The theme for Wreaths Across America 2025 is "Keep Moving Forward". This theme was inspired by the final words spoken by U.S. Army Captain, Joshua Byers, who was killed in action in Iraq, 2003. On July 23, 2003 as the company was getting ready to move from AR Ramadi to AL Fallujah,

Josh was the lead vehicle of the convoy. About two miles out of AL Fallujah an IED was detonated and struck the Humvee that he was in along with three other soldiers and his interpreter. As the smoke was filling the air Josh gave a last command to his driver to "Keep Moving Forward." This command saved lives. Josh was 29 years old. Josh told his family before he deployed "there is no better way to die than in service to my beloved country."

Remember our fallen men and women; honor those who ve; and teach the next generation the value of Freedom.

Wreaths Across America is an organization that continues to focus on our veterans and military families and bring attention to the needs of our Veteran community. It will be a heartwarming experience for you even though

KSU NAMES RARE BOOK MUSEUM FOR ROBERT B. WILLIAMS



On the 40th anniversary of its founding, Kennesaw State University's Department of Museums, Archives, and Rare Books announced the naming of the Robert B. Williams Rare Book Museum honoring a longtime benefactor and administrator.

The former director of Horace W. Sturgis Library, Williams' career as a Kennesaw State administrator spanned from 1986 to 2009. His personal cash, in-kind, and planned giving to KSU are well into the seven-figures and include thousands

of rare books and signature artifacts.

Originally called the Bentley Rare Book Gallery in 1986 and named for Marietta lawyer Fred Bentley Sr. and his wife, Sara, the collection has grown dramatically in 40 years. In addition to the Bentleys, KSU has had other notable donors, however, it is the many donations from Robert B. Williams that has given the collection its distinct identity and central purpose.

"In 2017, the Rare Book Gallery transitioned to a museum with more than 10,000 items," Curator JoyEllen Williams said. "They range from Sumerian clay tablets and medieval manuscript leaves to modern fine press books and literary first editions."

The museum's mission is to build a collection that documents the history of books in the English-speaking world from significant historical periods. There are several signature pieces in the museum, including:

•A 1502 edition of Dante's Divine Comedy annotated by a sixteenth-century Italian reader.
•A rare copy of the Declaration of Independence from the 1840s. •A world-class collection of early printed works by Geoffrey Chaucer.•A notable Shakespeare collection, including a 1685 Fourth Folio and excerpts of a 1632 Second Folio.

Williams' gift ensures that the museum will continue to offer rich and engaging educational opportunities for generations to come.

"We owe a debt of gratitude to the Bentleys, who helped start the collection, and the Bentley Rare Book Gallery will remain a prominent part of the museum," said Tamara Livingston, executive director of Museums, Archives & Rare Books. "The naming of the museum after Bob Williams promises to be a very exciting next chapter in the museum's history."

The Williams Rare Book Museum is open Monday-Friday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. It is located in the Horace W. Sturgis Library at 385 Cobb Ave., NW, Kennesaw, Georgia and is free and open to the public.

The residents of the cemetery featured on this year's tour are connected to the local individuals whose names we pass by every day, but do not often know who they were.

This one-hour walking tour, where the last tour each day is after dark, covers a variety of uneven surfaces. These include dirt, grass and grass hills, asphalt and/or gravel roads. Attendees will be required to navigate around headstones and small walls surrounding some family plots. This tour is not recommended for those with wheelchairs, walkers, crutches, mobility or balance challenges. (An online tour is available at kennesawcemetery.org.) Pets are not allowed in the cemetery at any time.







MARIETTA'S GARDEN CENTER IS 175 YEARS OLD!

Recently, the Marietta Educational Garden Center celebrated the 175th birthday of its historic home, Fair Oaks, and the rich history it represents.

Located at 505 Kennesaw Avenue at the foot of Kennesaw Mountain, the property was once part of a Cherokee Indian Trail and later became the site of the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain. The home was built between 1850–1852 by the Newton family, crafted with handmade nails, wooden pegs, and heart-of-pine floors. Over the years, it passed through several families, including Mrs. Meyers, who named it "Fair Oaks" for the stately oaks that flanked the front door. Clara and Howard Benson were the final private owners, living in the home for more than 40 years before generously donating the property.

Today, Fair Oaks continues to stand as a treasured part of Marietta's history and an elegant space for gatherings.
