

Kennesaw State University's Bentley Rare Book Museum opened its newest exhibit on October 25. Titled "A Library of Libraries: Private Collections in the Bentley Rare Book



Museum," the exhibition focuses on the men and women whose collections helped shape the museum.

Curator JoyEllen Williams decided to focus on five individuals for this event. The first, Dr. Horace Sturgis, was the first president of KSU and a collector of fine bindings. Sturgis is also the namesake of the school's Kennesaw Campus library. Next is the collection of Robert de Treville Lawrence III, who donated his family's collection in 1996. Their collection highlights both family history and their deep Cobb County roots.

After her death in 2023, the family of Doris Preston Ramsay gave her library to the Bentley. It reflects well her tastes as an avid reader, her love of children's literature, and her husband's work as a doctor. Next is a selection of books by Dr. John Greider, the first chair of the humanities department at Kennesaw Junior College in 1966. Dr. Greider's collection shows the value of books in teaching and scholarship. Last but not least, there are three books owned by Martin Luther King Jr.'s family members, showing how books can offer connections to some of history's most influential individuals.

In addition to the five main cases, there are a variety of panels on the history of private libraries and other local collectors, including Marietta lawyer Fred Bentley Sr. and Southern Polytechnic State University librarian John

This exhibition will be open until September 2025. The Bentley Rare Book Museum is on the ground floor of the Sturgis Library at Kennesaw State University and is open Monday-Friday from 10 AM to 4 PM.





CAMERON CLAY, A KENNESAW, GA SERVICE MEMBER REUNITED WITH DOG FOR FIRST TIME AT FOX NATION'S PATRIOT AWARDS

At FOX Nation's sixth annual Patriot Awards in November on Long Island, the non-profit organization Paws of War was awarded FOX Nation's Award for Service for their "War-Torn Pups and Cats" program, which has reunited service members with more than 600 dogs and cats they bonded with on deployment and had to leave behind. Each animal is rescued, flown to the U.S. and trained at no cost to the service member. Unbeknownst to the audience, Paws of War brought home Feyre from Kosovo who was then reunited with Claye on stage for the first time in 2 months.

See below for the acceptance speech from Robert Misseri, the co-founder of Paws of War, as well as the touching moment Clay and Feyre met again.

MISSERI: Thank you. Unfortunately, I have to have a little cheat sheet here. But this award is very special to us, obviously. And it's something that we want to share with not just Paws of War, but our veterans that are here, our service, our military members like Cameron (ph), our donors, our volunteers, our passionate volunteers and staff that make all this work. So, this is more about them than us. I think that what people don't realize is when a military member is serving overseas. They are not sure -- they're trained for a lot. They're not trained to find this little puppy or a kitten that they fall in love with. And then, they have to come back, and there's very little options for them to bring that animal back. And that's what we do. We have -- 10 years, we have been rescuing animals from shelters in Baltimore to bases in Baghdad. And we fortunately have placed many, many dogs with veterans as service dogs.

HANNITY: Robert, in addition to the dogs on the stage with us tonight, there were kind of a handful, you have a surprise for Specialist Clay.

MISSERI: We do. 






2024 ACWORTH CITIZEN OF THE YEAR Corporal Tamara Severtson, Acworth Police Department

Upon completing her internship, she was offered a position as a Detention Officer in the Acworth City Jail, where she served from 2013 to 2015. In 2020, she took on the additional responsibility of becoming a certified Field Training Officer (FTO), where she has been instrumental in mentoring and shaping the next generation of police officers at the Acworth Police Department. Recently, she was promoted to the rank of Corporal, a well-deserved position that will enable her to further demonstrate her leadership abilities and help shape the department for years to come.

CENTER FOR FAMILY RESOURCES HELP GRANDPARENTS FIND RESOURCES AND A STABLE HOME

Kyle and Nicole Daniels are typical, loving grandparents. According to Kyle, the couple will do anything to ensure that their granddaughter with special needs grows up safe and happy, even if that means losing their senior housing.

While the Daniels qualified for federally funded senior housing, Kyle says the program does not allow children. So, when the Daniels obtained full custody of their granddaughter, they were forced to scramble for housing.

'I believe these restrictions single out thousands of grandmothers and grandfathers, who-out of necessity and the best interests of a child-are raising grandchildren," says Kyle. "This forced us to live in a hotel as we had nowhere to turn. That is until we found The Center for Family Resources.'

The Daniels first reached out to The CFR looking for resources. Initially, the Cobb County-based not-for-profit was able to provide food for the family through the organization's choice pantry, The Family Cupboard and then heard of an opening with the Marietta Housing Authority (MHA). The CFR case managers helped the family through the application process, assisted in getting new furniture and supplies, and helped the family move in last year. The team also coached the Daniels through some financial situations and still provide on-going food resources

The Daniels say they are pleased with the services provided by The CFR. "Working with this organization allows a family to take care of their child and not [have her enter] the DFACs (Georgia Department of Children & Families) system," says Nicole. "We did not want our own granddaughter to have to endure the trauma of living with a stranger. She is our family, and we are trying to take care of our responsibility.
