NOAH PRASER CONGRATULATIONS

In a surprise announcement, Harrison High School senior Noah Praser learned he had earned the Navy Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (NJROTC) Joseph C. Gilliam Academic Achievement Award for area 9.

Cadet Praser, who serves as the unit's executive officer, is the first cadet from the North Cobb-Harrison NJROTC program to receive the elite scholarship

In addition to earning the top NJROTC scholarship, Cadet Praser earned appointments to two service academies. In the fall, he will attend the United States Naval Academy as a midshipman.



Opening in 1905, a cotton mill was located in Acworth along the railroad tracks east of Cowan Road. It went through many name changes over the years, and in the 1930s, it was the Acworth Mills. Due to a mysterious



disappearance, it gained statewide attention in early 1936.

From 1927 to 1935, Paul Ackerley was president of the Acworth Mills. He lived in Atlanta but was considered a leader of the Acworth business community. In December, he decided to go on a fishing trip to the Gulf of Mexico with his dog. He left for Florida on December 9 and was never seen again. When he did not return for Christmas, his wife and son got nervous. Search crews searched across Tampa, Apalachicola, Ochlocknee Bay, and Cedar Key. The Coast Guard sent airplanes and

The Coast Guard sent airplanes and several boats for the hunt. Two bodies were found, but Ackerley's dentist determined it was not his patient. What happened to Ackerly remains unknown, though the authorities believed his sailboat likely sunk in a storm.

ACWORTH CHRISTIAN CHURCH DEDICATION

The City of Acworth and the Acworth Historic Preservation Commission dedicated a plaque to commemorate the Acworth Christian Church as a local Historic Landmark on Wednesday, April 10 Acworth Christian Church is located at 4476 Northside Drive with additional parking available at the public parking lot behind the church. HISTORIC CHURCH IN ACWORTH RESTORED

It was a community effort, led by Mack Turner, President of Save Acworth History Foundation, Betsy Brown, VP of SAHF, Acworth Alderman, Tim Richardson, along with Ed Manning and Ben Buroughs (two members of the church). All five served on the restoration committee

A leaking roof, crumbling foundation, broken windows were just some of the needed repairs to the building. Funds for the \$250,000 renovation were generated by the sale of the church's parsonage

that was no longer used, along with a public fundraiser, led by the SAHF. The community, including the City of Acworth, Acworth residents, parishioners and local historians, stepped forward to help restore the church in the midst of a global pandemic.

The Acworth Christian Church was designated as a Local Historic Landmark in May 2022. The Acworth Christian Church was organized in 1858 as the Mount Zion Church of Christ and met in a frame building on Mitchell Hill. That building was destroyed during the Civil War. In 1877 Nathan Smith helped to reorganize and build a new church at it's current site. That building burned in 1899 and the current structure was built in 1901 and restored through the efforts of the community and the people mentioned above during 2020 and 2021.

M2R TRAILFEST RETURNS MAY 11TH AN IMMERSIVE CELEBRATION OF THE ARTS ALONG MARIETTA'S MOUNTAIN TO RIVER TRAIL Immerse yourself in art and fun at this year's M2R TrailFest on Saturday, May 11. This annual public arts festival on the Mountain to River Trail



will feature the debut of numerous art installations, as well as performances that can only be enjoyed during the festival. Art performances, live music and visual installations can be enjoyed along the trail, which stretches from Lewis Park near WellStar Kennestone Hospital, trackside along the Marietta Square, ending at the pedestrian bridge near Brown Park.

Sculptures in Atherton Square debut during the festival, along with additions to the existing mural program and free art drops. The popular M2R Fence Art Gallery featuring photography and original artwork will stretch nearly a mile alongside the trail and will be on display for sixty days before embarking on a yearlong, countywide tour.

This year's festival will also include the second annual Fur Folly Pet Parade. Pets and their owners are encouraged to dress in costume and celebrate in their own artful way. The folly will travel along the M2R trail from Lewis Park Dog Park to Atherton Square in historic downtown Marietta (approximately one mile) in advance of the Opening Ceremonies at noon. Staging begins at 9:30am with a parade start at 10am. Opening Ceremonies will be held at 12pm in Atherton Square (behind Cool Beans and the Marietta Welcome Center), the center point of TrailFest. Dancers and aerialists will perform through 6pm at Atherton Square, while musicians will perform at Alley Stage, located at 11 Anderson Street. Festival goers can choose their path North or South along the trail, passing sculpture installations and vibrant murals along the way. Brightly colored lucite bridge installations, a tradition since 2020, will once again return to the pedestrian bridges over the North and South 120 Loops.

REP. DEVAN SEABAUGH'S SQUATTER REFORM ACT SIGNED INTO LAW

ATLANTA – On April 24, 2024, State Representative Devan Seabaugh (R-Marietta) and other legislators joined Governor Brian Kemp as he signed House Bill 1017, also known as the Squatter Reform Act, into law.



"With the Squatter Reform Act now signed into law, we reaffirm our stance against unwanted intruders in our state, making it clear that their actions are criminal and will face consequences," said Rep. Seabaugh. "I commend my legislative colleagues for their diligent efforts in pushing forward this vital measure, which will empower Georgia's property owners to address intrusive squatters in an effective manner."

"Squatters have been stealing the American dream of homeownership, and this bill puts a stop to that in Georgia," said Rep. Matt Reeves (R-Duluth), the bill's co-sponsor.

House Bill 1017 establishes the offense of unlawful squatting, defining it as entering and residing on the land or premises of the owner without consent. Offenders will receive a citation requiring them to provide authorization of consent within three days. Failure to do so will result in arrest for criminal trespass. If documentation is provided,

a hearing will be heard in Magistrate Court within seven days to determine if the documents have merit. False swearing and the submission of improper or fraudulent documentation will lead to felony arrest, removal and the squatter will be subject to additional fines to cover damages, back rent based on the property's fair market value and up to a year in jail. This bill became effective upon the governor's signature.
