## ACWORTH'S SPLOST INFORMATION

### WHAT IS A SPLOST (SPECIAL PURPOSE LOCAL OPTION SALES TAX) AND HOW DOES IT WORK?

A SPLOST is a 1% sales tax that counties in Georgia can use to fund major capital projects, such as public infrastructure (roads, sidewalk, stormwater), parks, public safety facilities, technology improvements, community centers, and trails.

There have been five SPLOST programs approved by the voters (2005, 2011, 2016, and 2022). The current program expires on December 31, 2027; therefore, a public referendum to renew the SPLOST is being proposed for the general election on Tuesday, November 3, 2026. SPLOST programs are beneficial because they allow the county and cities to complete critical projects without the need to issue long term debt.

Why SPLOST? The advantage of consumption-based taxes to fund capital projects is that visitors from outside of Cobb County contribute towards the cost, reducing the burden on property owners.

### WHAT IS PROPOSED IN THE 2028 SPLOST?

The projected sales tax over the six-year period includes county-wide projects, then the remaining funds are distributed to the cities based on population. If the referendum is approved, the city of Acworth is projected to receive \$28,039,043 under the formula. The public will have an opportunity to meet with county and city leaders to provide feedback on the proposed project list. The Acworth specific open house is scheduled for Thursday, February 12, from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Acworth Community Center, located at 4361 Cherokee Street, Acworth, 30101. ## KENNESAW'S SPLOST INFORMATION

Cobb County and its cities are beginning the process of developing the 2028 Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax (SPLOST) project list, and the City of Kennesaw invites residents to participate in two upcoming community meetings. The preliminary project list was approved by the Cobb County Board of Commissioners on January 13 and will help guide future investments in critical capital needs across the county and within Kennesaw.

For more than 30 years, SPLOST has funded major capital projects such as transportation improvements, parks and recreation facilities, public safety buildings, libraries, and other essential infrastructure. The 2028 SPLOST proposal would build on the current program, continuing to support projects that maintain and improve facilities and services important to the community.

Residents are encouraged to attend one or both meetings to learn more about the proposed SPLOST project list, ask questions, and share feedback.

## ACWORTH'S NOTABLE WOMEN IN HISTORY

Last month, the Save Acworth History Foundation unveiled a new series of banners about several notable women from across Acworth's history.



Several of the women featured were elected officials, like former mayor Mary McCall, and former alderwoman Dolores Hester. Frana Brown, the namesake of a park in downtown, worked for the City of Acworth as City Clerk. School teachers are also featured heavily. Dolores Hester, Kate Logan Good, Charlotte McClure, and her sister Fanny McClure all taught schoolchildren in Acworth. Hannah Chastain Lemon left money in her will for educational causes when she died in 1912. Helen and Esther Sills were owners of the Acworth Cotton Manufacturing Company and built a school for the mill children.

Community leadership is also a theme of the exhibit. Rena Henton (the namesake of the new Rena Henton Theatre) was a longtime fixture of Acworth's African American community, and the whole of Acworth rallied around her after Henton's home was destroyed in a fire when she was in her 100s. Willie Bailey, from the 1920s until 1963, was the local correspondent for the Marietta Daily Journal. Fannie Mae Butler was heavily involved in local community organizations and was part of the local PTA. Last but not least, in 1898 Carrie Dyer helped to establish a social group for women in Acworth called the Calliopean Club. After her death in 1900, it was renamed the Carrie Dyer Woman's Club.

The Save Acworth History Foundation hopes that this will be the first in a series of exhibits about the people, places, and events that have transformed Acworth. This temporary exhibit is currently on display in the lobby of the Acworth Community Center.

## SIMPLE TIPS FOR COLD WEATHER COMFORT

### Create a Warm Zone

If the power goes out, focus on heating one small room. Close doors, block drafts with towels, and hang blankets over doorways to keep warmth in.

### Insulate Windows & Doors

Windows lose heat fast. Blankets, towels, or emergency thermal blankets shiny side facing the window can make a noticeable difference.

Since its founding in 1997, the Town Center Community Improvement District (CID) has proven that when the public and private sectors work together, incredible things can happen.

As I reflect on the past year, it’s clear the Town Center Community is not only growing, it’s thriving. With a \$12.6 billion annual impact on Cobb County and a \$16.2 billion contribution to Georgia’s economy, Town Center remains one of the county’s most dynamic economic engines. Our district supports more than 36,000 jobs, nearly 10 percent of all employment in Cobb County, and generates over \$238 million in annual public revenue that helps fund schools, transportation and vital community services.

Our current Master Plan outlines 15 projects totaling nearly \$100 million, positioning Town Center as a regional hub for employment, education, shopping and recreation. But the CID’s mission extends beyond infrastructure,

bringing together partners across sectors to create long-term community value. Every investment we make connects people to opportunities, neighborhoods to destinations and ideas to action.

In 2025, we celebrated major progress on the South Barrett Reliever Phase III, the largest infrastructure project in CID history. The project, set to open soon, will enhance connectivity across I-75, relieve congestion on Barrett Parkway by up to 22 percent during peak hours, and open new routes for local access and redevelopment.

Looking ahead to 2026, our focus will be on strengthening our assets, revenue streams and economic resilience. We will continue to raise funds, secure grants and reinvest CID dollars in projects that are strategic, impactful and fiscally responsible.

The transformation of aging retail corridors, such as the one fronting the Town Center at Cobb Mall, remains a top priority. Working closely with Cobb County, Kennesaw State University and other partners, we are re-imagining these areas as mixed-use, high-quality destinations that drive new investment and expand the tax base.

At the same time, we’re advancing initiatives to study the Barrett Parkway, improve the George Busbee Parkway corridor and construct the Noonday Creek Trail Pedestrian Bridge, each representing a tangible investment in safety, access and mobility.

As we look toward 2026 and beyond, we must emphasize that none of the work we do or the successes we have happen in isolation. We partner with public and private entities like Cobb County, Kennesaw State University, Cobb Travel & Tourism, Kaiser Permanente, Avonlea and countless other sponsors and community groups to deliver results that benefit everyone.

In the coming years, Town Center is poised for its next major chapter. We’re nearing completion of our Livable Centers Initiative (LCI) Plan, which will serve as the foundation for our new Master Plan—a blueprint for how our community will grow and thrive over the next three decades.

The LCI Plan is helping us reimagine land use, housing and mobility with an eye toward balance, innovation and inclusivity. The Master Plan will carry that work forward, charting a course that sustains economic growth while strengthening livability and connectivity.

With the FIFA 2026 World Cup bringing international attention to KSU and our region, Town Center will be ready to showcase what makes this community shine: strong partnerships, creative leadership and a shared vision for a connected, vibrant future.

Our story is still being written, but the momentum is undeniable. Together, we’re building a community that is invested, connected and thriving today and for generations to come.

#### MARIETTA HISTORY CENTER CELEBRATES THREE DECADES OF STORYTELLING WITH NEW ANNIVERSARY EXHIBIT:

The Marietta History Center is proud to announce the opening of its landmark 30th-anniversary exhibition, "Marietta History Center at 30." This retrospective journey traces the museum's evolution from its 1996 founding to its status today as Marietta and Cobb County's home for history, housed within the historic Kennesaw House.

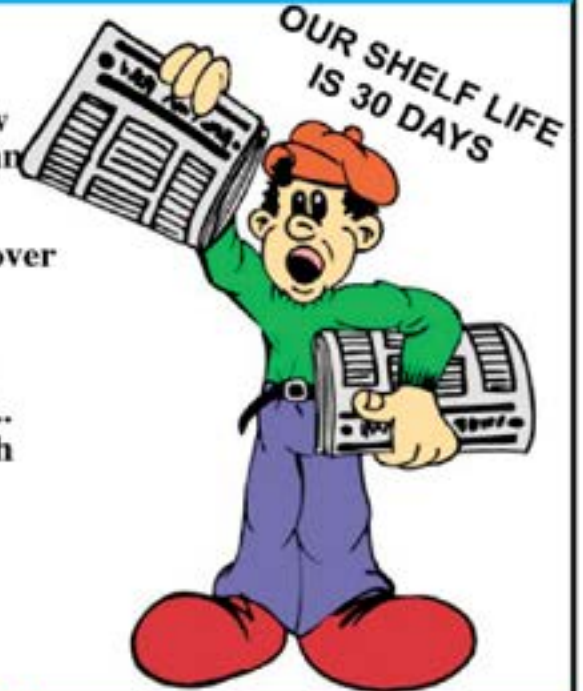

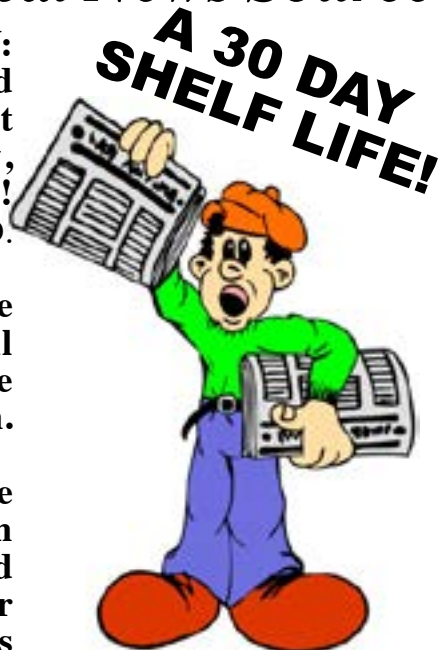
