came to consider the importance of alternative ways of sentencing nonviolent first offenders through accountability courts.

And at her 86th birthday party, newly elected Cobb County Sheriff Craig Owens, the first African-American sheriff to serve Cobb County, said Bonner had been a mother to him ever since he started at the Cobb police department more than three decades ago.

Every year, beginning in 1963, the MDJ has presented the Citizen of the Year Award to a distinguished and deserving individual who has made Cobb County a better place to live. The award has previously gone to such luminaries as the late U.S. Sen. Johnny Isakson, the late former Kennesaw State University President Betty Siegel, former Gov. Roy Barnes; former Lockheed Chief Lee Rhyant, and the late Cobb County Manager David Hankerson.

ACWORTH UPDATES ZONING AND SIGN **ORDINANCE**

As a recently elected alderman in Acworth it is important to keep my campaign promises and one of the biggest asks of my now constituents is "sunshine" as we manage the people's business. I am doing my best to update activity of importance via social media but sometimes it's best to use the tried and true method of your local newspaper. Therefore, I will try and submit relative information here in the Brightside from time to time.

This month I would like to inform our citizens that we have updated our zoning and sign ordinances. These new ordinances took effect upon being approved in February of this year. I will not wander too deep in the weeds but would like to highlight at a high level what was driving the need for the update and touch on some of the more critical changes in our code. First, it has been several decades since our zoning ordinance was updated so it was time to be sure we can address current needs and trends in commercial and residential development. Another reason for the update is our desire to preserve our historical districts within the city. As undeveloped land becomes more and more rare, the city has moved to a logical next step for new residential development which is what we call "in-fill". In-fill is when new real estate is being built within current neighborhoods. This happens several ways but a few examples are building on vacant lots that were historically cost prohibitive to develop, demolition of existing homes on a lot, and dividing large lots to add new houses adjacent to the original home on the lot. Using one of the preceding examples, many of the homes in the historic downtown area of Acworth are built on large lots. It is possible to subdivide these lots and add adjacent homes within the historic neighborhood. It is up to the city leaders to protect the look and feel of our historic areas through the zoning and variance ordinance which give clearly defined guidelines for building within these confines. The last critical change I would like to highlight is around our variances and the tightening of requirements in order to request and get variances. As mentioned earlier, as undeveloped land becomes scarce, it is the mayor and board of aldermen's responsibility to our citizens to grow carefully and not allow development to be squeezed into a space where it does not fit either physically or aesthetically.






