NCHS'S STATE **CHAMPION JASMINE ROBINSON RECOGNIZED AT ALL-METRO** BANQUET

Atlanta Track Club honored its 2025 All-Metro Track and Field Team, spotlighting 57 of the region's top high school athletes at a ceremony in which four competitors – who together won seven state titles and broke two state records — were named Outstanding Athletes of the Year.

Jasmine Robinson of North Cobb High School repeated as Girls' Track Athlete of the Year following a season that established her among the all-time greats in Georgia - and the nation. The junior swept the GHSA Class 6A titles in the 100-meter and 300-meter hurdles, with times of 13.22 and 39.81 seconds, respectively. Her 300 hurdles mark broke the Georgia state record and made her just the third high school girl in U.S. history to go sub 40 seconds — joining a group whose members went on to win Olympic and world titles. Robinson now holds Georgia's all-time best in the 300 hurdles and ranks No. 2 in the 100 hurdles, currently sitting second nationally in both events. A three-time state champion in the 300 hurdles and a two-time All-Metro honoree, Robinson is reshaping expectations for high school track.



TOWN CENTER COMMUNITY CELEBRATES **BIKESHARE PROGRAM 10TH ANNIVERSARY**

In celebration of its 10-year anniversary, the Town Center Community is enhancing its popular bikeshare program with new e-bikes and an upgraded pedal-bike fleet sponsored by Georgia Power. A system integration with Kennesaw State University (KSU) will also launch in-time for the upcoming fall semester. These updates aim to increase connectivity, improve rider experience, and support active transportation throughout the district.

In July 10 pedal-assist e-bikes will be added to the existing fleet while the original 35 pedal bikes will be upgraded with a new design. The update builds on a decade of steady growth for the program, which recently celebrated 100,000 total rides since its launch in 2015.

To further improve regional mobility, the Town Center bikeshare system will soon integrate with KSU's bikeshare program. Once connected, KSU students will be able to rent and return bikes interchangeably between KSU Marietta Campus, Town Center, and new soon-to-open stations on the Kennesaw Campus. Non-KSU users will continue to rent and return bikes at designated Town Center locations only.

During the 10-year anniversary of our bikeshare program, we're proud to make it even easier for residents, visitors and students to move around our community," said Tracy Styf, executive director of Town Center Community. "This expansion is about increasing access, supporting sustainability and enhancing everyday connections within our district.'

Currently, the Town Center bikeshare program operates 24/7 with 45 bikes across six strategically located stations. The addition of e-bikes and upgraded pedal bikes responds to growing demand for efficient, eco-friendly transportation options.

LOCAL HISTORY STORIES Andrew J. Bramlett

In 1901, one local resident saved a freight train and became a part of railroad lore: sixteen-year-old Nannie Jordan.

Nancy Jordan, who went by Nannie, was born in 1885 and lived along the railroad tracks north of Kennesaw Mountain. The site is today near the National Park Service's overflow parking lot.

Jordan's father worked for the railroad, so she was very familiar with the train schedule. In June of 1901, a heavy rain began to pour around the Jordan home. Looking through a window, the young Nannie Jordan saw debris clogging a culvert. As water accumulated, the tracks began to erode away.

Jordan knew that a freight train was scheduled to pass by her house soon and that the damage to the tracks would likely cause a wreck. She ran northwards to warn the train engineers, H.E. Ducket and E.O. Steele. Because of her warning, a disaster was averted. On Christmas Eve of that year, the railroad presented her with a golden pocket watch for her heroism. Nannie Jordan passed away in 1957 and was laid to rest in Marietta. According to legend, railroad engineers passing by the Marietta City Cemetery after her death would blow their train's horn in memory of her heroism.

While sending their children to private school can be a dream for some families, it can be a necessity for others. For children who cannot thrive in a large public school, they must have a smaller environment in order to be successful. Accepting the fact that a child needs

Any student who has an IEP or a 504 plan in a public school is eligible for the Georgia Special Needs Scholarship, also known as the sb10 scholarship.
