Veterans Day does not include an apostrophe but does include an "s" at the end - Veterans. Why: because it is a day to honor All veterans of the United States, living or dead. It is a day tosay to all veterans "Happy Veterans Day." The term "veteran" means a person who served in the active military, naval, or air service, and who was discharged or released therefrom under conditions other than dishonorable. Celebration of Veterans day is November 11 of each year. Veterans Day began November 11, 1918 when Allied powers signed a cease fire agreement with Germany - the 11th day of the 11th month at 11 a.m. This brought to an end World WarI. Originally called Armistice Day, in 1954 at the urging of major U.S. Veteran organizations, Armistice Day was renamed Veterans Day. Many ask the question, "What is the difference in Memorial Day and Veterans Day?" Memorial Day honors those who have died in military service, while Veterans Day in November honors all veterans living and dead. Military service has touched most American families; Today, November 11, 2025 over 18,500,000 Americans living have served in the military. The service flags of the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force and Coast Guard surround the American Flag. The concrete dome structure is surrounded by a paver walkway with engraved pavers.

You can honor a veteran by purchasing pavers. The pavers are available in 4×4 or 8×8 sizes. With the 4×4, you get 3 lines, each with up to 18 characters engraved on the pavers. The 8×8 comes with 4 lines, each with up to 18 characters engraved on it.

COBB PUBLIC SAFETY HEROES HONORED

AT 2025 AWARDS **LUNCHEON**

The Cobb Chamber honored Cobb County's finest Monday, October 6, during its annual Public Safety Appreciation Luncheon. Below is one of the highest honors awarded.



The Award of Valor is one of the highest honors in public safety, recognizing extraordinary courage in the face of imminent danger. It is reserved for individuals who, without hesitation, place themselves at great personal risk to protect others and safeguard the community.

Officer Rahim Somani, Cobb County Police Department

On December 5, 2024, Officer Rahim Somani displayed extraordinary courage and selflessness while off duty. Driving home from his shift at Precinct 4, he came upon a multi-vehicle crash on I-285. One vehicle

was already engulfed in flames, and a man was trapped inside-bleeding, disoriented, and pinned beneath the dashboard.

Recognizing the urgency, Officer Somani immediately sprang into action. With flames quickly approaching the victim, he forced the vehicle door open and climbed inside. Disregarding his own safety, he worked quickly to free the man's legs. Despite the intense heat and danger, Somani remained focused. After a brief struggle, he successfully extricated the injured driver—later found to have suffered broken legs—and carried him to safety. Moments later, the vehicle was completely consumed by fire.

Officer Somani's bravery and decisive action undoubtedly saved the man's life. His conduct reflects the highest ideals of law enforcement and public service. His heroic efforts that night ve as a powerful reminder of the selfless commitment officers make both on and off duty.

One of North Cobb's most illustrious



visitors was Grover Cleveland. In preparation for the 1888 election, Cleveland and his wife Frances went on a Goodwill Tour across the South in 1887. In October of that year, he traveled from Chattanooga to

Atlanta to attend the Piedmont Exposition, a large fair held at what is now Piedmont Park.

As the Clevelands traveled south via the railroad, they stopped in Kennesaw on October 17 so the train could pick up several dignitaries, including Atlanta newspaper editor Henry Grady and future Georgia Governor Joseph E. Brown. While in Kennesaw, Brown gave a book on the Civil War to Frances Cleveland.

The train next traveled to Marietta, where the Clevelands saw a "brilliant" fireworks display on Kennesaw Mountain. While Cleveland proved immensely popular on his tour, he ultimately lost the 1888 election. His opponent, Benjamin Harrison, visited Marietta in 1891, but it is not known if he stopped in Kennesaw or Acworth.







WHEN CLEANING BECOMES HEALING

At the Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Children's Hospital in Fiji, cleaning is part of patient care. In October 2025, two international cleaning leaders, RJ Patel of PCT Clean and Gosia Baran of Helping Hands Cleaning Services, led a "Cleaning for Health" program that combined science, skill, and purpose. Their message was simple: when done right, cleaning heals.

The program followed the hospital's 2023 results, when proper microfiber methods dropped ATP contamination readings from 9,158 RLU to 30 RLU, a clear improvement in secret for skildness recovering from the part great ways.

ATP testing measures biological residue, showing whether a surface is truly clean. Paired with microfiber technology, which traps rather than spreads bacteria, each wipe becomes a layer of protection.

Staff learned to read ATP results, follow cleaning sequences, and apply nine best practices for worker safety, including proper handling of chemicals and better ventilation. Each session ended with ATP testing so cleaners could see the impact of their work. They left knowing their role was not just custodial but clinical.

The Fiji Sun featured the initiative on October 10, 2025, recognizing it as an important step for national infection control. Patel and Baran, both accredited by the Global Biorisk Advisory Council, brought international standards to Fiji's hospitals. For a facility that has provided more than 400 free heart surgeries to Pacific children, cleanliness is a promise of safety and care.

The lessons apply to every service business: measure results, master the tools, protect workers, and repeat what works. Cleaning, when done with care and precision, safeguards lives.

At this hospital, a clean surface is more than a shine. It is compassion made visible and healing made real, one careful pass at a time.
