### **KENNESAW CELEBRATES INDEPENDENCE DAY** WITH SALUTE TO AMERICA ON JULY 3

The City of Kennesaw will host its annual Independence Day celebration of freedom, music and fireworks on Thursday, July 3, from 6 to 10 p.m. in Downtown Kennesaw. Admission is free. Salute to America will feature live music, food vendors and family-friendly activities. The evening will conclude with a fireworks finale at 9:30 p.m., visible along Main Street.

Live music from the United Bankshares Amphitheater at Depot Park will be headlined by Guardians of the Jukebox at 8 p.m., with Girls Night Out performing at 7 p.m. and Tripp'n kicking things off at 6 p.m.

In addition to street vendors and sponsor booths, the event will offer ticketed inflatable amusements for children. A wide variety of entrées, cold beverages and snacks will be available for purchase. Guests are welcome to bring picnic baskets or coolers; however, grills and coolers larger than 20 quarts are not permitted. ### KENNESAW DEPOT'S STORY BOARD Andrew J. Bramlett

In the past three issues of the Bright Side, I have highlighted the new downtown storyboard



signs that have information about Kennesaw's history. Each of these markers was developed by the City of Kennesaw's Economic Development Department to promote downtown tourism. I began in March with an article on the Kennesaw City Cemetery. This was followed by the story of the Big Shanty Spring, before turning our attention to Memorial Park. Lastly, this month we will look at the Kennesaw Depot, which has stood in the heart of the community for over 125 years.

Big Shanty (modern Kennesaw) had a depot building before the Civil War, which was burned by General Sherman's army in 1864. Just after the war, a new depot building was built that looked more

like a shed than a proper depot. It would serve the community for about twenty-five years. When the Nashville, Chattanooga, and St. Louis Railroad took over the railroad line in 1890, they found the building inadequate.

In 1893, construction began on a replacement building. The old depot was moved further away from the tracks, up Cherokee Street to near where the yellow Carrie House is today. The new depot for Kennesaw opened in March 1893. Just nine years later, it would be expanded, and another expansion occurred in the 1920s.

In the 1960s, the last passenger train stopped at the Kennesaw Depot. Because the railroad had stood at the heart of the community for decades, the city purchased the building to preserve it. The building has been used for a number of purposes – event space, reenactor barracks, welcome center, and local history museum – and is now the centerpiece of Depot Park. Though few remember when the depot was used by passengers, it remains an important symbol of our town's origins and history.

### ABOUT DYSLEXIA

If you are familiar with dyslexia, a learning disorder that affects a person's reading speed and accuracy, then you may have heard that boys are more likely to have dyslexia than girls. While it is true that boys are diagnosed with dyslexia more frequently than girls, research suggests that this long held belief may not be true. Further research is needed for a definitive answer on if boys are more likely to have dyslexia than girls, but researchers at the University of Florida believe that both genders are equally likely to have dyslexia. As to why boys are more likely to be diagnosed than girls, this quote from the University's Literacy Center sums it up, "Girls more often than boys tend to struggle quietly and, therefore, their difficulties may go unnoticed." There are a few theories as to why girls often struggle quietly while their dyslexic male peers receive help, but there does not seem to be any one specific cause or simple solution. The most important thing to take away from this article is that dyslexia does not just affect boys. Regardless of a student's gender, parents and teachers should familiarize themselves with the signs of dyslexia:

Trouble sounding out words •Mispronouncing words •Slow and/or inaccurate reading •Trouble identifying the sounds of letters •Trouble with or inability to spell words •Confusing similar words •Issues with remembering words

Early intervention for dyslexic students is key to improving learning outcomes and lessening the impact of secondary issues that affect people with dyslexia such as anxiety, depression, low self-esteem, etc.


