Bill Bruton, Jr., has dedicated his entire professional life to public service and civic engagement. Serving as City Manager of Marietta since 2000, Marietta has been recognized for its strong financial stewardship, smart development policies, and proactive community engagement under his leadership. He has played a pivotal role in the development of Marietta Square, supported key projects like the Hilton Atlanta/Marietta Hotel & Conference Center, and worked collaboratively with local organizations to ensure the city's public services are accessible, efficient, and community focused.

Bruton is a member of the Georgia City-County Management Association (GCCMA) and the International City/County Management Association (ICMA). He has served on numerous boards and task forces representing Marietta's interests in regional planning, economic development, and municipal operations. His financial acumen and steady leadership have been recognized by peer associations, and his reputation for ethical governance has made him a trusted leader across Georgia.

Bruton has helped lead Marietta to receive multiple distinctions over his tenure, including top ratings in financial transparency, awards for urban planning, and recognition for innovative public-private partnerships. HABITAT FOR HUMANITY DEDICATES HOME

Habitat for Humanity of NW Metro Atlanta celebrated the final milestone of its final build of the year as nearly 100 supporters, sponsors, volunteers, and community leaders gathered Thursday to dedicate the completed 2025 Women Build home for future homeowner Makailah and her family in Marietta.

What began with pink hard hats and pink shovels at the October Land Dedication has now come full circle. Over nine weeks, 237 volunteers worked 4,141 hours side-by-side with Makailah and her mom, Lisa, to complete this home. More than 75 percent of the volunteers who built this home were women.

Makailah, a Police Service Representative with the Marietta's Police Department, was joined at the dedication by her mother, Lisa, and her son, a third grader; and sister Matilda. In 2023, she applied for this home through City of Marietta and Habitat's Public Service Housing Program and was selected in 2024.

At the dedication, Makailah said, "As I looked at my 10-year goals, I considered changing my goal to buy a home as something that was unrealistic. I considered changing to a goal to rent, yet, when I looked at renting, I saw that was unrealistic too."

"There is a great need for families like Makailah and Lisa — since 2019, 76 percent of our homeowners are female-headed households," said Habitat for Humanity of NW Metro Atlanta CEO Kyle Huhtanen. "The last time we opened our application process, we received more than 900 applicants, and we build only 5–10 homes per year. That should tell all of us — there is a need." HARRISON HIGH SCHOOL SENIOR RAISES \$2,500 FOR LOCAL FAMILIES

Graham Auldrige, a senior at Harrison High School, has turned his passion for pickleball into meaningful support for families facing food insecurity in Cobb County. What began as a simple idea to bring people together for a friendly community tournament became a successful fundraiser benefiting The Center for Family Resources' (CFR) annual "Thanks for Giving" program.

The Auldrige family has supported "Thanks for Giving" for several years. Graham's father recalls the early days of their involvement: "Our family first got involved with The Center for Family Resources after we saw a post several years ago about Thanks for Giving. At the time, we took our sons shopping for the items to fill a couple of family boxes to show the importance of giving back and the value of doing so."

Graham says that experience stayed with him. As he grew older, he became increasingly aware of the food insecurity affecting many of his classmates and neighbors. Wanting to do more this year, he organized a pickleball tournament with a goal of raising \$1,000 for families in need.

Graham exceeded that goal, raising \$1,250 through the event. With a matching contribution from his father and his father's employer, his total donation reached \$2,500.

The CFR's CEO Melanie Kagan praised Graham's leadership and compassion. "It is truly inspiring to see young people like Graham stepping up to help children and families right here in their own community," says Kagan. "His initiative and the heart behind it reminds us that meaningful impact often begins with one person deciding to make a difference."

LOCAL HISTORY STORIES

Andrew J. Bramlett

In 1943, local resident Private Norman Roberts became the first African American soldier from Cobb County killed in World War II. Roberts was serving in North Africa when he was killed. Five years later, in 1948, his body returned to Georgia to be laid to rest in the Marietta National Cemetery.



National Cemetery. The next year, the Cobb County Board of Education approved a new school for Black students in Acworth, which was named after Private Roberts.

In 1953, construction began on the new Roberts School. The structure was designed with five classrooms and an auditorium, with the whole building expected to serve 125-150 students. The school opened before 1956 and served African American elementary-aged students from both Acworth and Kennesaw. At the time, there was no African American high school in Cobb County.

In 1961, two new rooms were added to the Roberts School. When Cobb County schools were integrated, students from the Roberts School began attending Acworth Elementary School. Roberts School closed in 1968 and was used by the county for storage.

Over the next thirty years, Roberts School served a variety of purposes. Owned by the City of Acworth, it was a health center in the early 1970s and was later home to the city streets department. In 2000, former Roberts School student Tim Houston spearheaded a renovation effort to turn the Roberts School into a community center. Since this renovation, the Roberts School building has returned to its place as a focal point of Acworth. More recently, part of the building was renovated to become the Rena Henton Theatre, the new home of the Acworth Theatre Company. A ribbon cutting for this new venue will be held on January 15 at 4:30 PM.

Area residents may drop off gently used hardcover or paperback books, music CDs, DVD movies and vinyl records on Jan. 22 and 23 from noon to 8 p.m. Participants will receive a ticket redeemable for the same number of items during the open swap on Jan. 24.

Books must have intact front and back covers and be in good condition. CDs, DVDs and vinyl records must be in their original cases and fully operable. Magazines, software, VHS or cassette tapes, adult content, and unauthorized or illegal material will not be accepted. Each participant may bring up to 50 books, 30 CDs, 30 DVDs and 30 vinyl records.

Items will be organized into categories. The swap is free, and items may not be purchased with money. Any remaining items at the end of the event will be donated.

To ensure a same-day date, visit a USPS Post Office location and request a manual hand-stamp or a Postage Validation Imprint (PVI) at the retail counter.

The Southern Museum of Civil War & Locomotive History will host the return of its largest annual event, *Trains, Trains, Trains!*, on Saturday, Jan. 24, and Sunday, Jan. 25, 2025.

The event will feature an extensive display of model train layouts, train-themed activities and historic railcars. Model train groups from across the Southeast will present layouts in a variety of sizes, gauges and themes, with many displays featuring interactive elements designed for younger visitors. Participating groups will travel from states including Kentucky, Alabama and Tennessee to showcase their work.

During the event, the General Emporium, the museum's gift shop, will expand to offer additional train-themed merchandise, including apparel, collectibles, toys and model trains.

"Every year we look forward to welcoming new and returning guests to experience these spectacular model train layouts," said Dr. Richard Banz, executive director of the museum. "Many of the layouts are interactive, and we are excited to host both returning and first-time model train groups representing the most popular gauges and scales in model railroading."



A LOOK AT BROOKWOOD'S READING PROGRAM

BY KIM WIGINGTON, DIRECTOR

Brookwood Christian School reading instruction is based on the Orton-Gillingham method. OG is a research-based framework that was developed specifically for students who have difficulty decoding words.

Dyslexic students do not intuitively grasp sound-letter relationships, Orton-Gillingham is explicit, systematic, and structured. Rules are taught, practiced, and built upon.

Students are taught through multi-sensory methods. They hear sounds, say them aloud, write them, and incorporate movement. This helps the brain form more connections.

Students learn rules, syllable patterns, and word structures. Students stop guessing at words and start applying the principles they have learned. As their decoding improves, so does their confidence.

By meeting students where they are, the reading programs at Brookwood allow dyslexic learners to develop skill, confidence, and a love of learning.

2025 WEST COBB CITIZEN OF THE YEAR Joyette Holmes, Georgia State Board of Pardon and Paroles

Joyette Holmes, Board Member on the Georgia State Board of Pardons and Paroles, has greatly contributed to the Cobb County community. She made Cobb County history by becoming the first female and African American to serve as both Chief Magistrate and District Attorney. In these roles, she helped maintain law and order within the community and improve public safety. Holmes tackled each case with a balanced approach of justice and compassion. She also served as a partner and member at the Marietta law firm of Gregory Doyle Calhoun and Rogers (GDCR) before being appointed by Governor Kemp to her current full-time role as a member on the Board of Pardons and Paroles.

Along with her professional duties, Joyette serves on the boards of MUST Ministries, Wellstar's Kennestone Regional Hospital Board, Kennesaw State University President's Community Advisory Board, the Cobb County Prayer Breakfast Committee, and the Capital City Bank Advisory Board. LEARNING ABOUT MOSES

He chose to be mistreated along with the people of God rather than to enjoy the fleeting pleasures of sin. Hebrews 11:25

Over the Christmas break I rested and got prepared for the year 2026. 2025 was such a momentous year for Piedmont in the community. 

THE BEST KITCHEN-THEMED GIFTS FOR BEGINNER COOKS

Every holiday season, I get the same question: "What should I buy for someone who's just starting to cook at home?" And every year, my advice stays the same: skip the gimmicks and focus on the foundational tools that actually help someone grow in the kitchen.

Before we dive in, a quick note: I'm not listing brand names because I'm not here to promote any particular product, and I'm not paid to endorse anything. My goal is simply to give you the categories of tools that genuinely help new cooks.

AND HERE'S AN INSIDER TIP:

Local restaurant supply stores (many open to the public) are some of the best places to get professional-grade tools at great prices. That's where chefs shop — not influencer gift lists.

NOW LET'S GET INTO THE ESSENTIALS.

1. A Reliable 8-Inch Chef's Knife

This is the foundational tool every cook needs. An 8-inch chef's knife is the ideal size for beginners — versatile, balanced, and capable of handling nearly all prep tasks.

It doesn't need to be expensive; it needs to feel sturdy and comfortable.

2. A Large, Heavy Wooden Cutting Board (Safer and More Sanitary)

A big wooden cutting board gives stability and room to work, and wood naturally has antimicrobial properties, making it safer than many plastic boards.

Its weight prevents slipping, which is essential when someone is still learning proper knife control.

3. A Full Chef's Apron

A high-quality apron with deep pockets and full coverage helps a new cook feel organized and confident. It's practical, protective, and instantly upgrades their kitchen presence.

4. A Cast Iron or Carbon Steel Pan

Instead of a basic heavy-bottomed skillet, a cast iron or carbon steel pan is a far better tool for someone learning to cook.

Cast iron is great for slow, steady heat. Carbon steel is lighter, quicker, and extremely versatile. Either one is a lifetime gift.

5. Heat-Proof Utensils That Make Cooking Easier

A simple set — tongs, wooden spoon, heat-proof spatula, and scraper — helps beginners navigate recipes without battling flimsy tools. Practical, durable, and essential.

6. A Baking Sheet + Wire Rack Combo This combo unlocks crisping, roasting, cooling, draining, and resting. It's one of the most versatile and underrated setups any new cook can have.

7. A Simple Digital Thermometer This instantly boosts confidence by removing the guesswork behind doneness. A thermometer is one of the fastest ways to help beginners cook proteins correctly.

8. Prep Bowls and Storage Containers

Organization is half the battle. Prep bowls build the habit of mise en place, and good storage containers support leftovers and meal planning.

9. A Medium-Sized Dutch Oven or Heavy Pot

This one vessel teaches braising, simmering, searing, boiling, and slow cooking — all in one. It's incredibly versatile and beginner-friendly.

10. A Good Peeler and a Microplane

A sharp peeler makes prep safe and fast. A microplane opens up a world of flavor: citrus zest, garlic paste, ginger, nutmeg, and delicate cheese shavings. These little tools create big "wow" moments for beginners learning to season properly.

11. A Beginner's Culinary Textbook (Like The New Professional Chef) Instead of a trendy cookbook, give the gift of real culinary fundamentals.

A professional-style beginner's textbook teaches knife skills, heat methods, safety, sauces, organization, and the science behind cooking.

It's the kind of reference that lasts a lifetime.

12. A Monthly Meat Box from a Local Farmer

One of the best and most inspiring gifts for a new cook.

A local farmer's monthly meat box introduces high-quality proteins, variety, and seasonality. It encourages creativity and supports local agriculture. Plus, it's just fun — every month feels like Christmas for a home cook.

The Bottom Line: Give Gifts That Build Skills, Not Clutter

Beginner cooks don't need gadgets. They need confidence, good tools, and ingredients that inspire them.

And again — I'm not paid to promote any specific products or brands, which is why this list focuses on categories and fundamentals, not labels.




