#### **SMITH-GILBERT GARDENS IS NOW OPEN**

Smith-Gilbert Gardens is now re-opened to the public, with regular hours resuming as follows: Tuesdays through Saturdays, 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. A formal ribbon cutting ceremony took place on Friday, September 5, at 10 a.m.

The Gardens have undergone extensive renovations designed to improve visitor experience and accessibility. Upgrades include the addition of accessible restrooms, nearly a mile of paved walking paths, enhanced parking accessibility, improvements to the bonsai and butterfly exhibits, and new garden beds and interactive features designed for children in the Living Laboratory garden area. A new covered pavilion will also provide a versatile space for events and educational programming. Following the reopening, the historic Hiram Butler House will receive further enhancements funded by the State of Georgia. These improvements support Smith-Gilbert Gardens' mission to be a resource for conservation, education and the enjoyment of horticulture, fine arts and historic preservation

A highlight of the reopening is the expanded Garden with Wings Butterfly Exhibit. The exhibit will be open Tuesdays through Saturdays, 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., until Septembeer 27, 2025, and offers an immersive experience showcasing native butterflies and their full life cycles. Visitors will explore host and nectar plants essential to butterfly survival, including tulip poplar and passionflower vine.

Timed-entry tickets are required for all visitors to the Butterfly House, including members, and may be purchased online or at the Gardens Gift Shop for \$3 per person. Due to limited capacity, advanced ticket purchase is strongly encouraged. Members enjoy complimentary access but are asked to reserve tickets in advance. All guests will check in at the Hiram Butler House, where wristbands and timed entry cards will be distributed.

Please note that the Butterfly House is not fully ADA-accessible due to narrow pathways, and strollers are not permitted. However, wheelchairs are allowed and accommodation for guests with mobility needs will be provided whenever possible.

Returning this season is the popular Adopt a Butterfly campaign. For a donation of \$20 or

more, supporters receive a waterproof vinyl sticker set featuring custom artwork of a monarch butterfly and eastern tiger swallowtail. Adoptions are available online and at the Gardens Gift Shop. #### THE HARD AND THE BEAUTIFUL



Roger Hines, well known Cobb County English Teacher and columnist has written a book - about being one of 17 children growing up in Mississippi. Named the Hard and the Beautiful, the book is available from Amazon.com. Search for it under Roger Hines.

The Hard and the Beautiful chronicles the lives of a Mississippi tenant farmer, his wife, and their seventeen children. Woven through seven decades from the farmer's birth to his youngest child's nineteenth birthday, these chronicles provide a picture of familial stability that prevailed in spite of poverty. Roger Hines, the sixteenth of the seventeen children, celebrates his parents, his ten sisters, and six brothers. He traces the distinct historical time periods in which his parents and all of his siblings were born and grew up

Though his family's circumstances were often difficult, Hines differentiates between material poverty and poverty of the soul and argues that material poverty is not the worst kind. He raises

such questions as: what exactly are the forces that have weakened America's families the last fifty years? How did his own family escape fracture and enjoy being a family with deep, loving relationships?

The Hard and the Beautiful explores fatherhood and challenges readers to acknowledge our current need for faithful dads. It describes a family blessed by humble parents who modeled character and consistency and taught their children to do the same.

#### CONGRATULATIONS EAGLE SCOUTS TRIPP FORBES AND CARSON POPE

On Saturday, August 30, 2025, Troop 24, Cartersville, held a ceremony in honor of Tripp Forbes and Carson Pope completing the requirements to become Eagle Scouts. In addition to the requirement of achieving serval badges, the Scouts were required to complete a project that would benefit their community.. Tripp's project involved the cleaning out of flowerbeds and installing new landscaping at the city offices in White, Georgia. #### **DECORATE DOWNTOWN KENNESAW**



The City of Kennesaw invites residents, families, businesses, schools, local organizations and community groups to help decorate downtown through two popular seasonal programs: Scarecrows on Main and Holiday Extravaganza at Depot Park.

#### **Scarecrows on Main**

Participants are invited to design and display a freestanding scarecrow along Main Street. Scarecrows will be installed between Thursday, Sept. 25, and Sunday, Sept. 28. Assigned locations will be provided by Thursday, Sept. 18. Displays must be removed between Thursday, Nov. 6, and Sunday, Nov. 9.

Scarecrows must fit within a 4-by-4-foot space and be stable, weather-resistant and family-friendly. Real pumpkins and ground stakes are not permitted. All materials must be provided by the participant, and

all displays must comply with event rules and guidelines.

The application deadline is Sunday, Sept. 14. The participation fee is \$25, payable to the Kennesaw Downtown Development Authority. Space is limited to 75 scarecrow spots. All proceeds benefit downtown beautification projects and events.

#### Holiday Extravaganza

Participants in the Holiday Extravaganza will receive a 6-foot artificial, unlit tree and a metal stake for display in Depot Park. All other decorations must be supplied by the participant. Solar-powered lights are allowed; electricity will not be provided.

Trees will be decorated between Saturday, Nov. 22, and Sunday, Nov. 30, and must be removed by Sunday, Jan. 11, 2026. Trees will remain City property and should not be removed.

All decorations must be securely attached and suitable for public display. Participants are responsible for regularly maintaining their tree. The application deadline is Sunday, Nov. 16. The participation fee is \$25. Space is limited to 75 trees.

#### **LOCAL HISTORY STORIES**

The City of Kennesaw's birthday is coming up on Monday,



September 21, 2025. Exactly 138 years before, the Georgia General Assembly passed the act officially incorporating
Kennesaw. Within a

few months, a mayor was elected for the young community.

The earliest discussions about Kennesaw's incorporation were in September 1886, when the Marietta Journal's Kennesaw correspondent noted there had been "some talk" of the idea. Local citizens chose the name Kennesaw to honor the nearby mountain, even though the community had traditionally been called Big Shanty. Since the Civil War, Kennesaw had become a popular alternative name for the community, partly because it sounded more refined than Big Shanty.

A bill was presented in the Georgia House in July of the following year by A. S. Clay, a future Senator. The General Assembly approved it on September 21, 1887. The town limits were set at "one-half mile from the depot," and there would be a mayor and four councilmembers. According to the Articles, no fine could exceed \$30 or thirty days, and no alcohol licenses could be granted. Both of these provisions would eventually be removed.

The citizens of Kennesaw were excited to create their own government, with the Marietta Journal saying they were "well pleased."



# UNDERSTANDING COBB'S PROPERTY TAXES By Steve Prather, Acworth City Alderman

I would like to take a moment to share information on your local property taxes to enlighten you on how it works in Cobb County and local municipalities (the 7 cities in Cobb). I wanted to share for a couple reasons. First, last year was the first year I did not pay a "school tax" which means my annual property tax bill dropped by 80%. You heard me right, if you are 64 AND HAVE FILED FOR THIS EXEMPTION an annual Cobb property tax bill dropped from \$2,500 in the past, to closer to \$500. It is imperative that you do your research and file for the senior school tax exemption because it is not automatic and I have met a few folks who paid the extra tax for several years. That can be an expensive oversight and you do not get it back once it has been paid. Secondly, it's that time of year when some of us receive our new home assessment and we all start to hear the news about raising our taxes if the millage rate is not lowered. However, I have a secret – that is not exactly accurate. Your Cobb and city property taxes for the general fund do not go up when your home value increases. How could that be possible, you ask? In the county and our cities we have a magic button called "Floating Homestead" which means your homestead exemption changes up and down to match property value changes for all homesteaded properties (meaning your main residence that you own and live in full time). In essence your taxes are frozen (up or down) unless the millage rate is changed. That is the opposite of what gets reported and I agree it is a "head scratcher" why they have to get us all worked up telling us our taxes are going up. This is a requirement dictated by laws established by our Georgia Assembly and they almost seem to take pleasure in confusing us at least once a year

take pleasure in confusing us at least once a year.

We, of course, are not completely off the hook for increased taxes. There are a couple of gotchas in there that I also feel you should be alerted to. A key one is floating homestead does not apply to the school tax (remember the 80% part of your property taxes if not 64 or older). Therefore it is still critical to watch your assessments and act if they do not reflect the true value of your home. It is also important to note that "non-homestead" properties (commercial and residential rentals, for example) also do not have floating homestead exemptions so when their value goes up so do their taxes. Of course, the landlord passes it on to the tenant and the tenant passes it on you, the consumer, so at the end of the day it is an additional consumption tax we do pay.



# THE EYE IS THE LAMP OF THE BODY. MARLON LONGACRE, ASSISTANT PASTOR. PIEDMONT CHURCH

The eye is the lamp of the body. If your eyes are good, your whole body will be full of

light. But if your eyes are bad, your whole body will be full of darkness." Matthew 6:22-23. I got a text and an email from Marietta Eye Clinic last week. It is time for my yearly

eye exam. One more year to be reminded that I am blind as a bat. I cannot see squat without my glasses or contacts on.

So many times, I hear these phrases concerning sight. "I just do not see how I ever going hange." "I do not see my marriage getting any better." "I do not see any hope for the "I just do not see a way out of this hopeless situation."

When people say, "I just do not see," they are using a phrase of hopelessness. How you see life determines your strength, it determines everything in your life. How you see your life. How you see God. How you see your past, present, and how you see your future. I could go on and on here because everything in your life is affected by your perspective.

Jesus in Matthew 6:22-23 is talking about more than just physical sight. He is talking about vision. He is talking about perspective. He is talking about seeing with spiritual eyes. What He is saying here is that perspective is everything. It is so important for us to see life clearly, that we see life correctly, that we see life comprehensively and completely, that we learn to see life from God's viewpoint.

Learning to see life from God's viewpoint in the Bible is called wisdom.

One of the goals of the staff of Piedmont is to help you become a wiser person. Everything we do at Piedmont is to help you learn to see everything in your life from God's point of view. Why? Because He always sees it correctly and typically, we do not see it correctly. We have a limited perspective. We see it with cloudy vision. I see it through coke bottle thick glasses. So much of the time we do not know where we are headed and have no idea what is going to happen next. We lack focus, clarity, and direction.

Over the next few EPIC emails, I want us to examine Mark 8. Jesus does three things with His disciples. He uses a misunderstanding, a miracle, and a critical questions to help people get a better vision and handle on what we are supposed to be doing in life. The lessons He teaches in this passage will help us when we cannot see our way clearly. Superintendent Ragsdale also mentioned how one teacher told him that CITA and Cobb's commitment to CTAE is causing surrounding metro districts to "catch up to us."
