

### RED WAGONS, BIG HEARTS

Fielding Lewis DAR Chapter Builds and Donates Chad's Bracket Wagons, with Founder Roger Leggett

Members of the Fielding Lewis Chapter, National Society Daughters of the American Revolution, marked the recent DAR National Day of Service by rolling up their sleeves to build 12 bright red Chad's Bracket wagons, which are specialized hospital wagons designed to make life safer and easier for young hospital patients.

This service project took on special meaning as DAR volunteers worked side by side with Roger Leggett, the founder of Chad's Bracket. Of the 12 wagons they built, the Fielding Lewis DAR Chapter funded two of them and then joined Leggett in delivering them to the Children's Healthcare of Atlanta new Arthur M. Blank Hospital.

"Working with Mr. Leggett to build and donate these wagons was an incredible experience," said Chapter Regent Melissa Tanner. "And seeing the comfort and joy they bring to children in the hospital was absolutely unforgettable."

The Fielding Lewis DAR Chapter also presented Leggett with the National Society DAR Community Service Award for his extraordinary contribution and dedication to helping children and families nationwide through Chad's Bracket. This award was formally presented at a recent Fielding Lewis DAR Chapter meeting held at the Marietta Country Club.

Leggett's mission began 14 years ago during a hospital visit to check on his 4-year-old granddaughter at Children's Healthcare of Atlanta. As he and his son, Chad, an EMT, walked down the hospital hallway, they saw a young mother struggling to maneuver her child, medical equipment, and tangled IV lines into a hospital elevator. Leggett recalled his son turning to him and saying, "There has to be a better way to do that."

Weeks later, Chad died of heatstroke at the age of 24. During devastating loss, Leggett held onto that moment with his son. Honoring his son's compassion, he developed a customized IV-pole bracket with help from the Chattahoochee Technical College welding program. This bracket allowed IV poles to be attached directly to the red wagons, creating a way that allows young hospital patients to move more safely and comfortably.

More than 1,700 of the Chad's Bracket wagons have since been built and donated to children's hospitals across the nation. Leggett's lifetime of service, however, began long before Chad's Bracket. He served more than 20 years as a firefighter and built a distinguished career at Lockheed Martin in Cobb County.

For the Fielding Lewis DAR Chapter, the combination of hands-on service with Chad's Bracket and the chance to honor the man behind the mission made this year's DAR National Day of Service especially meaningful.

The DAR is a nonprofit, nonpolitical women's service organization founded in 1890, whose members can trace their lineage to an individual who contributed to securing American independence during the Revolutionary War. DAR members participate in volunteer service projects to promote patriotism, education and historic preservation.

holiday letters to Santa Claus from Kennesawchildren. I am continuing that tradition today with letters from 1925 exactly a century ago. These requests to the North Pole were all published in the Cobb County

Times on December 10, 1925.

H. G. Pittman was two years old and asked for a wagon, a rubber ball, a harp, and fruits and candy. Young Bryan Taylor asked for a toy with a pop gun, sparklers, and something pretty for his sweetheart. Elira Adair asked Santa to bring a doll, basketball, wagon, and candy, and she wanted to be sure Santa took care of her nieces and nephews. Leroy Wrigley wanted a toy train and tricycle, along with a hobby horse for his brother.

Annie Louise Brooks was five years old and was looking forward to attending school after Christmas. She made sure Santa knew she had helped carry firewood for her mother. She asked for a rocking chair, a storybook, fruits, nuts, candy, and chewing gum. Last but not least, Martha Glenn Lewis (a four-year-old downtown resident) wanted a "kiddie Car," a doll, fruits, and "just anything else that you can bring me."

The City of Kennesaw signed a Friendship Agreement with the Municipality of Montepulciano, Italy, on Tuesday, November 25, 2025, during a ceremony at Kennesaw City Hall, formalizing a collaborative relationship between the two communities.

Mayor Derek Easterling and Montepulciano Mayor Michele Angiolini delivered opening remarks before signing the agreement. The ceremony included participation from representatives of both cities and Kennesaw State University (KSU), which has maintained a long-standing academic presence in Montepulciano.

This agreement reflects years of collaboration between our community, the Kennesaw Sister Cities Commission and our partners at Kennesaw State University," states Mayor Derek Easterling. "We look forward to continued exchanges that strengthen cultural, educational and economic ties with Montepulciano."

Following the signing, attendees participated in a toast with wine from Montepulciano. The commemorative wine label was designed by KSU students.

#### Background

Kennesaw established the Kennesaw Sister Cities Commission (KSSC) in August 2021 to explore international partnerships. Montepulciano was identified as a strong match due to a 25-year relationship with KSU through its study abroad programming and its role in the restoration and use of the historic Poliziana Fortress.

The Friendship Agreement, developed after a series of virtual meetings and collaborative discussions, outlines shared goals in cultural exchange, education, economic cooperation and community engagement. The agreement also acknowledges KSU's central role in connecting the two communities.

Ongoing and past initiatives facilitated through KSU include nursing internships at Nottola Hospital, digital archiving work in Montepulciano's Historical Archives, and marketing and entrepreneurship activities with local wineries.

Under the terms of the agreement, the two cities will encourage exchanges among civic groups, schools, universities and businesses; support cultural and educational programs; promote tourism and economic development initiatives; and collaborate on joint events. The agreement is nonbinding and may be amended or discontinued with written notice.





## HILLGROVE STUDENT, BRANDON KING **DONATES 1,700 FOOD ITEMS TO THE CENTER** FOR FAMILY RESOURCES

Brandon King, a junior at Hillgrove High School and an Eagle Scout candidate, is taking meaningful action to support families experiencing food insecurity—one box at a time. For his Eagle Scout project, Brandon collected, sorted, and packaged an impressive 1,700 nonperishable food items, ultimately assembling 40 "Express Food Boxes" for individuals and families seeking emergency food assistance at The Center for Family Resources (CFR) in Marietta.

"Theard about The Center for Family Resources while researching food pantries," Brandon explained. "After calling them, I felt it was the best place to donate because they were excited to accept the boxes and help distribute them to families in need.'

To gather the items, Brandon organized a large food drive at Hillgrove High School. Students contributed 695 items, while friends, neighbors, and family added another 1,005. "I spread the word on Instagram and Snapchat and put flyers around the school," he said.

Brandon's commitment to fighting hunger began after attending the Atlanta Community Food Bank's Youth Summit, where participants learned about local hunger issues and volunteered with organizations such as Urban Recipe and Networks Cooperative Ministry. "We did a deep dive into food insecurity," he said. "It showed me what it really means to help people who don't have enough to eat.'

"The generosity and leadership Brandon has shown through this project are truly inspiring," said Melanie Kagan of The Center for Family Resources. "These boxes will have an immediate impact on families in crisis.

Brandon hopes to study industry and architecture but says he will "always make time to volunteer and support my community



## "I'VE TOLD YOU THESE THINGS, THAT YOUR

JOY WOULD BE FULL." JOHN 15:11

In the Bible, in the story of the first Christmas, the word joy is used eight separate times.
It is the major theme of Christmas. There are some things that will deplete your joy this Christmas. There are three great destroyers of joy, and they are found in the Christmas story. Lets go over one of them with today's EPIC.

The number one thing that steals joy out of your life is anxiety.

I am talking about when we get stressed out, when we get tense, when we get nervous, when we get scared, when we get worried. Any time you get stressed out with worries and fears, you cannot be joyful and fearful at the same time. When anxiety comes in the front door, joy goes out the back door of your life. Distress is the opposite of delight.

We need to take a 20 second time out and just think about all the stress and pressure Mary was under. Mary was no more than 15 years old at the time. She is a young teenager and she is engaged to Joseph and then she has what is called a "virgin birth." What is that? It never happened to any woman in the past, birth without a husband or a birth without a man. Try explaining that to your parents.

Think of all the gossip about a single girl being pregnant and not married, all the scandal, God's the father, nobody is going to believe that. Then just a few days before she is about to give birth she must get on a donkey and make a two-to-three-day trip from Nazareth to Bethlehem because of the census that was about to be had. I can only imagine her letting Joseph have it for that ride. I still hear it from Libby for taking her to the Georgia vs. LSU game when she was nine months pregnant with our oldest son Todd. She let me have it with every step we walked up to our seats in the nose bleed section.

There were no rooms to be had. Mary ends up sleeping in a barn with a bunch of farm animals with no family for support.

The choice that Mary made to bring joy into her life was even though she was afraid she chose to trust God and accept His plan for her life.

Luke 1:30 reads "Do not be afraid, Mary!" The angel told her. "You have been chosen by God for His purpose.'

You have been chosen by God for his purpose too! God has a purpose for your life just like He did for Mary, but you can miss it. You will miss the purpose of your life unless you do what Mary did, you choose to accept it.

I do not know what you are anxious about this Christmas. I do know the antidote and that

is you must follow Mary's example and that is to trust God and accept His plan for your life. What is the result of saying "God I am going to trust you even though I do not understand the plan you have for my life. Mary said, "My spirit finds it joy in God, my Savior." Luke 1:47. The City of Marietta is pleased to announce that it has received the prestigious 2025 Outstanding Planning Document Award from the Georgia Planning Association (GPA) for the Mountain to River (M2R) Trail Activation Study. This award recognizes the study's exceptional quality and completeness of the overall planning process that goes beyond a traditional planning document. The project stood out for its communication, graphics, storytelling, and overall quality of thought and delivery.

In 2023, the City applied for and received technical assistance through the Atlanta Regional Commission's Community Development Assistance Program and was partnered with the Georgia Conservancy to complete the study. The purpose of the trail activation study was to explore ways to further invigorate the 3.5-mile portion of the M2R Trail located within Marietta's city limits, encouraging greater usage and access. The study addressed the key components of placemaking, wayfinding, and integration of the trail with its surrounding neighborhoods.

The trail activation study was identified as an implementation item in the City of Marietta's 2022 Comprehensive Plan, supporting the City's ongoing efforts to enhance community spaces and promote active living.

City staff accepted the award on October 9, 2025, during the annual GPA Awards Luncheon, held in conjunction with the organization's fall conference.
